REPAYMENT AGREEMENT

AN AGREEMENT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF Petal Forrest County, Mississippi, to enter into a repayment agreement with THE STATE TAX COMMISSION BY AUTHORITY OF SECTION 49-17-65 AND SECTION 49-17-67. MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHEREBY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION, IN ACCORDANCE WITH A REPAYMENT SCHEDULE HEREINAFTER SET OUT, SHALL WITHHOLD MONTHLY FROM THE AMOUNT OF SALES TAX THE CITY IS ENTITLED TO UNDER SECTION 27-65-75, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AND PAY THE SAME TO THE WATER POLLUTION ABATEMENT BOND FUND.

WHEREAS. THE CITY DESIRES TO CONSTRUCT WASTEWATER TREATMENT WORKS WHICH ARE TO BE APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, BUREAU OF POLLUTION CONTROL AND IS TO RECEIVE ITS <u>first</u> grant from the State, this one to be IN THE AMOUNT OF \$400,000 FOR SAID PURPOSE BY PLEDGING THE CITY'S PART OF THE SALES TAX REIMBURSEMENT TO WHICH IT IS ENTITLED UNDER SECTION 27-65-75. MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AS MAY BE REQUIRED TO MEET THE REPAYMENT SCHEDULE HEREBY ADOPTED BY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION, WHICH REPAYMENT SCHEDULE IS AS FOLLOWS:

THE MONTHLY REPAYMENTS TO BE MADE BY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION TO THE WATER POLLUTION ABATEMENT BOND FUND FROM THE CITY OF Petal Forrest COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, SALES TAX REIMBURSEMENT UNDER SECTION 27-65-75, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, ARE HEREBY DETERMINED TO BE \$ 1,666.67 FOR A PERIOD OF _______ MONTHS FOR THE REPAYMENT OF THE \$ 400,000 GRANT MADE TO SAID CITY.

THE GENERAL REPAYMENT SCHEDULE HERETOFORE ADOPTED BY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION ON MAY 31, 1971, AND RECORDED IN MINUTE BOOK 6 AT PAGE 192 IS INCLUDED AS A PART OF THIS REPAYMENT SCHEDULE BY REFERENCE.

AND WHEREAS, THE CITY DESIRES TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE TAX COMMISSION TO WITHHOLD MONTHLY FROM THE AMOUNT OF SALES TAX THE STATE TAX COMMISSION IS TO REMIT TO IT UNDER SECTION 27-65-75 FOR REPAYMENT OF SAID GRANT TO THE WATER POLLUTION ABATEMENT BOND FUND UNDER THE TERMS OF SAID REPAYMENT SCHEDULE. AND THE STATE TAX COMMISSION IS AGREEABLE TO WITHHOLD MONTHLY FROM THE AMOUNT OF SALES TAX TO BE REMITTED TO THE CITY THE SUM OF \$ 1,666.67 AND PAY THE SUM SO WITHHELD TO THE WATER POLLUTION ABATEMENT BOND FUND UNDER THE TERMS OF SAID REPAYMENT SCHEDULE:

THAT THE CITY OF Petal HEREBY AUTHORIZES THE STATE TAX COMMISSION TO WITHHOLD \$ 1,666.67 MONTHLY FROM THE AMOUNT OF SALES TAX IT IS TO REMIT TO THE CITY UNDER SECTION 27-65-75. MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, FOR REPAYMENT OF THE \$ 400,000 GRANT TO THE WATER POLLUTION ABATEMENT BOND FUND UNDER THE TERMS OF SAID REPAYMENT SCHEDULE:

WHEREAS, by appropriate Resolution duly and unanimously adopted by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, on the 10thday of September A.D., 1985, and appearing of record in the City of Petal Minute Book 9 page 128, it was found, determined and adjudicated among other things, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 1, Chapter 30, General Laws of Mississippi, of 1053, Extraordinary Session, as amended (Section, 37-59-101, Mississippi Code of 1972), the Board of Trustees of the Petal Municipal Separate School District with added territory, Forrest County, Mississippi, was authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to borrow money under the terms and provisions specified in said Act, for air conditioning Petal Junior School Auditorium further, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 2 of said Chapter 30, General Laws of Mississippi, of 1953, Extraordinary Session, as amended (Section 37-59-103, Mississippi Code of 1972); before any money should be borrowed under the provisions of said Act, the Board of Trustees of said School District should adopt a Resolution declaring the necessity for borrowing such money, specifying the amount to be so borrowed, the date or dates of maturity thereof, how such indebtedness would be evidenced, the nature and approximate cost of the said improvements to be

purchased, and further, declaring that no funds were available in the school funds of the said School District or from any other source with which to make such purchase and renovation; and further, that such a Resolution of the said Board of Trustees of the said School District, fully complying with all of the terms and provisions of said Section 2 of said Act, had been on August 20, 1985, presented to, filed with and received by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, setting forth and declaring among other things, the necessity for borrowing the aggregate sum of \$40,000.00 for the purpose of and to be expended for __air conditioning Petal Junior High School Auditorium ; said funds not being available from any other source, school funds or otherwise, said indebtedness to be evidenced by negotiable note or notes of the said Petal Municipal Separate School District with added territory bearing interest at an agreed rate per annum, not to exceed eight per centum (8%), issued by the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, and executed by the Mayor and Clerk of the City of Petal, all as provided, and within the limitations imposed by law, said note or notes to mature in approximate equal annual installments over a period not to exceed five (5) years from the date of issuance thereof; and further that pursuant to the provisions of Section 3 of said Chapter 30, General Laws of Mississippi of 1953, Extraordinary Session, as amended (Section 37-59-105, Mississippi Code of 1972), the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, at its first regular meeting following the receipt of such Resolution should by appropriate Resolution duly adopted by said Board, declare its purpose and intention to authorize the borrowing of said money and to issue negotiable note or notes of the said School District therefor and as evidence thereof, said Resolution setting

authorizing the borrowing of said money and the issuance of such note or notes; and further said Resolution by its terms, required that the full and complete text thereof be published once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in the Hattiesburg American, a daily newspaper published at Hattiesburg, Mississippi, and having general circulation of the Petal Municipal Separate School District with added territory, Forrest County, Mississippi, and being qualified to publish legal notices under the terms and provisions of Section 13-1-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, with the first publication thereof being made not less than fifteen (15) days prior to said date of 11-5-85, 1985. with the qualified electors of the Petal Municipal Separate School District with added territory, Forrest County, Mississippi, having the right and privilege of requiring the calling and holding of an election upon the question of incurring said indebtedness, authorizing the borrowing of said money and issuing such note or notes by twenty per centum (20%) of such qualified electors filing with the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, on or before said date of 11-5-85, 1985, a petition requesting such an election, all as provided by said Chapter 30, General Laws of Mississippi, of 1953, Extraordinary Session, as amended (Section 37-59-100, et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972), and other applicable provisions of law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, does hereby affirmatively finds, sustain and determine and adjudicate that, at this time on this date 11-5-85, 1985, no petition or protest written or otherwise, of any kind and character whatsoever, opposing the borrowing of said money

WHEREAS, by said Resolution, the Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, declared and expressed its purpose and intention to authorize the borrowing by the said Mayor and Board of Alderman of the City of Petal, Forrest County, Mississippi, and to borrow, for and on behalf of the Board of Trustees of the said Petal Municipal Separate School District with added territory, the aggregate sum of \$40,000.00 to provide funds for the purpose of and to be expended for the necessary air conditioning of the Petal Junior High School Auditorium
