There shall be two (2) classes of building sewer permits: (a) for residential and commercial service, and (b) for service to establishments producing industrial waste. In either case, the owner or his agent shall make application on a special form furnished by the City. The permit application shall be supplemented by any plans, specifications, and shall meet OSHA requirements, or other information considered pertinent in the judgement of the Superintendent. A permit and inspection fee of One Hundred Eighty Five Dollars (\$185.00) for a residential or commercial building sewer permit where a sewer tap does not exist and where the tap does exist an inspection fee of \$35.00 only, and Three Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$350.00) for an industrial building sewer permit shall be paid to theCity at the time the application is filed.

SECTION II. All ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION III. Ordinance 1986 (65), Ordinance 1986 (65A) and Ordinance 1986 (65B), except as amended herein be, and the same are still in full force and effect. SECTION IV. This Ordinance, amended Ordinance 1986 (65 C) based upon urgent necessity and circumstances shall be effective immediately. 491
