#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies and procedures, relating to major balance sheet, income and expense classifications, are followed in reporting financial information annually:

General -

All funds, except the Combined Water and Sewer System, follow the modified accrual method of accounting wherein revenues are recognized as collected and expenses are recognized as incurred. The Combined Water and Sewer System follows the accrual method of accounting wherein revenues and expenses are recognized during the period in which they are earned or incurred, respectively.

#### Fixed Assets -

Fixed assets are stated at cost. Additions are capitalized, while expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged against revenues. Depreciation is not provided for in the General Fixed Asset Group. Depreciation is provided for in the Combined Water and Sewer System Based upon the estimated useful life of the individual unit of property under the straight line method. Estimated lives of buildings and equipment in the Combined Water and Sewer System are as follows:

#### 2. COMBINED WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM

A separate report, dated November 30, 1979, was issued covering the Combined Water and Sewer System. The financial statements are included in the combined financial statements of the City of Petal.

#### 3. OPERATIONS ASSUMED OF WATER AND SEWER FACILITY

The City of Petal acquired all assets and assumed all indebtedness of the water and sewer facility previously known as the East Forrest Utility District of Forrest County, Mississippi in an agreement entered into on March 15, 1977. Operations were assumed October 1, 1977. Revenue Bonds outstanding were assumed as follows:

#### 4. FIXED ASSET INVENTORY

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A physical inventory of fixed assets owned by the City of Petal was taken during the first week of October, 1979. The system implemented to account for fixed assets is being carried out in a sufficient manner.

5. PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENT

An adjustment of \$330.16 was made to correct an error in bringing forward the cash balance of Meter Deposit Fund for the year ended September 30, 1978.

6. SCHOOL BONDS PAYABLE

On December 1, 1978, the City of Petal issued bonds to finance the construction of a new school. The bonds were issued on January 25, 1979, at par plus accrued interest. Proceeds from the bond sale were as follows:

## 7. LOAN PRINCIPAL DUE

Due to a delay in the collection of tax assessments, it was necessary to take a short-term loan to meet the principal and interest requirements for the redemption of the first series of matured bonds. A note in the amount of \$216,000.00 was taken out with the Bank of Hattiesburg. The note bears an interest rate of six percent and is due March 15, 1980.

8. CONTINGENCIES

The attorney for the City of Petal confirmed that at this time there are no contingencies, pending litigations, or unasserted claims that would that would materially effect the financial statements of the City of Petal.

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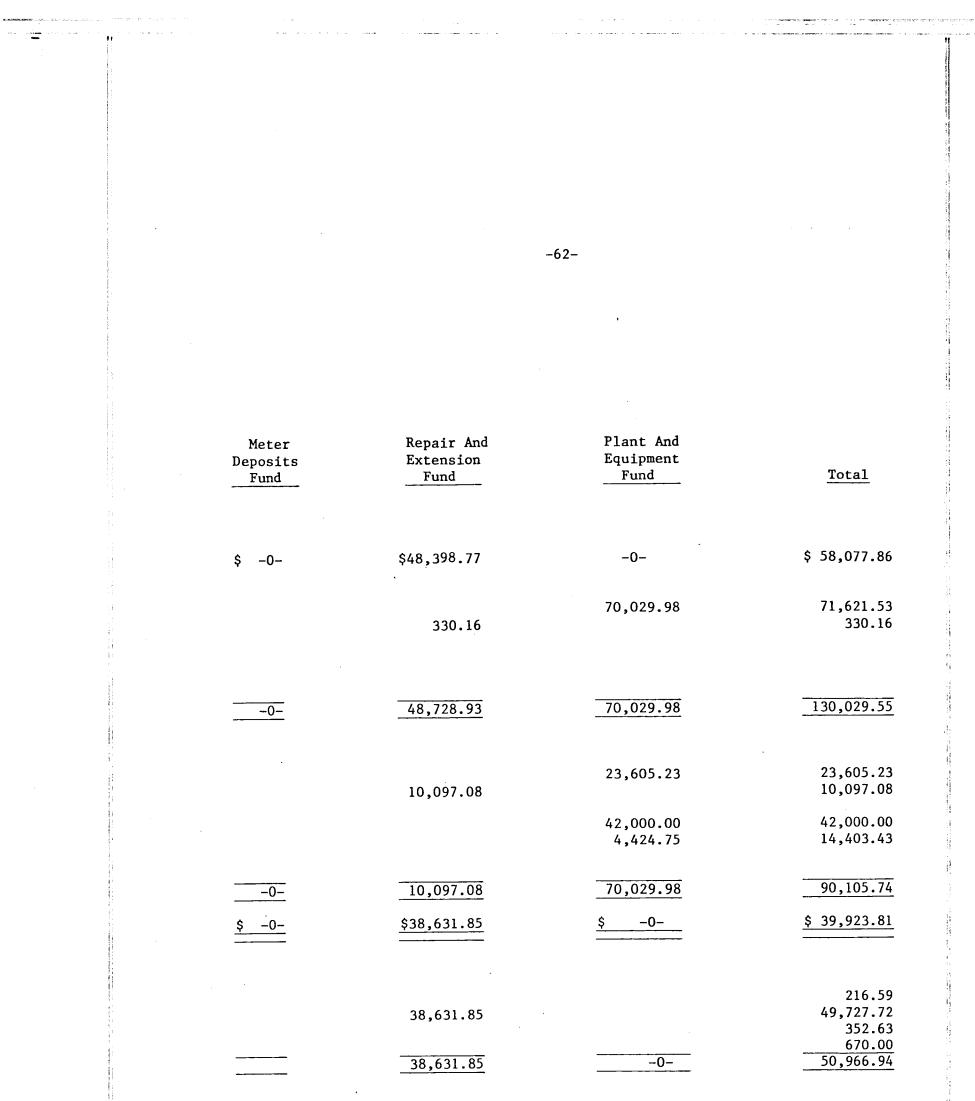

#### 2. OPERATIONS ASSUMED BY CITY OF PETAL

Services have continued and all requirements of the bond resolution creating the District are applicable to Petal's operation of the water and sewer facility. However, the District's fiscal year for financial reporting purposes was changed to coincide with the City of Petal's fiscal year ending on September 30.
