A RESOLUTION TO REQUEST THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' APPROVAL TO ENTER INTO AN SUBRECIPIENT AGREEMENT WITH HENRY COUNTY WATER AUTHORITHY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$8,300,000 UTILIZING ARPA FUNDING FOR WATER AND SEWER INFRASTRUTURE IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, On June 2, 2021, Henry County Board of Commissioners approved Resolution 21-181 to accept the U.S. Department of Treasury American Rescue Plan State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (ARP-FRF) allocated to Henry County in the amount of \$45,560,764 American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 on March 2021. The County has developed a preliminary ARPA plan which considers distribution of funds toward capital projects, non-profits, household assistance, small businesses, and more. Its vision is to have the ARPA funds yield a transformative impact on the country; and

WHEREAS, ARP-FRF funds are intended to provide support to state, territorial, local, and tribal governments in responding to the economic and public health impacts of COVID-19 and in their efforts to contain its impact on their communities, residents, and businesses. And make necessary investments in water, sewer or broadband infrastructure: and

WHEREAS, the allowable uses outlined in the ARPA include, but are not limited to: (1) responding to or mitigating the public health emergency with respect to the COVID-19 emergency or its negative economic impacts; (2) providing government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue; (3) make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure; responding to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers of the County that are performing such essential work, or by providing grants to eligible employers that have; and

WHEREAS, Henry County Water Authority has committed to the completion of projects listed in the revised proposal (Exhibits A & B in the amount of \$15,364,793) and;

WHEREAS, any expenses beyond the proposed amounts listed in Exhibits A & B shall be at the expense of the Henry County Water Authority, with a completion date of December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, Henry County has proposed to award \$8.3M to the Walnut Creek Reclamation Facility Expansion where all other costs will be covered by other funding sources; and (Exhibit C)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners does hereby accept and approve the subrecipient agreement and list of project recommendations attached hereto as Exhibits C and by this reference incorporated herein, is approved and payable to Henry County Water Authority for the amount not to exceed the recommended award amount and the Chair of the Board of Commissioners or the County Manager are authorized to sign the associated documents.

1. Walnut Creek Water Reclamation Facility Expansion

Project Summary

This project is to expand the existing Walnut Creek Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) from a treatment capacity of 8 million gallons per day (MGD) to 14 MGD. This will be accomplished by constructing a new 6 MGD advanced membrane biological reactor (MBR) wastewater treatment plant adjacent to the existing 8 MGD land application system (LAS) treatment plant.

The Walnut Creek WRF service area includes approximately 55-percent of Henry County and is bound by Panola Road on the north side of the service area, Highway 81 on the south side of the service area, and the county line on the east and west sides of the service area, excluding the City of McDonough, GA and City of Stockbridge, GA service areas.

The existing Walnut Creek WRF is operating at 80-percent capacity. This project will provide additional sanitary sewer treatment capacity to more than 50-percent of Henry County's population and allow Henry County to continue to develop and maintain economic stability for its residents.

Henry County Water Authority needs to expand their Walnut Creek Water Reclamation Facility so they can continue to provide reliable sanitary sewer treatment service to their residential and commercial customers in Henry County, Georgia. The Walnut Creek WRF is currently operating at more than 80-percent capacity and is in the need of expansion.
