Policy as written:

RULE IV. OVERTIME

Overtime shall be defined as work performed in excess of an employee's regularly prescribed work week. Overtime authorized by supervisors for employees on the bi-weekly payroll normally will be compensated for by allowing employees equivalent time off. Comp-time will be taken in thirty (30) days or employee will be paid overtime at the regular rate of regular pay.

Overtime work will be authorized only if required. Supervisors may authorize overtime pay for overtime work concurrently as worked if the determine it to be in the best interest of the City. Employees who normally perform the same type of work will receive equal overtime opportunities, as far as possible. Supervisors will maintain proper records of overtime authorized and worked to insure proper time off or pay for the service.

Policy as amended:

RULE IV. OVERTIME

The City of Petal complies with Overtime Compensation under the Fair Labor Standards Act.

Overtime shall be defined as work authorized by the supervisor and performed in excess of an employee's regularly prescribed work week. The work week for all City employees, other than Policemen and Firemen, will be a 7 day work week, not to exceed 40 hours. Any time worked over the 40 hours will be given, either as comp-time or cash at a rate of one and one-half (1 1/2) times the regular hourly rate of pay.

The work period for the Policemen is set on a 14 day work period as set in Article 553.230 (b) - section 7(k) of the FLSA, which states that no overtime compensation is required under section 7(k) until the number of hours exceeds 86 hours. The salary of the Policemen is set at 86 hours per pay period any hours worked over 86 hours will be compensated with time at one and one-half (1 1/2) times the hours worked.

The work period for Firemen is set on a 14 day work period as set in Article 553.230 (c) - section 7(k) of the FLSA, which states that no overtime compensation is required under section 7(k) until the number of hours exceeds 106 hours. The hourly firemen will be paid regular time for the first 106 hours and one and one-half (1 1/2) time for any hours over 106 hours in a 15 day work period.




