

SPECIFICATIONS: GENERATOR SET

a) It is the intent of this specification to secure an engine driven generator set that has been prototype tested, factory built, production tested, and site tested, together with all accessories necessary for a complete instalation as specified herein. All equipment shall be new and of current production by an international firm which manufactures the generator set and controls. Wring, automatic transfer switch, concrete foundation, coordination with the utility provider, and any other related or necessary work to produce a stand alone back up power system shall be included in the bid.

a) It is the intent of this specification to secure a generator set system that has been tested during design verification, production and at the final job site. The generator set will be of the lasted commercial design and will be complete with all of the necessary accessories for complete installation as shown on the plans, drawings, and specifications herein. The equipment supplied and installed shall meet the requirements of the National Electrical Code, along with all applicable local codes and regulations.
