WHEREAS, City Attorney, Thomas W. Tyner, read the following resolution directing the sale of the Three Million, Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$3,750,000) school bonds for the Petal Municipal Separate School District. The resolution read as follows, to-wit:

R E S O L U T I O N

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen then took up for consideration the matter of the sale of Three Million, Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,750,000) School Bonds of the Petal Municipal Separate School District of Forrest County, Mississippi, authorized at a special election held in said District on the 22nd day of November, 1977, and after a discussion of the subject, Alderman Boutwell offered and moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION TO DIRECT THE SALE OF THREE  
MILLION, SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND  
DOLLARS (\$3,750,000) SCHOOL BONDS OF THE  
PETAL MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT  
OF FORREST COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. That Three Million, Seven Hundred, Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,750,000) School Bonds of the Petal Municipal Separate School District of Forrest County, Mississippi, authorized at an election held in said District on the 22nd day of November, 1977, shall be offered for sale to the highest bidder therefor on Tuesday, the 5th day of December, 1978.

SECTION II. That said bonds shall be sold on sealed bids to be filed with the City Clerk at the City Hall in the City of Petal, Mississippi, at or before the hour of 2:00 o'clock P. M., Central Standard Time, on the aforesaid date; each bid to be accompanied by a cashier's check, certified check, or exchange, payable to the Petal Municipal Separate School District of Forrest County, Mississippi, issued or certified by a bank located in the State of Mississippi, in the amount of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) as a guaranty that the bidder will carry out his contract and purchase the bonds if his bid be accepted. If the successful bidder fails to purchase the bonds pursuant to his bid and contract, the amount of such good faith check shall be retained by the District and paid into the treasury of the District as liquidated damages for such failure. The Board of Aldermen reserves the right to reject any or all bids submitted, and, if all bids are rejected, to sell said bonds at private sale at any time within sixty (60) days after the date advertised for the receipt of bids, at a price not less than the highest bid which shall have been received for said bonds at such advertised sale.

SECTION III. That bidders for said bonds be requested

to designate in their bids the price they will pay for bonds bearing interest at a rate or rates, but not more than four (4) different rates, likewise to be designated in their bids; provided, further, that all bids conform to the terms relating to interest rate and otherwise, as contained in the form of Notice of Bond Sale as set forth in Section 4 of this resolution.

SECTION IV. That, as required by Section 31-19-25, Mississippi Code of 1972 Annotated, the Clerk of this Board shall be and is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the sale of said bonds by publication at least two (2) times in the Hattiesburg American, a newspaper published in the City of Hattiesburg, Forrest County, Mississippi, and having a general circulation in said County and in the City of Petal; the first publication to be made at least ten (10) days preceding the date set for the receipt of bids, and such notice to be in substantially the following form:

Sealed proposals will be received by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi, at the City Hall in the City of Petal, Mississippi, until the hour of 2:00 o'clock P. M., Central Standard Time on Tuesday, the 5th day of December, 1978, at which time said bids will be publicly opened for the purchase, at not less than par and accrued interest, of the above bonds of the Petal Municipal Separate School District.

The said bonds are to bear date of March 1, 1978, are to be of the denomination of \$5,000 each, and shall bear interest at a rate or rates to be determined pursuant to sale of said bonds, payable March 1, 1979, and semi-annually thereafter on September 1 and March 1, in each year. Both principal of and interest on said bonds will be payable at a place to be designated by the purchaser, subject to approval by the Mayor and Aldermen, and said bonds shall mature serially on March 1 in each of the years as follows:

(Due to the lapse of time between the aforesaid date of issue and the actual date of issuance of the bonds, coupons due March 1, 1979, shall represent interest accruing from December 1, 1978, to March 1, 1979. In computing gross interest costs, the bonds should be regarded as bearing interest from December 1, 1978.)

Bonds maturing March 1, 1989, and thereafter, may be redeemed, in inverse numerical order, at par and accrued interest, on March 1, 1988, or on any

interest payment date thereafter prior to maturity.

Bidders are requested to designate in their bids the price they will pay for bonds bearing interest at a rate or rates, but not more than four (4) different rates, likewise to be designated in their bids. A repeated rate will be counted only one time. No bonds shall bear more than one (1) rate of interest, each bond shall bear interest from its date to its stated maturity at the rate of interest specified in the bid; all bonds of the same maturity shall bear the same rate of interest from date to maturity; no interest payment shall be evidenced by more than one coupon and neither canceled nor supplemental coupons shall be permitted; the lowest interest rate specified for any bond shall not be less than seventy per centum (70%) of the highest interest rate specified for any bond; and the interest rate represented by any one interest coupon shall not exceed seven per centum (7%). Each interest rate specified in any bid must be a multiple of 1/8 of 1% or 1/10 of 1%.

Proposals should be addressed to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and should be plainly marked "Proposal for School Bonds", and should be filed with the City Clerk on or prior to the date and hour hereinabove named. Each bid must be accompanied by a cashier's check, certified check, or exchange, payable to the Petal Municipal Separate School District of Forrest County, Mississippi, issued or certified by a bank located in the State of Mississippi, in the amount of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) as a guaranty that the bidder will carry out his contract and purchase the bonds if his bid be accepted. If the successful bidder fails to purchase the bonds pursuant to his bid and contract, the amount of such good faith check shall be retained by the District and shall be paid into the treasury for the District.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen reserve the right to reject any or all bids.

These bonds are offered subject to the unqualified approval of the legality thereof by the law firm of Charles and Trauernicht of St. Louis, Missouri. The District will pay all expenses incident to the preparation and issuance of the bonds. Delivery of the bonds will be made to the purchaser on or before the expiration of sixty days from and after the date of sale, at a place to be designated by the purchaser and without the cost to the purchaser.

It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will be printed on said bonds, but neither the failure to print such number on any bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the purchaser thereof to accept delivery of and pay for said bonds in accordance with the terms of the purchase contract. All expenses in relation to the printing of CUSIP numbers on said bonds shall be paid for by the issuer; provided, however, that the CUSIP Service Bureau charge for the assignment of said numbers shall be the responsibility of and shall be paid for by the purchaser.

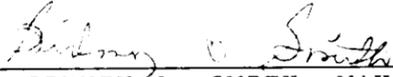
