HOME PROGRAM

-- Rehabilitation Policies, Procedures and Guidelines The City of Petal

1.0 Purpose and Intent

With this adopted document the City of Petal hereby sets forth the housing rehabilitation policies and procedures and guidelines. The purpose of this document is to establish guidelines by which persons may obtain housing rehabilitation assistance. This project is under the Department of Economic and Community Development/Community Services Division's HOME Program.

The City will contract with a grant administrator to provide housing rehabilitation services as follows:

- Assist in conducting family surveys. Assist in determining eligibility. Develop work write-ups. Perform housing inspections.

- Assist in securing contract bids. Evaluate bids and make recomm

- Evaluate bids and make recommendations for contracts.

 Certify that rehabilitation work meets building codes.

 Develop necessary forms for carrying out the project.

 Maintain program records and documentation.

 Make reports on program performance and financial reports on grant funds as required.

It is the intent of the City to serve low and moderate income homeowners and to utilize other resources that may be available.

2.0 Applicant Eligibility

2.1 General

No member of the governing body of the City of Petal shall be eligible for the program. This prohibition shall continue for one (1) year after an individual's relationship with the City of Petal ends.

2.2 Income Eligibility

Income eligibility limits for HOME rehabilitation assistance are the same as those income limits established by HUD for low income persons. (See Attachment A) The family annual income is determined to be the amount(s) shown for income tax purposes for the previous taxable year. Source documentation shall be required to

verify income(s) where no tax forms are available. The total combined income of all household members shall be used to determine the income limits.

2.3 Income and Assets Criteria

To be eligible for assistance, families must meet the income and assets criteria. Since funds are limited, assistance will be provided to low income households in need of repair according to the priority rating guide. Meeting income and assets criteria does not automatically mean that a family will receive assistance. Each applicant will be required to identify its household assets.

2.4 Length of Ownership

The units must be owned and occupied by applicants at least one (1) year prior to the date of approval of the application by the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development.

2.5 Application Process

Program administrators shall meet with potential applicants at which time applicants shall complete and submit to administrators an "Application for Housing Rehabilitation Assistance". (See Attachment B)

Only one (1) application will be authorized per household.

2.6 Self-Help

Whenever possible, applicants and members of the household shall be allowed to contribute their own labor and materials under the supervision of the grant administrator. Examples of these contributions may include painting, basic carpentry, and other appropriate tasks. Self-help arrangements shall be determined on a case-by-case basis and in consultation with the homeowner.

3.0 Property Eligibility

3.1 Unit Characteristics

Owner occupied units located in the designated project area shall be eligible for rehabilitation assistance. Single family units and duplexes are eligible with the exception that applicants living in duplexes must occupy more than fifty (50%) percent of the total space contained in the units. Mobile homes are eligible, except a limit of \$10,000 shall be imposed on mobile home dwellings. Buildings inspected and found to be structurally unsound or badly deteriorated and the rehabilitation cost would exceed the value of the dwellings after rehabilitation will be determined to be not feasible for assistance under the program.

3.2 Target Area

The designated target area for units to be addressed under the HOME program shall be an area located within the corporate limits of the City of Potal.

It is the intent of this program to upgrade housing within the project area. Major categories for improvements include foundation/structural, plumbing, electrical system, roof, and heating and cooling systems. All work shall at a minimum conform to the Southern Standard Housing Codes, and workmanship shall conform to acceptable standards of quality of the respective trades involved.

Any improvements that are necessary for health and safety purposes such as electrical wiring, plumbing systems, heating systems and structural conditions are priority improvements. Energy conservation measures which improve energy efficiency of the units are eligible. Exterior siding, painting and roofing are eligible. All improvements must be physically attached to the dwellings and permanent in nature. Where applicable, improvement will be made to provide increased accessibility to those homeowners with disabilities.

3.4 Historic Buildings

Buildings of historic significance shall be rehabilitated according to the requirements set forth by the Department of Archives and History.

4.0 Grant Amount

4.1 Maximum Assistance

The maximum assistance under the program shall be \$15,000.00. The grant administrators are hereby authorized to approve additional assistance on a case-by-case basis dependant on unforeseen code violations.

This deposit must be made with the City prior to the project being set up in the HUD Financial System and any work commencing on the project.

The City of Petal has coordinated with several local lending institutions which have agreed to make special monies available to the participating homeowners in the form of low interest, long term loans. In any cases requiring change orders and more funds, the already approved loan must be increased to allow a deposit to cover ten percent of the change order amount.

The City of Petal shall not be held responsible for any repayment of said homeowner loans whatsoever for will the City be responsible for any subsequent loan defaults. All loans shall be between the lending institution and the participating homeowner.


5.0 Contracting

- 5.1 All contracts for rehabilitation shall be made between homeowners and contractors (See Attachment C)
- 5.2 The program administrators shall conduct an inspection of approved projects and provide the owner with a list of repairs needed in order to bring the unit up to the Southern Standard Housing and Building Code. It shall be the owner's responsibility to obtain a minimum of two (2) competitive bids on their project. The project administrators shall provide an approved contractors list, prepared with the assistance of the Board of Aldermen, to select from, and the administrators will assist in the bid tabulations. The contract shall be between the property owner and contractor, and the contract should be awarded to the lowest and best bidder unless otherwise approved by the administrators and the Board of Aldermen, and if the owner agrees to offset any difference in bid prices. All work completed must meet the Southern Standard Housing and Building Code along with other codes required by the City of Petal. Inspections will be conducted by the project administrators.

The grant administrator and homeowners will review bids together and the homeowners shall make the final selection of the contractor and award the contract to the responsible bidder that possesses the ability to perform successfully under all material terms and conditions of the bid package and whose bid is lowest in price. Homeowners who select a higher bid shall be responsible for amounts above the lowest bid.

5.3 Contractor Eligibility

To be eligible so bid for rehabilitation contracts in the project, contractors must subrait information to the administrator for review of qualifications. As a minimum, contractors must provide the following: (See Attachment D)



- Three (3) references of contracted work within the previous 12 months, the amount of each contract and the type of quality of work performed under each contract.
- 2. Two (2) credit references, preferably from building material suppliers.
- 3. Certificate of liability insurance and workman's compensation insurance

5.4 Change Orders

All change orders to the bid specifications require the signature of the homeowners, contractors and grant administrator. Approval of change orders shall be made by the grant administrator.

5.5 Payments اهر

Progress payments shall not exceed 80% of the value of the specified work satisfactorily completed.

Contracts under \$3,000; payments shall be made only upon satisfactory completion of all mosts items.

Contracts from \$3,000 to \$6,000; one partial payment may be requested after 50% of work has been satisfactorily completed.

Contracts over \$6,000; two partial payments may be requested. The first payment when a minimum of 40% of the work is satisfactorily completed and the second payment when 80% of the work is satisfactorily completed.

In lieu of a 5% retainer, the contractors will be required to warranty all work against defective workmanship or materials for one year beginning at the date of final inspection and payment.

5.6 Acceptance of Work

The grant administrator shall make interim inspections of the work to ensure that the rehabilitation is performed according to the contracts. These interim inspections shall also be made to verify the progress of the work before progress payments are made. Approval for the final payment for completion of the rehabilitation work shall be made by the grant administrator and homeowners. The local government inspecting official shall make the final decision to accept/reject the completed project on behalf of the City. Copies of inspection reports shall be maintained in project files.

In the event of any disputes between homeowners and contractors, the grant administrator shall work with both parties to negotiate a satisfactory solution. If solutions cannot be worked out, the governing authorities shall be the final authority on when the work has been completed.

6.0 Applications

Applications have been selected continuously throughout the project area Applicant's files shall contain an application for assistance, family survey, verification of ownership, verification of income, lead-based paint hazards notices, work write-ups, contractor bids, contracts, proof of payments, C/MI voucher forms and other HUD required forms and inspection reports.

6.2 Work Write-ups

Work Write-ups shall be made by the grant administrator for applicants determined to be eligible for assistance. The write-ups shall set forth the scope of work to be performed, description of materials to be used and the estimated cost of materials and labor to complete the work.

6.3 Application Rating

Applications for assistance shall be reviewed and ranked according to priority. The priority areas are; (1) very low income households; and, (2) homes most in need of repairs. The approval of all eligible applicants for assistance shall be made by the City authorities.

7.0 Lead-Based Paint

All applicants for assistance under the program shall be notified of the hazards of lead-based paint. Units constructed prior to 1978 shall be inspected for the presence of lead-based paint and if found, acceptable abatement procedures may be undertaken. Documentation of notices and other information pertaining to lead-based paint hazards shall be maintained in the applicants records.

If temporary relocation is required in order to carry out the rehabilitation work, the applicants shall be reimbursed for all out-of-pocket expenses, including reasonable increase in housing cost (rent and utility cost) incurred in the move.

9.0 Residential Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan

The City shall prepare an Antidisplacement and Relocation Assistance Plan and provide a copy to each applicant.

10.0 HOME Cash and Management Information (C/MI) System

The City shall designate a contact person and one alternate who will be authorized to access the HOME C/MI System to set up projects and one person and alternate who will be authorized to access the HOME C/MI System to request draw-down of funds.

Project set-up reports will be submitted to the HOME C/MI System within 12 calendar days after the project is called in to the HOME C/MI System. A copy of the set-up reports will be submitted to the Community Services Division (CSD) at the same time.

Each time the HOME C/MI System is accessed to request draw-down of funds, a prenumbered Payment Certification will be maintained on file. A copy of each Payment Certification will be submitted to CSD within 12 calendar days after the request for funds has been made. Fax transmittals are acceptable.

Within 120 days of the final draw-down of funds on projects, the rehabilitation project completion reports will be submitted to the HOME C/MI System and copies submitted to CSD.
