He stated that he had originally asked for a setback variance to reduce the distance from the building to the property line 2 feet, from 15 feet. He stated that concern had been expressed to him that it might be too close, so he requested changing the setback to 10 feet from 15 feet. He stated that changes had been made as to the way the carwash will be located on the property, which will make it fit better on the property. County Manager Kevin Poe asked how close he proposed to come to the Glenwood Avenue right-of-way. Mr. Barnett replied, 10 feet, it will be 10 feet on the side lot lines, but the front, which will be approximately 40 feet. It was noted that Glenwood Avenue is an unopened platted right-of-way. Mr. Barnett clarified that he will need a 10 foot variance on both sides of the property. Ownership of the Glenwood

Avenue right-of-way was discussed and Mr. Barnett stated that as he understands it, anyone who owns property adjoining Glenwood Avenue has the right to use the private road. He stated that he had been working with D.O.T. and they want them to use Glenwood Avenue as their entrance. They have a letter of intent, but will have to close the present entrance to the property. They do plan to pave Glenwood Avenue probably to the back of their property. After discussion, the Chairman called for a Motion. ## UPDATE ON HOSPITAL AUTHORITY

Commissioner Hufstetler stated that in 1997 the Hospital Authority entered into a 35-year lease with the Floyd Health Care. They have a Management Board, which appoints its own members, which actually runs the day to day operations. The Hospital Authority is only an advisory board, but they will be meeting today at 5:00 p.m. to try to obtain more information regarding the billing problems and some other issues at Floyd Hospital. In addition there are negotiations underway, and it is the intent to address the Cave Spring area ambulance service. Several members of the Board have attended different meetings working on this and feel there are a couple of solutions. He stated that

they feel that they can provide the same level of coverage which has been at Cave Spring and Armuchee. It was noted that the meeting is open to the public and will be held at the Library, in the Coosa Room.

### **DISCUSS DEPARTMENT HEADS BEING AT-WILL STATUS.**

Commissioner Hufstetler stated that in their first year they had discussed the Department Heads being at-will status and there will be a position to be filled shortly. The question is if this applies to both people coming in and current employees. This will be presented at the next meeting.

### **PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE.**

Commissioner Mahanay stated that one of the topics discussed during the Board's Retreat Planning Meeting was the compensation of public safety personnel. In realizing the importance of a fair and equitable structure of compensation, they have taken steps to pull together key personnel. He stated they realize how important public safety personnel are to our needs and the great job they do and this is a serious and important endeavor.

### **WATER COMMITTEE.**

### **DISCUSS IMPROVEMENTS TO RIDGEWOOD SUBDIVISION.**

Commissioner Jennings, Committee Chairman, stated they are in the process of studying not only Ridgewood Subdivision, but across the county improvements and expansion to the water system. At a later date a plan will be presented to the Board of Commissioners.

### **AGREE TO HIRE BROWN & CALDWELL TO PERFORM WATER SUPPLY ANALYSIS.**

Commissioner Jennings stated that the Water Commission which was established through HB489 has representatives from the Floyd County Board of Commissioners, he and Commissioner Mahanay, Kevin Poe, City of Rome and City of Cave Spring representatives. They have been interviewing potential companies that would do a water supply analysis and have unanimously agreed on the Brown & Caldwell proposal. They have determined the amount to be paid by each government, based upon current permitted withdrawal permits and the number of customers served. The county share will be \$25,000. Commissioner Jennings made a MOTION approving the \$25,000 payment to Brown & Caldwell for the Water Supply Analysis Study. County Manager Kevin Poe stated that in conjunction with the new Prison Project they will have to build a new Lift Station for sewer service at the Public Works Camp. This will involve construction of a new lift station along with relocation of existing force main. Some of the force main would be under the building, so it will need to be relocated and since additional inmates will be added, the capacity of the Lift Station will have to be increased. They had met with the City of Rome and reviewed all the requirements for the Lift Station and have received a proposal for the required engineering for the project from Williams, Sweitzer & Barnum at a cost of \$14,975, lump sum fee. The architect

and civil engineer both felt that this was a good price. He recommended retaining the services of Williams, Sweitzer & Barnum to prepare the necessary engineering to have this project put out for bid at an engineering cost of \$14,975.
