7	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Broward County, Florida
8	desires to amend sections of the Broward County Code of Ordinances, to change
9	nomenclature inconsistencies and the fee structure for off-airport motor vehicle renta
10	operations from the number of contracts secured to a percentage of gross revenues,

12	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF
13	BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

15	Section 1. Section 2-111 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Sec. 2-111. Off-airport motor vehicle operations operators.
18	(a) Off-Airport Motor Vehicle Rental Operations (Off-Rac) <u>Operators</u>
19	("OFFRACs") shall mean a persons or entities that operate motor vehicle renta
20	business <u>es</u> or service <u>s</u> that do es not have a concession agreement with the County and
21	desires to solicit customers for its $\underline{\text{their}}$ motor vehicle rental business $\underline{\text{es}}$ or $\underline{\text{service}}$ a
22	the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport ("Airport").
23	(b) No person OFFRAC shall engage in Off-RAC operations or any motor
24	vehicle rental business or any services pertaining to such any motor vehicle rental

Section 2. Section 2-112 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-112. Applications; permit and term of permit.

(a) Any person OFFRAC desiring to engage in Off-Rac operations at any motor vehicle rental business or any service pertaining to any motor vehicle rental business on any part of the Airport shall make application in writing to the Department prior to conducting any such activities or operations at the Airport. Such application shall be on a form provided by the Department.

Section 3. Section 2-114 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-114. Payment of fees and accounting.

(a) Each permittee OFFRAC authorized to operate or conduct activities as set forth herein shall furnish to the Department, by the fifteenth (15th) calendar day of each

month for the preceding month's operations and activities, a statement certified by one of its officers stating the <u>Gross Revenues</u>, as defined in <u>Section 39.2.k.2</u>. of the <u>Broward County Administrative Code</u>, and the number of motor vehicle rental contracts secured through <u>permittee's the OFFRAC's</u> operation at the Airport during the prior month. Payment for the preceding month in the amount required by Section 2-113 shall be remitted to the Department with each monthly statement.

- (b) Each permittee OFFRAC shall make his-or-her its books and financial records available for audit by the County upon reasonable notice and at reasonable times. If such books and financial records are kept at a location or locations other than Broward County, Florida, they shall be brought to a location convenient to the auditors for the County in order for the County to conduct an audit. To facilitate such audit, each permittee OFFRAC shall keep accurate records of its operations at the Airport and shall retain receipts from all business conducted at the Airport. Each permittee OFFRAC shall issue an invoice or receipt, serially numbered, with each transaction at the Airport. All books and records customarily used in this type of operation, and as may from time to time be required by the County, shall also be kept and maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. The books and records referred to above shall be retained for at least three (3) years following the end of permittee's the OFFRAC's fiscal year and shall be subject to audit.
- (c) Each permittee OFFRAC shall provide a special annual report to the Department setting forth all revenues derived from permittee's the OFFRAC's operations at the Airport. Such annual report shall be prepared by the chief financial officer when payments made by the permittee OFFRAC are less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) during the term of the permit, or a special report shall be

prepared by a certified public accountant in accordance with the provisions of the Codification of Statements on Auditing Standards when the payments are twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) or more during the term of the permit. The special report shall be filed with the Department within ninety (90) days following each annual period of the permit, and within ninety (90) days after the permit expires or is terminated and shall include the following:

Section 4. Section 2-115 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-115. Insurance requirements.

- (a) Each permittee OFFRAC shall, at a minimum, provide, pay for, and maintain in force at all times during the term of the permit authorized herein, the insurance coverages as required by the Broward County Risk Management Division ("Risk Management"). Such required insurance coverages may be modified from time to time by Risk Management.
- (b) Each permittee OFFRAC shall furnish to the Department Certificates of Insurance or endorsements evidencing the insurance coverages required by Risk Management. The required Certificate of Insurance shall name the types, terms, and limits of liability provided.
- (c) Coverage is not to cease and is to remain in force (subject to cancellation notice) during the term of any permit issued hereunder. All policies must be endorsed to provide County with at least thirty (30) calendar days' notice of cancellation and/or restriction. If any of the insurance coverages will expire prior to the termination of

permittee's the OFFRAC's permit, copies of renewal policies shall be furnished at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the date of their expiration.

Section 5. Section 2-116 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-116. Rules and regulations.

The County Administrator shall establish rules and regulations governing the privilege of engaging in <u>business</u> or conducting <u>Off-Rac</u> operations <u>by OFFRACs</u> at the Airport. Such rules and regulations may add to or supplement the requirements of this Division 5 and may be amended from time to time as deemed necessary by the County Administrator.

Section 6. Section 2-117 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2-117. Compliance with laws and regulations; violations, termination or revocation.

(a) Any person OFFRAC engaged in Off-Rac any off-Airport motor vehicle rental business or operations at the Airport shall obtain all appropriate licenses and permits, shall obey all applicable federal, state, County, and local laws, codes, ordinances, rules, and regulations now in effect or which may become effective during the term of such the permit issued pursuant to this Division 5. In the case of an inconsistency between the laws and the rules and regulations identified in this section and the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to Section 2-116 herein, the rules

 and regulations promulgated pursuant to Section 2-116 shall govern unless superseded by the conflicting provisions.

- (b) The permission Any permit granted under this Division 5 to any permittee OFFRAC may be terminated or revoked by the Aviation Director for any one (1) of the following reasons:
 - (1) Violation of any provision or restriction of the <u>such</u> permit authorizing engaging in the motor vehicle rental business or service at the Airport; or
 - (2) Any action or series of actions by the permittee OFFRAC, or its employees, agents, or representatives that adversely affects the safety of the public; or
 - (3) Discovery of fraud or misrepresentation in the application for a permit; or
 - (4) Failure to make timely payments as required by Chapter 39 of the Broward County Administrative Code, and in accordance with Section 2-114 herein; or
 - (5) The violation of any of the terms and conditions of this Division 5, or any rules, ordinances, regulations, or operational guidelines promulgated by the County or the Aviation Director with respect to engaging in Off-Rac off-Airport motor vehicle rental business or operations at the Airport.
- (c) Upon notification of the <u>denial</u>, termination, or revocation of a permit by the Department, the applicant or <u>permit holder OFFRAC</u> may request a hearing before a hearing officer, who shall be an attorney in good standing of <u>t</u>he Florida Bar, by providing notice of such request to the Office of the County Attorney, by certified mail, return receipt requested, within fifteen (15) business days of notification of such denial or revocation. The Office of the County Attorney is authorized, within fifteen (15)

business days of receipt of the request for hearing, to submit a copy of the application for permit or revocation and a statement as to the reason or reasons for such denial or revocation to a hearing officer to be appointed by the Board for a determination of the validity of the denial or revocation. A copy shall also be provided to the applicant or permit holder OFFRAC in accordance with County policy; and

- (1) The hearing shall be held within ten (10) business days from the receipt by the hearing officer of the material submitted by the Office of the County Attorney.
- (2) The parties to the proceeding shall be the applicant or permit-holder OFFRAC and the Aviation Director, or his or her designee. The Aviation Director, or his or her designee, shall be represented by the Office of the County Attorney. At the hearing, the applicant or permit holder OFFRAC may be represented by counsel.
- (3) The hearing officer shall issue a notice of hearing, which shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the parties and the Office of the County Attorney, and such notice of hearing shall contain the date, time, and place of the hearing.
- (4) Testimony shall be taken upon oath or affirmation, and evidence applicable to the quasi-judicial proceedings shall govern. The testimony of witnesses shall be taken first in support of the denial or revocation of the permit. The parties may testify and present witnesses on their behalf. A court reporter shall make a record of the proceeding. A record shall be kept of all evidence received or considered in addition to the oral testimony. The cost of the court reporter shall be shared equally by the

County and the applicant or permit holder OFFRAC. In addition to sharing the cost of the court reporter, in the event the applicant or permit holder OFFRAC is the non-prevailing nonprevailing party, the County shall be entitled to its administrative costs, which costs shall be determined from evidence presented by the County.

Section 7. SEVERABILITY.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any Court to be invalid, the invalid portion shall be stricken, and such striking shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any Court determines that this Ordinance, or any portion hereof, cannot be legally applied to any individual(s), group(s), entity(ies), property(ies), or circumstance(s), such determination shall not affect the applicability hereof to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

Section 8. INCLUSION IN CODE.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Broward County Code; and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.
