# CITY OF PETAL ORDINANCE 2005 MINIUE BOOK 25

AN ORDIANANCE PROHIBITING THE ERECTION DIPOLETY ARDS, OR OTHER OUTDOOR ADVERTISING DEVICES, REQUIRING THE REMOVAL OF AN EXISTING OUTDOOR ADVERTISING DEVICES WITHIN A PERIOD OF SEVEN (7) YEARS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

## Section 1:

No billboards or outdoor advertising devices, as described in 49-23-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 or of a similar nature, shall be permitted, constructed, or built within the limits of the City of Petal, Mississippi.

### Section 2:

All existing billboards or outdoor advertising devices, including but not limited to those described in 49-23-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 and all structures pertaining thereto, and appurtenances thereunto, belonging shall be removed from the City of Petal, Mississippi, within seven (7) years from the effective date of this Ordinance.

### Section 3:

Any person, firm, corporation, or other legal entity visitating the terms and provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to fine not exceeding one thousand (\$1,000.00) tollars.

## Section 4:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days from and after its passage.

### Section 5:

# CITY OF PETAL ORDINANCE 2005 WINDER BOOK 25

AN ORDIANANCE PROHIBITING THE ERECTION AND ARDS, OR OTHER OUTDOOR ADVERTISING DEVICES, REQUIRING THE REMOVAL OF ALL EXISTING OUTDOOR ADVERTISING DEVICES WITHIN A PERIOD OF SEVEN (7) YEARS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

## Section 1:

o billboards or outdoor advertising devices, as described in 49-23-5 of the Mississippi ode of 1972 or of a similar nature, shall be permitted, constructed, or built within the imits of the City of Petal, Mississippi.

## Section 2:

All existing billboards or outdoor advertising devices, including but not limited to those described in 49-23-5 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 and all structures pertaining thereto, and appurtenances thereunto, belonging shall be removed from the City of Petal, Mississippi, within seven (7) years from the effective date of this Ordinance.

## Section 3:

Any person, firm, corporation, or other legal entity violating the terms and provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be subject to fine not exceeding one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars.

### Section 4:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days from and after its passage.
