SECTION I. That for the year 1978, there shall be and is hereby levied on all taxable property, real and personal within the corporate limits of the City of Petal, Mississippi, for ad valorem taxes for municipal purposes as indicated, the follow-

ing levies to be collected on each dollar of assessed value shown upon the real and personal ad valorem assessment rolls of said City within the city limits thereof, to-wit:

Ten and one-half (10.5) mills

SECTION II. That for the year 1978, there shall be and there is hereby levied on all taxable property, real and personal, within the Petal Municipal Separate School District within the City of Petal, Mississippi, and within the added territory outside the City of Petal for ad valorem taxes for school purposes, such levies having been authorized by the Board of Trustees of said School District by order entered on its minutes and certified to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the following levies to be collected on each dollar of assessed valuation shown on the said ad valorem assessment rolls, to-wit:

WHEREAS, City Attorney, Thomas W. Tyner, read the following resolution concerning the opening of the land rolls to the public. The Resolution read as follows, to-wit:

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE REAL AND PERSONAL AD VALOREM ASSESSMENT ROLLS OF THE CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI, AND THE MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICT WITH ADDED TERRITORIES, FOR THE YEAR 1978, EXCLUSIVE OF MOTOR VEHICLES, AS CORRECTED AND EQUALIZED, SUBJECT TO THE RIGHTS OF PARTIES IN INTEREST TO BE HEARD ON ALL OBJECTIONS MADE BY THEM IN WRITING AT THE MEETING OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN, COMMENCING OCTOBER 3, 1978 AND SUBJECT TO FURTHER CHANGES AND CORRECTIONS BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN
AS AUTHORIZED BY LAW

WHEREAS, the matter of the approval of the assessment of real property and the assessment of personal property, exclusive of motor vehicles, for the year 1978 came on for consideration before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi; and,

WHEREAS, it appears that the Tax Assessor of the City of Petal, Mississippi, has duly prepared and completed the real and personal ad valorem assessment rolls for the said City of Petal, and has filed the same with the City Clerk on August 15, 1978, in the manner provided by law; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen find that the Tax Assessor prepared the 1978 real and personal ad valorem assessment rolls and has made an affidavit and appended the same to each of the rolls as provided by law that the said affidavit shows and the Mayor and Board of Aldermen hereby find, that the said Tax Assessor has faithfully endeavored to ascertain and assess all persons and property in the City of Petal, Mississippi, and that said Assessor did not omit any person or thing, and did not place upon or accept an underevaluation of any property through fear, favor, or partiality; that the Assessor has required every taxpayer to make the oath required to be taken by the person rendering a list of his taxable property whenever possible; that the said Assessor filed the said real and personal rolls, under oath, as well as a list showing the name of each taxpayer, who failed or refused to make an oath to the personal tax list; and,

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen have, at this regular meeting on September 5, 1978, duly received and considered the said assessment rolls of real and personal property and have proceeded to change, correct, revise, and equalize said assessments in the manner provided by law; and,

WHEREAS, the said assessment rolls of real and personal property should be approved subject to objections of parties in interest as provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi:

SECTION 1.

That the ad valorem assessment rolls of the real property of the City of Petal for the year 1978, showing total assessments in the amount of \$10,387,870.00, and the ad valorem assessment rolls of personal property for the year 1978, exclusive of motor vehicles for the City of Petal, showing total assessments in the amount of \$424,560.00, and,

That the ad valorem assessment rolls of the real property of the Petal Municipal Separate School District for the year 1978, showing total assessments in the amount of \$5,768,240.00, and the ad valorem assessment rolls of personal property for the year 1978, exclusive of motor vehicles for the Petal Municipal Separate School District, showing total assessments in the amount of \$352,040.00

Be, and each said roll and assessments therein are, hereby approved as changed, corrected, revised and equalized, subject to the rights of the parties in interest to be heard on any objections hereafter made by them as herein provided, and subject to any further changes and corrections by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen as authorized by law.

SECTION II.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a public notice shall be published in the Hattiesburg American, a legal newspaper published in the County of Forrest, and having a general circulation in the City of Petal, Mississippi, at least two times, on dates to be designated therefor by the City Clerk - the first publication of which shall be at least ten (10) days prior to the regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen on October 3, 1978, notifying the public and taxpayers of the City of Petal, Mississippi, that the said real and personal ad valorem assessment rolls for the year 1978, and the assessments therein, have been corrected, revised, equalized, and approved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, and they are now ready for inspection and examination by the public; and that any objections thereto must be filed in writing with the City Clerk at the City Hall, P. O. Box 564, Petal, Mississippi, 39465, on or before 12:00 o'clock noon on October 3, 1978; that at 7:30 o'clock on said date, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen will convene in a regular meeting and commence hearing and considering said objections, if any, to said rolls and assessments, and that the said Mayor and Board of Aldermen will continue such hearings from day to day thereafter until all taxpayers and parties in interest who have so filed written objections to any of said rolls or assessments shall have been heard, and such objec-

tions heard and disposed of, and proper corrections, if any, made in said rolls and assessments.

That the said notice shall be signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and shall be directed to the public and taxpayers in substantially the following form, to-wit:


