ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY BROWARD COUNTY, COMMISSIONERS OF FLORIDA. **PERTAINING** DESIGNATION OF TO URBAN WILDERNESS AREAS; AMENDING SECTIONS 25½-83, AND 25½-88 OF THE **BROWARD** COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE") TO ADD LANDS **FOUR** ADDITIONAL TO PREVIOUSLY DESIGNATED URBAN WILDERNESS AREAS; CREATING ARTICLES XVI THROUGH XXV OF CHAPTER 251/2 OF **DESIGNATE** CODE TO TEN (10)WILDERNESS AREAS: PROVIDING AND SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

(Sponsored by the Board of County Commissioners)

WHEREAS, Broward County has obtained ten (10) sites being proposed for designation as Urban Wilderness Areas within the Urban Wilderness Park System, known as Carpenter House Wilderness Area, Crescent Trail Wilderness Area, Deerfield Highlands Wilderness Area, Helene Klein Wilderness Area, Herman and Dorothy Shooster Wilderness Area, Highlands Scrub Wilderness Area, Pine Island Ridge Additions I and II Wilderness Area, Sands Parcel Wilderness Area, Saw Palmetto Wilderness Area, and West Creek Wilderness Area;

WHEREAS, Broward County has obtained parcels adjacent to four (4) previously designated Urban Wilderness Park System properties, known as Secret Woods Wilderness Area, Hillsboro Pineland Wilderness Area, Sheridan Street Wilderness Area, and Miramar Pineland Wilderness Area;

WHEREAS, the proposed sites and additional parcels comprise a combined total of 213.69 acres that, if approved, would bring the total acreage of designated Urban Wilderness Areas to 881.25;

WHEREAS, Chapter 25½, Article II, Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code"), provides for the designation of wilderness areas within the Urban Wilderness Park System by ordinance, including a legal description, a dedication as a wilderness area, a designation of the type(s) of wilderness area being established, a general statement of preservation, and a statement of the management responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Urban Wilderness Advisory Board and the Broward County Parks and Recreation Division recommend that these new sites and additional parcels be designated as Urban Wilderness Areas,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 25½-38 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 25½-105. Type of wilderness area and statement of preservation.

The Carpenter House Wilderness Area falls within all three (3) wilderness area types: biological, aesthetic, and scientific. Establishing the site as a wilderness area will implement the maintenance criteria necessary for preservation. The Carpenter House Wilderness Area contains a house built in the 1940s and a small area of dune ecosystem that transitions from coastal strand into impacted maritime hammock with low species diversity. Interior and exterior renovations of the house and conversion of the pool into a sea turtle pool have been completed, allowing for the house and pool to operate as a marine environmental education center. A 30-foot right-of-way located on the east side of the project site is managed by Broward County Parks and Recreation Division, and this area completes the transition of the dune ecosystem to the beach. The preservation of this site will allow a unique opportunity for research and the enjoyment of Broward County citizens who take advantage of the interpretative opportunities.

Sec. 25½-106. Management responsibilities.

The Broward County Parks and Recreation Division shall have responsibility for management of the Carpenter House Wilderness Area. Such management shall be directed to the preservation of the site as a wilderness area and shall be consistent with the rules and regulations governing the use of the area promulgated by the Urban Wilderness Advisory Board and adopted by the Board of County Commissioners pursuant to Section 25½-22(a)(4), Broward County Code of Ordinances.

ARTICLE XVII. CRESCENT TRAIL WILDERNESS AREA

Sec. 25½-107. Establishment of wilderness area.

The Crescent Trail Wilderness Area, located in Broward County, Florida, is hereby established as a wilderness area pursuant to Section 25½-29, Broward County Code of Ordinances.

Sec. 25½-108. Legal description.

The legal description of the Crescent Trail Wilderness Area is as follows:

Parcel "B" of COCONUT POINT, as recorded in Plat Book 164, page 27, of the Public Records of Broward County, Florida.

Said lands lying in the City of Coconut Creek, Broward County, Florida, containing 7.09 acres, more or less.

Sec. 25½-109. Dedication as wilderness area.

Broward County's interest in the Crescent Trail Wilderness Area as fee simple owner of the above-described real property is hereby dedicated to the public purpose of establishing and maintaining a wilderness area consistent with the provisions of this article.

Sec. 25½-110. Type of wilderness area and statement of preservation.

The Crescent Trail Wilderness Area falls within all three (3) wilderness area types: biological, aesthetic, and scientific. Establishing the site as a wilderness area will implement the maintenance criteria necessary for preservation. This site is a mix of oak and pine trees with a healthy cypress dome. A number of large exotic species, including Australian pine and Brazilian pepper, were removed, and the site is being managed to prevent regrowth. The preservation of this site will allow a unique opportunity for research and the enjoyment of Broward County citizens who take advantage of the interpretative opportunities.

The Broward County Parks and Recreation Division shall have responsibility for management of the Crescent Trail Wilderness Area. Such management shall be directed to the preservation of the site as a wilderness area and shall be consistent with the rules and regulations governing the use of the area promulgated by the Urban Wilderness Advisory Board and adopted by the Board of County Commissioners pursuant

Section 25½-22(a)(4), Broward County Code of Ordinances.

ARTICLE XVIII. DEERFIELD HIGHLANDS WILDERNESS AREA

Sec. 25½-112. Establishment of wilderness area.

The Deerfield Highlands Wilderness Area, located in Broward County, Florida, is hereby established as a wilderness area pursuant to Section 25½-29, Broward County Code of Ordinances.

The Deerfield Highlands Wilderness Area falls within all three (3) wilderness area types: biological, aesthetic, and scientific. Establishing the site as a wilderness area will implement the maintenance criteria necessary for preservation. This site is classified as a disturbed sand pine scrub community with restoration potential. The site has a scattering of sand pines, small oak clusters, and a number of pawpaw shrubs. Scrub is situated in dry sandy areas that are often located on ancient sand dune formations and some scrub represents the oldest natural plant communities in Florida. This scrub habitat contains a high number of plant and animal species that are endemic, meaning they are only found in Florida scrub habitats. The preservation of this site will allow a unique opportunity for research and the enjoyment of Broward County citizens who take advantage of the interpretative opportunities.

If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 7. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary in order to accomplish such intention.
