## Contract for Professional Services

Under the

Comprehensive Planning and Management Assistance Program

1. Parties. The Parties to this Contract are the <u>City of Petal</u>, <u>Mississippi</u>, (herein called the "Local Government") and the <u>MISSISSIPPI RESEARCH</u> AND DEVELOP-MENT CENTER of Jackson, <u>Mississippi</u> (herein called "MRDC").

2. Introduction. The Local Government desires to engage MRDC to render certain professional services herein described in connection with a project of MRDC which is expected to be partially financed by Comprehensive Planning and Management Grant No. <u>CPA-MS-04-26-1008</u> provided under Section 701 of the Housing Act of 1954, as amended.

3. Scope of Services. MRDC shall provide the services described in Exhibit A, entitled "Scope of Services", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference.

4. Period of Performance. MRDC shall undertake and complete performance of the services referred to in Paragraph 3, entitled "Scope of Services", within the period beginning July 15, 1974, and ending no later than April 30, 1975.

5. Contribution by the Local Government. As its contribution toward the performance of this Contract, the Local Government agrees to pay MRDC the fixed amount of \$1,500.00, which sum represents 25 percent of the estimated total cost of \$6,000.00 for the services to be peformed hereunder. This contribution shall be paid by the Local Government to MRDC within ninety days of the effective date of this Contract, and it is expressly understood and agreed that in no event will the total contribution to be paid hereunder exceed this amount. 74-24196-

6. Termination for Convenience of MRDC. MRDC may terminate this Contract at any time by giving written notice to the Local Government of such termination. If this Contract is terminated by MRDC as provided herein, the Local Government will be reimbursed an amount equal to its contribution, made pursuant to paragraph 5 above, less 25 percent of the costs actually incurred by MRDC which are directly attributable to the services covered by this Contract.

7. Changes. This Contract may be altered from time to time with the approval of both the parties. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of the Local Government's contribution, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this Contract.

8. Interest of Members of Local Government. No officer, member, or employee of the Local Government who exercises any functions or responsibilities in the review or approval of the undertaking or carrying out of this Contract shall participate in any decision relating to this Contract which affects his personal interest or the interest of any corporation, partnership, or association in which he is directly or indirectly interested.



The Local Government hereby agrees to make available to MRDC, or to any consultant selected by MRDC, any office space needed, in addition to their usual place of business, for the performance of the services agreed to under this Contract, and the Local Government hereby agrees not to require any charge for such additional space.

11. Local Government Cooperation. The Local Government hereby agrees that its officials and employees will cooperate with MRDC in the discharge of its responsibility under this Contract and will be available for consultation at such times as may be mutually agreeable to both parties. The Local Government shall make available to MRDC or its designated agents, all data, reports, maps, or other information as are existing, available, and necessary for carrying out this contract.

#### WORK ELEMENTS

#### A-1 Planning Map

Base Map. A base map of sufficient accuracy to illustrate planning recommendations will be prepared. This map will be at a scale of one (1) inch equals 400 feet. The map shall depict the rights-of-way of existing streets, highways, and railroads, property ownership lines, major bodies of water, drainage courses, political boundaries, and other appropriate natural and manmade features. The map shall be prepared on a stable base drafting film from available information such as topographical maps, aerial photographs, land plats, city maps, county maps, or any other information available from city or county records.

## A-2 Central Business District Plan

A sketch plan for the Central Business Area shall be prepared. This plan will include preparation of a base map of the Central Business Area which will show street rights-of-way, alleys, lot lines, building outlines, street pavement widths, sidewalks, railroad rights-of-way, and other information necessary to prepare a plan for the area. The Central Business Area Sketch Plan shall include proposals for off-street parking facilities including the proposed layout of such facilities. Sketches will be prepared for selected building facades which will show proposed treatment for rehabilitation, lighting, sign control, and improvement of aesthetic values. Overall recommendations for landscaping, beautification, and improvement will be made. For those recommendations made, cost estimates will be outlined in a priority schedule. Emphasis will be placed upon those types of activities which could be financed through local efforts.

### A-3 Community Development Plan

A plan for future development of the community will be prepared. Included in this plan will be an analysis of existing land use, public utilities, thoroughfares and streets, and community facilities. This plan will be oriented toward basic recommendations regarding land use, community facilities, street extensions and improvements, and other factors which will influence future urban development. The end result of this plan will be a document discussing the various plan elements and a series of maps showing proposals for future land use, thoroughfares, community facilities and public utilities. Brief summaries outlining the proposals will be incorporated into the series of maps to describe each recommendation. These maps shall be printed, in color, on both sides of one (1) sheet not less than 20 by 28 inches.

The document will contain detailed information on existing land use, population and economy, community facilities, public utilities, and thoroughfares. The parks and recreation plan element will also be presented in detail with site plans being developed for the proposed parks. The site plans will not be included in the document.

The plan shall contain an analysis of the existing water and sewer systems. Primary emphasis will be on needed improvements, future service areas, required line sizes and cost estimates. Proposed expansion areas will be given priority as to their urgency relative to the land use plan. Illustrative maps, where necessary, will accompany the water and sewer systems analysis.

#### A-4 Housing Element

The housing element shall include a condition of structures map along with a preliminary listing and ranking according to the importance of the bousing problems within the community's jurisdiction. This will include

housing problems within the community's jurisdiction. This will include problems such as substandard dwellings; poor dwelling enviroment; inadequate supply of dwellings of a needed type, size or location; poor access or quality of support services such as transportation, education, policing, sanitation, etc.; and a preliminary listing and ranking according to the importance of the obstructions to solving the identified housing problems. Also included will be a preliminary statement of annual objectives covering three or four years. These will address the identified housing problems. To the extent possible, objectives will be set in quantified terms and will be based upon consultation with implementing agencies.

The study will determine the supply of existing housing versus the demand in the present housing market by type and will project housing needs for the future. The study will recommend programs, policies and means for financing for the various segments of the housing market. The study will concern itself with recent trends in housing, growth of various segments of the housing market, rental versus ownership in the housing market, type of housing being constructed, and relating to this present and future needs.

The study will be aimed at determining action programs to serve current, unmet needs as well as projecting the long range needs and programs for the community's area of jurisdiction. The study will also comply with requirements of the Comprehensive Planning Assistance Handbook (HUD).

## A-5 Capital Improvements Program

A Capital Improvements Program will be prepared for the community, and

shall include, where appropriate, all proposals outlined in the Community Development Plan. In addition to the above mentioned improvements, any other expenditures proposed by the community will be programmed into this program. The Capital Improvements Program will schedule proposed projects by priority, for a six-year period. These projects will be correlated to existing bonded indebtedness, assessed valuation, current tax rates, operating expenditures and all other sources of income and revenue. The program will show estimated costs and methods of financing, as well as indicating the tax rate necessary each year to retire both existing and proposed bond issues. Where applicable, any source of outside funding will be considered and identified.

## A-6 Zoning Ordinance and Map

A zoning ordinance and official zoning map shall be prepared for the community. This ordinance shall be based upon the Future Land Use and Thoroughfare Plan and shall be prepared according to acceptable zoning standards and principles. This ordinance will be prepared in close cooperation with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and the Planning Commission. The Official Zoning Map shall be prepared as a color display for discussion purposes and as a secondary base map with zoning boundaries drawn in ink with appropriate titles and notations. The Official Zoning Map shall be prepared on a stable base drafting film.

## A-7 Subdivision Regulations

An ordinance regulating the subdivision of land within the corporate limits shall be prepared in close cooperation with the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and the Planning Commission. This ordinance shall establish procedures for filing and approval of subdivision plats, establish minimum design and development standards, and prescribe administrative and enforcement procedures.

## A-8 Reports

Each of the above listed reports shall be prepared in preliminary form and presented to the Planning Commission and the Mayor and Board of Aldermen. The Mississippi Research and Development Center shall receive two (2) copies of each preliminary report. Upon approval of each preliminary report by the Planning Commission, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and the Mississippi Research and Development Center, final reports may be printed. One hundred and fifty (150) copies of reports A-2, A-4, A-5, A-6 and A-7 shall be printed. Appropriate maps shall be printed in color and all printing shall be done on paper of good quality using acceptable methods of reproduction. Fifty (50) copies of each final report shall be delivered to the Mississippi Research and Development Center and one hundred (100) copies shall be delivered to the municipality. Three hundred (300) copies of report A-3 shall be printed, with one hundred (100) copies delivered to the Mississippi Research and Development Center and two hundred (200) copies delivered to the municipality.
