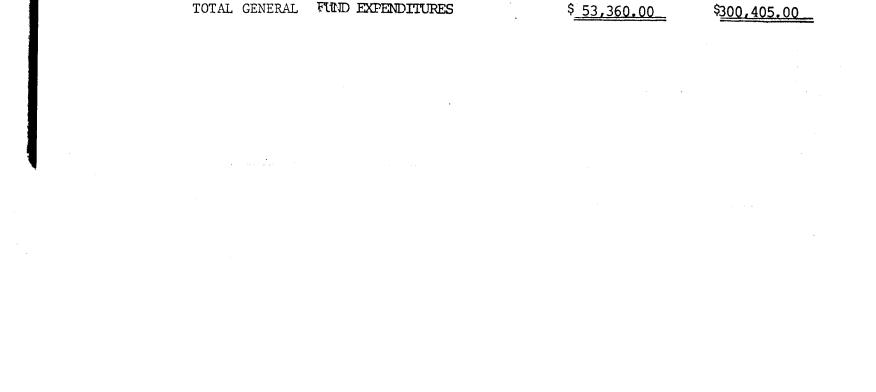

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to Title 17 Chapter 1 and Title 21 Chapters 17, and 19 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated as Recompiled;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby:

1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force for those areas having flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

2. Vests City Clerk with the responsibility, authority and means to:

(a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.

(b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain.

(c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

(d) Submit on the anniversary date of the City of Petal's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the City of Petal in the development and implementation of flood plain management measures.

3. Appoints City Clerk to maintain for public inspection and to furnish

upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest

located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest floor is below grade on one
or more sides, the elevation of the floor immediately above must also be recorded.
 4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary

to carry out the objectives of the program.

WHEREAS Mayor Byrd stated to the Board of Aldermen that since a resolution had been adopted making the citizens of Petal applicable for flood insurance that there should be a resolution establishing procedures and methods to regulate and enforce construction in flood prone areas and related purposes.

WHEREAS Thomas W. Tyner read the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES AND METHODS TO REGULATE AND ENFORCE CONSTRUCTION IN FLOOD PRONE AREAS AND RELATED PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the City of Petal, Mississippi has adopted and is enforcing Southern Standard Building Code (1972 authorized edition, with amendments) and Ordinance 1974 - 7 Establishing Standards for the Construction and Repair of Buildings; Providing Penalties for Violation of this Ordinance and Related Purposes, and WHEREAS, Section 105.1 of the aforesaid prohibits any person, firm or corporation from erecting, constructing, enlarging, altering, repairing, improving, moving or demolishing any building or structure without first obtaining a separate building permit for each building or structure from the City Clerk, and

WHEREAS, the City Building Inspector must examine all plans and specifications for the proposed construction when application is made to him for a building permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi as follows:

1. That the City Building Inspector shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location that has a flood hazard, any proposed new construction or substantial improvement (including prefabricated and mobile homes) must (i) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (ii) use construction materials and utility equipment that are resistant to flood damage, and (iii) use construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage; and

2. That the City Building Inspector shall review subdivision proposals and other proposed new developments to assure that (i) all such proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, (ii) all public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located, elevated, and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, and (iii) adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards; and

3. That the City Building Inspector shall require new or replacement water supply systems and/or sanitary sewage systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and require on-site waste disposal systems to be located so as to avoid impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding.

WHEREAS Mayor Byrd presented to the Board of Aldermen a proclamation proclaiming the week of September 14 thru 22, 1974, as Breath of Life Week. Mayor Byrd stated that respiratory diseases represent almost half of the chronic illnesses of children. This lung-damaging disease affect more than six million (6,000,000) children in the United States and cystic fibrosis occurs once in every fifteen hundred (15,000) births. Mayor Byrd is urging the citizens of our community to join with the National Cystic Fibrosis Research Foundation in its humanitarian task by supporting September 14 thru 22, 1974, as Breath of Life Week in the City of Petal, Mississippi. WHEREAS the City Attorney of Petal has been employed, Mayor Byrd suggested to the Board of Aldermen that an Order be established delineating the City Attorney's salary and duties.

THEREUPON Thomas W. Tyner read the following Order:

IT IS ORDERED THAT there be and there is hereby established a legal department of the City of Petal to be administered by the Mayor, such department to be composed of the City Attorney together with such other personnel as may be assigned to it by the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the City Attorney, administrative head of the Legal Department of the City of Petal, is charged with the duty of administering said department under the direction of the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen.

IT IS ORDERED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that Thomas W. Tyner be, and he is hereby appointed regular City Attorney for the City of Petal, to serve for a period of one year from July 1, 1974, or until further order of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and his salary is hereby affixed at the sum of \$275.00 per month, plus all travel and out-of-pocket expenses pertaining to city business; the City Attorney's duties, for the compensation stated, are prescribed as follows:

To regularly advise and counsel with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on any and all legal matters coming before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen or affecting the interest of the City of Petal, when his advice and counsel is requested thereasto by then.

To regularly attend all official meetings of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and to give advice and counsel to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on legal matters coming before them at any such meeting.

To regularly render legal opinions to the Mayor and to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, upon their request, on any matters pertaining to the official duty of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and on any matters affecting the interest of the City of Petal.

To supervise the preparation of all ordinances, resolutions, contracts, and official documents of the City of Petal as required by law, or as may be 111

requested by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen.

To examine all documents and contracts in which the City has an interest and to give legal advice and counsel thereasto, when requested to do so.

To advise and counsel with the City Clerk and heads of all other departments of the City when requested to do so by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen or by the head of the particular department requesting such advice and counsel.

To advise and counsel with any official board of the City of Petal which is under the general supervision of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and said City Attorney will advise and counsel with all of said board when requested by the Mayor and the Board of Aldermen to do so.

To advise and counsel, as requested to do so by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, regarding the collection of any taxes which may on occasion be due the City of Petal, and to take such action as directed by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal relating to such matters. To advise and counsel with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen when requested, respecting any suit or threatened suit in any court or before any commission, wherein the City of Petal has an interest which would be affected by the filing of such suit or by the outcome of any suit filed.

To perform all duties specifically required of him in his official capacity by the laws of the State of Mississippi or by the ordinances of the City.

To act as administrative head of the Legal Department of the City of Petal, under the direction of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and in connection therewith to make recommendations to the Mayor and with respect to the organization and administration of such department.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, the regular duties above described do not include legal work and services relating to:

(1) Litigation, or quasi judicial or administrative hearings or proceedings, as they may arise, or legal work of an extraordinary, unusual or extended character, as determined by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, or trips out of the City of Petal, and involving City business, or

(2) Bond issues for which said above numbered items there shall be paid such additional compensation as may be provided by law, including but not limited to, Section 21-15-25 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, Annotated as Recompiled, and as shall be determined by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen.
