REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF
THE CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION I. Section 14 of Ordinance 1977 (38) as adopted on October 18, 1977, and amended in Ordinance 1977 (38 A-1) on October 2, 1979, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows, to-wit:

Section 14: Schedule of rates.

(a) The following schedule of rates is hereby ascertained, found and declared to be reasonable, and the same are established as the rates to be charged for water and sewer service furnished on a quantity or meter basis, subject to minimum charges shown below:


