

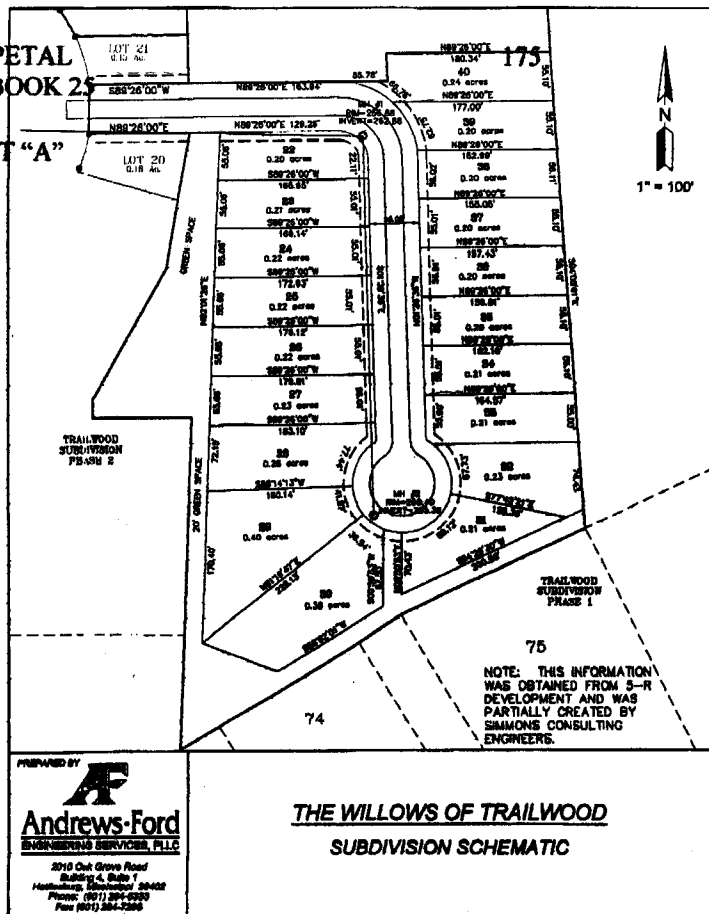

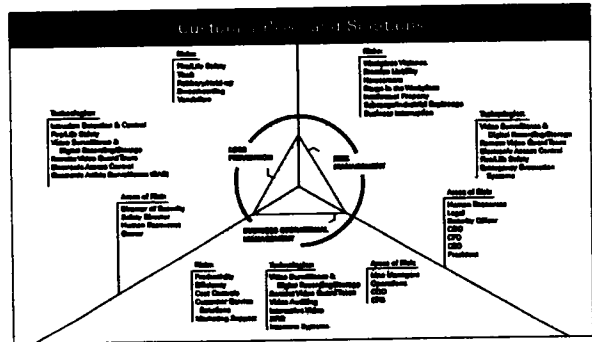

PURSUANT TO §503.01 of Ordinance No. 1991 (75), and pursuant to the provisions of  
§17-1-23 and §17-1-25 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, said Ordinance is amended  
as follows, to wit:

**Statement of Fact and Purpose:**

At the regularly conducted meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of  
Petal, Mississippi, on November 1, 2005, there was a discussion between the Mayor and  
the Board of Aldermen concerning amendment to the city's subdivision regulations in  
order to provide for curb and gutter requirements, and to provide sidewalk requirements.  
The Mayor and Board of Aldermen having received from the City of Petal Planning  
Commission, their recommendation, that said Ordinance be amended, said Ordinance is  
amended as follows, to wit:

**413. Curb and Gutter Requirements**

Curbs, gutters and storm sewers shall be required for the purpose of drainage, safety,  
delineation and protection of pavement edge in all proposed subdivisions submitted to the  
Planning Commission and the Board of Aldermen for approval following the effective  
date as indicated above.

413.01 Curbs, gutter and storm sewers shall be designed and installed in accordance with  
acceptable engineering practices in the State of Mississippi.

413.02 This requirement may be waived and shoulders and/or drainage swales used when it can  
be shown that:

- a. Shoulders are require by state regulation;
- b. Soil or topography make the use of shoulder and/or drainage swales  
preferable;
- c. It is in the best interest of the proposed community to preserve its rural  
character by using shoulders and/or drainage swales instead of curbs;
- d. The developer demonstrates to the Planning Commission and Board of  
Aldermen that stormwater management, and sediment and erosion control  
can be effectively accomplished through the use of shoulders and/or drainage  
swales. This demonstration of effectiveness shall be accompanied by a post-  
construction stormwater management plan that demonstrates that the post-  
construction conditions in the development are sufficient to effectively  
manage stormwater, sediment transfer and erosion. The developer shall  
submit to the City for approval a post-construction stormwater management  
plan to include the following elements:
  - i. A detailed description of all post-construction best management  
practices (BMP's) to be incorporated into the subdivision.  
Detailed drawings and maintenance plans for all post-  
construction BMP's to include the signatures and seal of a  
Professional Civil Engineer registered in the State of Mississippi.
  - ii. A graphic description of the anticipated post-construction  
drainage patterns of the development to include the anticipated  
drainage coefficients, identification of receiving streams or water  
bodies, and an indication of potential modifications to  
preconstruction drainage patterns or conditions.

**414. Sidewalk Requirements**

414.01 The Planning Commission may require sidewalks in any situation where proximity of the  
proposed subdivision to future or existing neighborhood businesses, schools, community  
facilities, or other pedestrian traffic generators suggests sidewalks will be needed.

414.02 The Planning Commission may require sidewalks along all regional arterials, suburban  
arterials and primary collector streets as identified in the City of Petal Comprehensive  
Plan.

414.02 Sidewalk requirements may be waived under the following conditions:

- a. Where the topography is such that the installation of sidewalks would be  
impractical;
- b. Where the installation of sidewalks would be hazardous to pedestrians  
because of grade;




