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

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THEREUPON, Alderman Boutwell made a motion to adopt the following ordinance. Alderman Campbell seconded the motion. The ordinance read as follows, to-wit:

ORDINANCE 1980 (49)

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE MAKING, CREATION, OR MAINTENANCE OF EXCESSIVE, UNNECESSARY UNNATURAL, OR UNUSUALLY LOUD NOISES; PROVIDING STANDARDS AND DEFINITIONS; PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF; EFFECTIVE DATE OF ENACTMENT, AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi;

SECTION 1-1. It is found and declared that:

(A) The making and creation of excessive or unusually loud noises within the limits of the City of Petal, Mississippi, is a condition which has existed for some time and the extent and volume of such noises is increasing;

(B) The making, creation or maintenance of such excessive, unnecessary, unnatural or unusually loud noises which are prolonged, unusual and unnatural in their time, place and use affect and are a detriment to public health, comfort, convenience, safety, welfare and prosperity of the residents of the City of Petal, and constitute a nuisance; and

(C) The necessity in the public interest for the provisions and prohibitions hereinafter contained and enacted, is declared a matter of legislative determination and public policy, and is further declared that the provisions and prohibitions hereinafter contained and enacted are in pursuance of and for the purpose of securing and promoting the public health, comfort, convenience, safety, welfare and prosperity and the peace and quiet of the City of Petal and its inhabitants.

SECTION 1-2. It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue, or cause to be made or continued any excessive, unnecessary or unusually loud noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety

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of others, within the limits of the City.

SECTION 1-3. NOISES PROHIBITED--UNNECESSARY NOISE STANDARD. The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing and unnecessary noises in violation of this ordinance, but said enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive, namely: (A) HORNS, SIGNALING DEVICES, ETC. The sounding of any horn or signaling device on any automobile, motorcycle, street car or other vehicle on any street or public place of the city, except as a danger warning; the creation by means of any such signaling device of any unreasonably loud or harsh sound, and the sounding of any such device for an unnecessary and unreasonable period of time. The use of any signaling device except one operated by hand or electricity; the use of any horn, whistle or other device operated by engine exhaust, and the use of any such signaling device when traffic is for any reason held up.

(B) RADIOS, PHONOGRAPHS, ETC. The using, operating, or permitting to be played, used or operated any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of the neighboring inhabitants or at any time with louder volume than is necessary for convenient hearing for the person or persons who are in the room, vehicle or chamber in which such machine or device is operated and who are voluntary listeners thereto. The operation of any such set, instrument, phonograph, machine or device between the hours of eleven (11) o'clock P. M. and seven (7) o'clock A. M. in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of fifty (50) feet from the building, structure or vehicle in which it is located shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.

(C) LOUD SPEAKERS, AMPLIFIERS FOR ADVERTISING. The using, operating or permitting to be played, used or operated of any receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, loudspeaker, sound amplifier, or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound which is cast upon the public streets for the purpose of commercial advertising or attracting the attention of the public to any building or structure.

(D) YELLING, SHOUTING, ETC. Yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling, or singing on the public streets, particularly between the hours of 11 P. M. and 7 A. M., or at any time or place so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of persons in any office, or in any dwelling, hotel or other type of residence, or of any persons in the vicinity.

(E) ANIMALS, BIRDS, ETC. The keeping of any animal or bird which by causing frequent or long continued noise shall disturb the comfort or repose of any persons in the vicinity.

(F) STEAM WHISTLES. The blowing of any locomotive steam whistle or steam whistle attached to any stationary boiler except to give notice of the time to begin or stop work or a warning of fire or danger, or upon request of proper city authorities.

(G) EXHAUSTS. The discharge into the open air of the exhaust of any steam engine, stationary internal combustion engine, motor boat, or motor vehicle except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud or explosive noises therefrom.

(H) DEFECT IN VEHICLE OR LOAD. The use of any automobile, motorcycle, or vehicle so out of repair, so loaded or in such manner as to create loud and unnecessary grating, grinding, rattling or other noise.

(I) LOADING, UNLOADING, OPENING BOXES. The creation of a

loud and excessive noise in connection with loading or unloading any vehicle or the opening and destruction of bales, boxes, crates, and containers.

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(J) CONSTRUCTION OR REPAIRING OF BUILDINGS. The erection (including excavation), demolition, alteration or repair of any building other than between the hours of seven (7) A. M., and six (6) P. M. on week days, except in case of urgent necessity in the interest of public health and safety, and then only with a permit from the Building Inspector, which permit may be granted for a period not to exceed three (3) days or less while the emergency continues and which permit may be renewed for periods of three days or less while the emergency continues. If the Building Inspector should determine that the public health and safety will not be impaired by the erection, demolition, alteration or repair of any building or the excavation of streets and highways within the hours of six (6) P. M., and seven (7) A. M., and if he shall further determine that loss or inconvenience would result to any party in interest, he may grant permission for such work to be done within the hours of six (6) P. M., and seven (7) A. M., upon application being made at the time the permit for the work is awarded or during the progress of the work.

(K) SCHOOLS, COURTS, CHURCHES, HOSPITALS. The creation of any excessive noise on any street adjacent to any school, institution of learning, church or court while the same are in use, or adjacent to any hospital, rest home or nursing home, which unreasonably interferes with the workings of such institution, or which disturbs or unduly annoys patients in the hospital, rest home or nursing home, provided conspicuous signs are displayed in such streets indicating that the same is a school, hospital, rest home, nursing home, or court street.

(L) HAWKERS, PEDDLERS. The shouting and crying of peddlers, hawkers and vendors which disturbs the peace and quiet of the neighborhood.

(M) DRUMS. The use of any drum or other instrument or device for the purpose of attracting attention by creation of noise to any performance, show or sale.

(N) METAL RAILS, PILLARS AND COLUMNS, TRANSPORTATION THERE-OF. The transportation of rails, pillars, or columns of iron, steel or other material, over and along the streets and other public places upon carts, trays, cars, trucks, or in any other manner so loaded as to cause loud noises or as to disturb the peace and quiet of such streets or other public places.

(0) RAILWAY CARS, OPERATION THEREOF. The causing, permitting or continuing of any excessive, unnecessary and avoidable noise in the operation of a railway car.

(P) PILE DRIVERS, HAMMERS, ETC. The operation between the hours of ten (10) P. M., and seven (7) A. M., of any pile driver, steam shovel, pmeumatic hammer, derrick, steam or electric hoist or other appliance, the use of which is attended by loud or unusual noise.

(Q) BLOWERS. The operation of any noise creating blower or power fan or any internal combustion engine, the operation of which causes noise due to the explosion of operating gases or fluids, unless the noises from such blower or fan is muffled and such engine is equipped with a muffler devise sufficient to deaden such noise.

(R) The making or maintaining of any other loud, continuous, or disquieting noise which shall disturb the peace and comfort of any person in the vicinity.

SECTION 1-4. VIOLATION--A MISDEMEANOR. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not exceeding Three Hundred (\$300) Dollars, or be imprisoned in the City or County jail for a period not exceeding Thirty (30) days, or both by such fine and imprisonment. Each day such violation is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable as one offense and shall be punishable as such hereunder.

SECTION 1-5. ADDITIONAL REMEDY--INJUNCTION. As an additional remedy, the operation or maintenance of any device, instrument, vehicle or machinery in violation of any provision hereof, and which causes discomfort or a moyance to reasonable persons of normal sensitiveness or which endangers the comfort, repose, health or peace of residents in the area shall be deemed, and is declared to be a public nuisance and may be subject to abatement summarily by a restraining order of injunction issued by a court of competent jurisdiction.

SECTION 1-6. SEPARABILITY. It is the intention of the City Council that each separate provision of this ordinance shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and it is further the intention of the City Council that if any provision of this Ordinance be declared to be invalid, all other provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

SECTION 1-7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty days from and after its passage.
