Council Member **Fritz**, supported by Council Member **Brugger**, moved the adoption of the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 19-08

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE III, SECTION 40-304.B OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GRAND HAVEN RELATED TO BACKYARD CHICKENS

THE CITY OF GRAND HAVEN ORDAINS:

Section 1. Number of Chickens. Chapter 40, Article III, Section 40-304.B.3 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Grand Haven, is amended to read as follows:

3. The maximum number of chickens permitted per property shall be six (6). Roosters are prohibited.

Section 2. Enclosure Size. Chapter 40, Article III, Section 40-304.B.6 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Grand Haven, is amended to read as follows:

6. All areas accessible to the chickens, including the coop and run, shall be contained in a single structure not to exceed sixty (60) square feet in footprint and eight (8) feet in height measured from the grade. The minimum run size per chicken shall be eight (8) square feet.

Section 3. Renewal Permit. Chapter 40, Article III, Section 40-304.B.14 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Grand Haven, is amended to read as follows:

14. An initial backyard chicken permit shall be valid for three (3) years from the date of issuance. A renewal backyard chicken permit shall be valid for three (3) years from the date of issuance.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect on the twentieth (20th) day after publication, or such later date as is required by Public Act 110 of 2006, as amended.
