4	SECTIONS 4-10 AND 4-11 OF THE BROWARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES ("CODE"), ESTABLISHING TIMEFRAMES FOR LICENSED VETERINARIANS TO REMIT RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATES TO BROWARD COUNTY AND FOR PET OWNERS TO OBTAIN RABIES REGISTRATION TAGS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (Sponsored by Commissioner Chip LaMarca, Mayor Beam Furr, and Commission Nan H. Rich)		
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9 10	WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VIII, Section 1, of The Florida Constitution, and		
11	Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, Broward County is authorized to protect the public		
12	health, safety, and welfare of its residents and has the power and authority to enact		
13	regulations for valid governmental purposes that are not inconsistent with general of special law; and		
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15	WHEREAS, Section 828.30, Florida Statutes, specifically authorizes the County		
16	to enact ordinances relating to animal care and rabies control; and		
17	WHEREAS, Chapter 4 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances ("Code"		
18	requires that all dogs and cats, four (4) months of age or older, in Broward County must be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian and must maintain a current rabies registration tag; and WHEREAS, very often dogs and cats are vaccinated for rabies by a licensed veterinarian, but the rabies certificates are not expeditiously provided to the Broward		
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WHEREAS, Section 828.30(3), Florida Statutes, states that, upon vaccination
 against rabies, the licensed veterinarian shall provide the animal's owner and the animal
 control authority with a rabies vaccination certificate; and

WHEREAS, rabies vaccination certificates provide quick access to pet owner
information and rabies vaccination status, which is critical in the event of a bite, scratch,
or rabies exposure incident with an animal; and

7 WHEREAS, Section 4-11 of the Code requires owners of dogs and cats that are
8 over four (4) months of age to have their pets registered with Broward County, obtain
9 rabies registration tag(s), and keep the rabies registration tags current; and

WHEREAS, Sections 828.30, Florida Statutes, and 4-11 of the Code do not
currently establish timeframes within which veterinarians and pet owners must comply
with the applicable requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County of County Commissioners Board deems it in the
best interest of the citizens of Broward County to establish timeframes for licensed
veterinarians who administer rabies vaccinations to provide rabies vaccination
certificates to Broward County, and for pet owners to obtain rabies registration tags,

17 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF18 BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

19 Section 1. Section 4-10 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby20 amended to read as follows:

21 Sec. 4-10. Rabies vaccination required for dogs, cats, and ferrets.

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(c) Evidence of a rabies vaccination shall consist of a fully completed rabies
vaccination certificate, in conformance with Florida Statutes, in a format provided by the

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1	Division, and	d signed by the veterinarian administering the vaccine. One (1) copy of the	
2	certificate shall be retained by the veterinarian for at least one (1) year after the		
3	vaccination expires, and the other copies shall be distributed to the owner and to the		
4	Division. In the event a rabies registration tag is not provided or a pet owner declines to		
5	purchase a rabies registration tag from the veterinarian pursuant to Section 4-11, the		
6	veterinarian shall write "NOT APPLICABLE" in the space on the rabies vaccination		
7	certificate where the pet license number is normally entered, prior to delivering the		
8	certificate to the Division. All veterinarians shall deliver completed rabies vaccination		
9	certificates to the Division as follows:		
10	<u>(1)</u>	Electronic submissions. Veterinarians may electronically submit monthly	
11		rabies vaccination data to the Division for each dog or cat vaccinated in	
12		the previous month, including the veterinarian's actual signature or	
13		signature stamp. Electronic rabies certificate data from the previous	
14		month shall be sent to the Division no later than the tenth (10th) day of the	
15		month following the date when the vaccination was administered.	
16	<u>(2)</u>	Physical submissions. In lieu of electronically submitting monthly rabies	
17		vaccination certificates, veterinarians shall deliver to the Division, on a	
18		monthly basis, the completed rabies vaccination certificate for each dog or	
19		cat vaccinated the previous month. Said certificates shall be postmarked	
20		no later than the tenth (10th) day of the month following the date when the	
21		vaccination was administered.	
22	<u>(3)</u>	Violations. Any Broward County veterinarian who fails to deliver rabies	
23		vaccination certificates to the Division as prescribed in the methods above	
24		shall be deemed to be in violation of this section and may be issued a	
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citation and subject to a civil penalty in an amount set by resolution of the Commission. Upon written request, the Director or the Director's designee may grant a submission extension not to exceed thirty (30) days from the original due date.

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6 Section 2. Section 4-11 of the Broward County Code of Ordinances is hereby7 amended to read as follows:

8 Sec. 4-11. Registration of dogs and cats.

9 Any person owner who owns or keeps, in Broward County who owns or (a) keeps, a dog or cat four (4) months of age or older shall have such dog or cat registered 10 11 by and in Broward County and shall obtain and keep a current rabies registration 12 license tag. The Division shall provide suitable dog and cat rabies registration licenses 13 tags for sale through veterinarians providing services in Broward County, authorized 14 representatives, or through the Division. Each owner of a dog or cat shall obtain a 15 Broward County rabies registration tag within thirty (30) days after the dog or cat has 16 been vaccinated against rabies. A separate rabies registration license tag shall be 17 issued for each dog or cat, and a rabies registration license tag issued for one (1) dog 18 or one (1) cat is not valid for any other dog or cat. Failure to obtain the rabies 19 registration tag within the timeframe provided herein shall be a violation of this section, 20 and the owner of the dog or cat may be issued a citation and subject to a civil penalty in 21 an amount set by resolution of the Commission.

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(c) The rabies registration license tag required by this section shall be
renewed annually by the owner of the dog or cat, by paying the applicable fee, and by

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providing documentation that said dog or cat has a current rabies vaccination or is
 exempt from such vaccination under the terms of this chapter.

3 (d) The Commission shall establish by resolution the fees to be charged for 4 rabies registration licenses tags. This may include discount fees for sterilized dogs or 5 cats. Any such discount shall be allowed only upon presentation of a certificate of 6 sterilization signed by a veterinarian licensed in any state or other documentation of 7 the dog's or cat's inability to reproduce, or upon presentation of proof of prior issuance 8 of a rabies registration license tag for the dog or cat at a similarly discounted fee. 9 Dogs and cats that are sterilized and vaccinated in connection with County programs to encourage sterilization may also be eligible for a discount rabies registration license 10 tag fee. The Division shall provide free rabies registration licenses tags to all 11 12 individuals with disabilities for animals that the Division has recognized as official 13 service animals. The Director shall establish the guidelines for approving and denying 14 free or discounted rabies registration licenses tags. The fees collected for rabies 15 registration license tag sales, over the baseline of one hundred thousand (100,000) 16 licenses tags per year, shall be deposited in the Animal Care Sterilization Trust Fund 17 to be used for sterilization programs, as determined by the Director.

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Section 3. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>.

If any portion of this Ordinance is determined by any Court to be invalid, the invalid portion shall be stricken, and such striking shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance. If any Court determines that this Ordinance, or any portion hereof, cannot be legally applied to any individual(s), group(s), entity(ies), property(ies),

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or circumstance(s), such determination shall not affect the applicability hereof to any
 other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

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Section 4. INCLUSION IN CODE.

It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners that the provisions of
this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Broward County Code; and that
the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word
"ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or such other appropriate word or
phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

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Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall become effective as provided by law.
