## ORDINANCE NO. 2024-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO TREE REMOVAL LICENSES AND THE TREE PRESERVATION TRUST FUND ("TREE TRUST"); AMENDING SECTION 27-408 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE") PROVIDING FOR TREE REMOVAL LICENSE WAIVERS FOR AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROJECTS; AMENDING SECTION 27-413 OF THE CODE AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF MONIES IN THE TREE TRUST FOR SPECIFIED PURPOSES; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Section 27-408 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 27-408. Tree removal license requirements and standards.

- (a) License Requirements:
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  - (3) Exemptions from Licensing: Unless otherwise prohibited by the Code, as amended, the following activities are exempt from the licensing requirements of this Aarticle, provided that no nuisance or any condition that adversely affects the environment or public health is created, and

Maintenance expenses, including maintenance equipment and vehicles, used to encourage the growth of the tree canopy for existing trees located on sites operated by the Broward County Parks and Recreation Division and planted pursuant to a distribution made from the Broward County Tree Preservation Trust Fund.

Ancillary costs shall not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the cost of the particular tree planting project, and shall include landscape design services, irrigation, additional landscaping, and any other items or materials necessary for the proper installation and maintenance of tree planting projects. These monies may also be used to cover the expense of relocation of relocating trees to public lands in Broward County and the expense of periodically distributing saplings to the public to increase tree canopy coverage in Broward County.

## Section 3. Severability.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any court to be invalid, the invalid portion will be stricken, and such striking will not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any court determines that this Ordinance, in whole or in part, cannot be legally applied to any individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance, such determination will not affect the applicability of this Ordinance to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 4. Inclusion in the Broward County Code of Ordinances.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance become part of the Broward County Code of Ordinances as of the effective date. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase to the extent necessary to accomplish such intention.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance is effective as of the date provided by law.
