AN ORDINANCE CHANGING AND AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE ZONING DISTRICT MAP, ADOPTED AS PART OF COMPREHENSIVE ZONING ORDINANCE NO. 1979 (42) OF THE CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NUMBER 1979 (42-A) SO AS TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN LAND IN SAID CITY FROM R-1, SINGLE FAMILY, TO C-1 NEIGHBORHOOD COMMERCIAL

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION I. That the Comprehensive Zoning District Map, adopted as part of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance Number 1979 (42) of the City of Petal, Mississippi, as amended by Ordinance Number (42-A) be and the same is hereby changed and amended as per petition filed in connection therewith so that the land described as:

Parcel No. 1 - Commence at the Southwest Corner of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 31, Township 5 North, Range 12 West, Forrest County, Mississippi, and run thence North and along the West boundary line of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  a distance of 322.8 feet; thence, at right angles, run East for a distance of 15 feet to the East margin line of a proposed public road for a point of beginning from this point of beginning continue East for a distance of 221.10 feet, thence at right angles run North for a distance of 129.0 feet to the Southeasterly right of way line of the Mississippi U. S. Highway 42 as now surveyed and constructed, thence at an angle of 102 degrees 30 minutes to the left, run South 77 degrees 30 minutes West and along the said Southeasterly right of way for a distance of 226.47 feet, more or less, to the East margin line of the proposed public road; thence at an angle of 77 degrees 30 minutes to the left, run South and along the aforesaid East margin line of the proposed public road, for a distance of 80.0 feet to the point of beginning, said parcel of land lying and being situated in and forming a part of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of said Section, Township and Range and containing .53 of an acre, and also;

Except as hereby expressly changed and amended, the aforesaid Comprehensive Zoning District Map and the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 1979 (42) of the City of Petal, Mississippi, as amended by Ordinance No. 1979 (42A) shall be and remain in full force and form as adopted on April 5, 1979.

SECTION III. That this Ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage as provided by law.

THEREUPON, Alderman Draughn made the motion to adopt the following order to hire Henry Bounds as police chief at a salary of \$1118.00 per month, effective October 1, 1979, upon the condition that Mr. Bounds move to Petal within a year from the date hired.

Alderman Campbell seconded the motion. The order read as follows, to-wit:

O R D E R

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi, deem it necessary to hire a Chief of Police due to the resignation of Gary Morrow.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Henry Bounds be, and he is hereby appointed as Police Chief at a rate of pay of \$1118.00 per month, to serve from October 1, 1979, until further orders of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi.
