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WHEREAS Mayor Smith called for public comment but there was none.

WHEREAS Ocie Wilson introduced Pam Lambert, Director of the Hattiesburg Library system. Ms. Lambert presented a proposed budget for the operation of the library system, including the budget for a full time operation of the Petal Branch. The estimated cost of the full time library service in Petal is \$54,820 minus the county per capita paid by the Petal residents of \$33.705 leaves an amount needed from the City of Petal of \$21,115, in increase from last years allocation of \$15,115.

THEREUPON Mayor Smith stated that this request will be considered while the City is preparing its 1988-89 FY budget.

WHEREAS Mayor Smith presented the contract between the City of Petal and the Petal Municipal Separate School District for the Senior Citizens meals for the FY 1988/89.

The PETAL SCHOOL DISTRICT and the CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI, hereby agree to enter into the following contract whereby the PETAL SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees to the following regulations for serving lunches to SENIOR CITIZENS of Petal, and the CITY OF PETAL further agrees to the following regulations for reimbursement and payment for said SENIOR CITIZENS lunches.

The aforementioned regulations are as follows:

SENIOR CITIZENS meals will be served on Monday and Wednesday of each school session week except on specified school holidays. Said meals will be served by the Petal Junior High School cafeteria staff.

SENIOR CITIZENS meals will be served by the PETAL SCHOOL DISTRICT beginning promptly at 10:30 a.m. on said days and those SENIOR CITIZENS participating will be completed with their meals before student serving time at 11:15 a.m. SENIOR CITIZENS participating will be responsible for picking up their lunch trays at the service line and taking the lunch trays to the dish room window upon completion of their meals.

SENIOR CITIZENS lunch menus will be the same as that served the students of the PETAL SCHOOL DISTRICT. Copies of said menus will appear weekly in the Petal Journal.

SENIOR CITIZENS shall be allowed to bring a guest.

Privilege Licenses Expiration Ordinance

An ordinance providing for the Issuance of Privilege Licenses which shall expire one (1) year from the date of issuance.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Board of Mayor and Alderman of the City of Petal, State of Mississippi as follows:

Section 1

State Code Amendment

This ordinance is enacted in accordance with Senate Bill No. 2081 as adopted by the Mississippi Legislature, regular session 1988; pursuant to Section 6 which amends 27-17-463 and permits municipalities to issue privilege licenses which shall expire one (1) year from the date of issuance.

Section 2

Expiration of Privilege Licenses

The City of Petal will issue annual privilege licenses which will be effective for one (1) year from the date of issuance. The date of issuance shall be on the license, and that license shall expire one (1) calendar year or a period of twelve (12) calendar months from that date.

Section 3

Validity

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4

Ordinance In Force

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

Section 5

Ratification

Dear Mayor and Board of Aldermen:

Attached you will find two (2) copies of the 1988-89 budget for the Petal School District, as required by Sections 37-61-9 and 37-61-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, to be filed with the tax levying authority on or before July 15.

This budget on the local level will require ad valorem collections of \$1,923,569.00 for the support, maintenance and operation of the Petal School District. The breakdown is as follows:

The ad valorem collection required to fund the 1988-89 school budget is approximately \$50,000 greater than ad valorem collections received during the 1987-88 school year. This \$50,000 is designated to purchase school buses for kindergarten transportation as mandated by the State.
