31-7-15. Whenever two (2) or more competitive bids are received, one or more of which relates to commodities grown, processed, or manufactured within this State, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality, and service, the commodities grown, processed, or manufactured within this State whenever purchases are made without competitive bids, and when practical the Office of General Services may by regulation establish reasonable preferential policies for other commodities, giving preference to resident suppliers of this State.

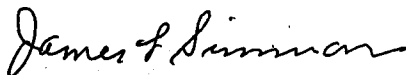

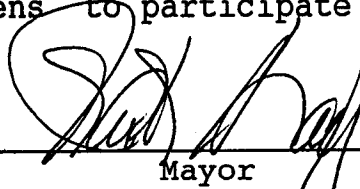

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the new pay scale for Elizabeth Brewer shall be at the rate of pay of \$16,460.00, effective October 1st, 1993.
