PETITION FOR SEWER SERVICE

TO THE MAYOR AND ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PETAL, MS

WE, the undersigned are resident citizens and householders of the Beverly Hills area of the City of Petal, Mississippi. We are not furnished any sewer service by said city. We are forced to use septic tanks. Septic tanks in residential subdivisions are health hazards and cause odors. Many of us cannot use dishwashers which we have purchased and installed in out homes. Many of us have washing machines but cannot use them and are forced to go to the laundromats. We are forced to pump out our septic tanks every twelve to eighteen months at a cost of from \$70.00 to \$80.00. We must ration flushing our toilets and ration the use of our bath tubs and showers. Frequently after heavy rains we cannot flush our toilets at all because the rain water has caused the septic tank to fill up and back up into the toilets and when said toilets are flushed, they overflow.

Some of the homes in our area are as old as 12 or 13 years, while some are new homes. All the homes in our area are appraised by the County and City taxing authorities with very high values and our school, county and city taxes are high. We expected that after the incorporation of Petal, steps would be taken to provide sewers for our area. Since incorporation, there have been many capitol improvements in Petal but no sanitary services furnished our area of the city. A large part of the city has sewers and a sewer lagoon has been established. We feel that we pay our fair share of taxes and are entitled to sanitary sewer service on equal footing with any other resident citizens of the City of Petal.

We understand that there is never enough money to furnish all of the services desired and that every year when the city budget is prepared some desirable items must be omitted for lack of funds. We feel that sanitary sewer systems for our area is deserving and has been omitted from the city budget . for a sufficient number of years. We feel that the city must now raise our needs for sanitary sewer system up to first priority and let some of the other worthy items occupy the bottom of the list of priorities. We will not agree to the appropriateness of a special tax levy taxing only our area for revenue to install a sewer system. We would agree to a city wide tax levy. We would agree to a diversion of revenue sharing funds; we would agree to a diversion of funds for a new police station or to a diversion of funds allocated for roads and bridges. We would agree to the payment of the cost out of a city wide bond issue or either out of the general fund. Somewhere, by additional taxes or by skrimping and saving on present taxes, the city must find the funds to furnish sanitary sewer lines for our area on a par with sanitary sewer lines furnished the other areas of the city.

We request that the Mayor and Aldermen promptly set in motion plans to lay sanitary sewer lines in the Beverly Hills area so that we may no longer be second class citizens of Petal but enjoy the same facilities in our homes that the other residents enjoy. If the city cannot do this, then we

feel that the city should give us, residents of Beverly Hills area, who are without any sanitary sewer facilities what so ever, a large reduction in our taxes. If work has not begun by July 1, 1979, on sanitary sewer lines for our area, we intend to protest the city taxes being levied on our homes.

We respectfully request the Mayor and Aldermen to give immediate attention to our situation, as our homes are depreciating in value, we are denied the full enjoyment of our homes and we undergo health hazards as well as extreme hardship and inconvenience by being required to make do with septic tanks in an exclusive residential area of the City of Petal.

We would appreciate an expression of intent from the Mayor and Aldermen now, that construction work will begin by July 1, 1979, on a sewer system for our area.
