BE IT REMEMBERED that there was begun and held a regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal at 7:30 P.M., Tuesday, October 21, 1975, in the Mayor's office in the City Hall.

WHEREAS, Mayor Byrd stated that the Board was at the point on the Agenda where public comment is encouraged and any of the citizens present wishing to speak may do so at this time.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen recognized Mr. and Mrs. Coston. Mrs. Coston stated to the Board of Aldermen that she had to file a warrant for her daughter's arrest under the charge of a run-away. Mrs. Coston addressed the Mayor and Board of Aldermen requesting a curfew for the teenagers of the City of Petal be taken under consideration. Mr. and Mrs. Coston stated that the reason for this request was to help prevent the teenagers and youth of Petal from roaming the streets late at night. Mr. and Mrs. Coston requested that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen take the proposal of a curfew under careful consideration as they felt it would be a great benefit for the children and parents of the community.

THEREUPON, Mayor Byrd stated to Mr. and Mrs. Coston that he and the Board of Aldermen appreciated their attendance as the Board of Aldermen always wanted to hear the problems of the community, and the best source of information is always the voice of the citizens.
