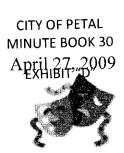

Beginning Monday July 20, 2009 and ending Sunday Sept. 20<sup>th</sup> for auditions, rehearsals and production of "Catfish Moon", staging Sept. 10-12 and 17-19, 2009.

Beginning Monday Sept. 28, 2009 and ending Sunday Nov. 13th for auditions, rehearsals and production of "A Tuna Christmas", staging Nov. 5-7 and 10-12, 2009.

Beginning Monday Jan. 4, 2010 and ending Sunday March 14th for auditions, rehearsals and production of "Death and Deceit on the Nile", staging March 4-6 and 11-13, 2010.

Beginning Saturday April 24, 2010 and ending Monday June 28<sup>th</sup> for auditions, rehearsals and production of our annual children's show, TBA, which supports our obligation to the Civitan Camp for Kids. The kids show dates are approximate because directors and show titles are not chosen until March before the production.

JORT will also have year round use of the storage facilities inside the Cultural Center for furniture, props and costumes, with only designated persons on the JORT board and/or designated directors having access to said storage.

Just Over the Rainbow Theatre, Inc. currently carries a one million dollar insurance policy which includes liability for facilities, patrons and volunteers.

JORT will pay rental fees to the city for the exclusive use of the Cultural Center as per our original discussion and verbal agreement in Feb. 2008 as follows:

Season 2009-2010, beginning on or about August 1st, at \$400 per month.

Season 2010-2011, at \$500 per month and beginning with Season 2011-2012, rent to be capped at \$600 per month.
