#### LEGALLY BINDING AGREEMENT CITY OF PETAL RENTAL REHABILITATION PROGRAM

This agreement is between the City of Petal, Mississippi, Post Office Box 564, Petal, Mississippi 39465 (the "City") and Jack Cooley 507 E. 5th Avenue, Petal, Mississippi 39465

("the undersigned").

For value received, the undersigned promises to pay the City of Petal a sum equal to the amount loaned to the undersigned through the City of Petal's Rental Rehabilitation Program, such sum not to exceed  $\frac{6.254}{10\%}$  per housing unit. A ten percent (10%) portion of said principal will be forgiven on an annual basis provided the following conditions are met.

By participating in the City's Rental Rehabilitation Program and receiving the financial benefit of the loan, the undersigned agrees to the following conditions:

- 1. That there will be no conversion of project housing units to condominium ownership or any form of cooperative assistance, and that there will be no discrimination against prospective tenants on the basis of their receipt of or eligibility for housing assistance under any federal, state or local program; both of the above conditions to be in effect for a period of ten (10) years from the date of completion of the rehabilitated unit(s).
- That the undersigned will perform or have performed the work necessary to bring the project unit(s) into compliance with applicable City codes, and, that in order to receive the loan funds, such work will be done to the satisfaction of the City of Petal, requirements of the HUD Housing Quality Standards, and the State of Mississippi's department of Community Development. In so agreeing, the undersigned also agrees to provide written documentation of all costs and/or labor expended in performing such work. Failure to provide such sufficient documentation will adversely affect the loan amount the owner would receive. By signing this agreement, the undersigned understands that the loan amount must be matched dollar-for-dollar by the undersigned, with the maximum loan amount per unit not to exceed \$ 6.254 , unless otherwise approved by the State of Mississippi's Department of Community Development.

- 7. No lead-based paint will be used in the rehabilitation of units; federal regulations concerning this matter will be followed.
- 8. By signing this agreement, undersigned states that he/

APPLICATION - Mayor Jack Gay of Petal requested assistance from the Pat Harrison Waterway District , hereafter called the District, on August 9, 1990.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION - Repairs to the drainage ditch in a reach of about 600 feet downstream from Main Street. The work consists of (a) removing rubble and debris, broken block and concrete, and sandy soil as needed to provide a smooth grade through the 600 foot reach of drainage ditch. (b) Shaping or sloping the left bank as needed to place slope protection. (c) Placement of concrete or other slope protection, and (d) cleaning up behind the construction to provide a well-groomed channel and overbank section within the established rights-of-way. section within the established rights-of-way.

PROJECT CONSTRUCTION - The City of Petal will accomplish the work with local forces and total expenditures will not exceed \$13,000.

CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION - The District will review the project as it progresses to assure quality construction and timely completion within two months from date of this agreement.

COOPERATION OF FORREST COUNTY - The primary source of funds for the District is from County taxes. Therefore, the use of District funds within the County for such project must be concurred in by the County Board of Supervisors to assure the District that the project fits their priority for funding.

APPROVED DISTRICT FUNDING - At its regular meeting on August 23, 1990, the Board of Directors for the District approved funds of \$6,500 or 50% of the total project cost currently estimated to be \$13,000, whichever is less.

METHOD OF PAYMENT -Upon completion of the work and receipt of expenditure data from the City, a final inspection report, and the fiscal officer's report, the Board will authorize the
