ORDINANGE 2014(133)

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE FIRE DEPARTMENT TO PROHIBT RESIDENTIAL BURNING WHEN A DOCUMENTED HEALTH HAZARD EXISTS AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to burn trash, refuse, sweepings, debris, or other matter within three-hundred (300) feet of a residence in which an occupant suffers from a documented health condition which could be worsened by exposure to smoke. These conditions include, but are not limited to: Asthma, Emphysema, Cancer, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) and other respiratory illnesses.

SECTION 2: The Petal Fire Department shall keep on file a record of the names and addresses of persons presenting proper medical documentation of the health conditions listed in Section 1. Proper documentation shall include a signed letter by a licensed physician, stating that the exposure to smoke from such burning will be harmful to the health of the individual occupying the given address. The Chief of the Petal Fire Department shall see to it that within ten (10) days of receipt of such documentation, residents within a three-hundred (300) foot radius of the listed addresses are notified in writing that due to the existing health condition of their neighbor, the outside burning of trash, refuse, sweepings, debris, or other matter is prohibited. This prohibition does not apply to normal use of a household fireplace.

SECTION 3: Persons causing the burning of trash, refuse, sweepings, debris, or other matter within three-hundred (300) feet of a residence listed with the Petal Fire Department under Section 2 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. The penalty for violation shall be as follows: First Offense, written warning; Second Offense, \$100 fine; All subsequent violations shall be subject to a fine of no less than \$250 and no more than \$1,000.

SECTION 4: In addition, the Petal Fire Department shall have authority to enter onto private property and extinguish any outside burning of trash, refuse, sweepings, debris, or other matter which may constitute a violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: The Mayor and the Board of Aldermen having determined that an emergency situation exists, the above and foregoing Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2014.

The above and foregoing Ordinance, having been reduced to writing, the same was introduced and read and a vote was taken thereon, first section by section, then upon the Ordinance as a whole with the following results:
