At the May 5, 1976 Board of Directors meeting of the Petal Chamber of Commerce, the following action was taken:

1. A resolution was passed to recommend to the City Administration that elections for Aldermen be held on an at-large basis.
2. A resolution was passed to recommend to the City Administration that a study be made of the speed limit on the Old Richton Road. The Chamber Board would like to suggest that the speed limit be raised to approximately 40 to 45 mph from the corporate limits to the vicinity of the Green's Creek Baptist Church and that it be 30 mph from there on.
3. A resolution was passed to recommend to the City Administration that a policeman be present to direct traffic at the High School on each morning. The Chamber Board does realize that a policeman is usually present, but it has been noted on several mornings there was no one there to handle the traffic.

We would also like to take this opportunity to thank you for sending a representative to our Board meetings. The Chamber wants to cooperate with you in helping build Petal, and we feel that continuing to establish better communication between us is the way to do this.

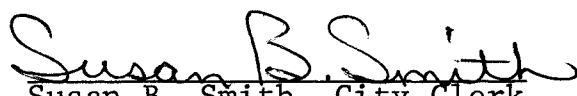
