ORDINANCE NO. 2012-13

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DAYTONA BEACH SHORES, FLORIDA REGULATING AND PROHIBITING THE SALE, DISPLAY, DELIVERY AND POSSESSION OF VARIOUS SYNTHETIC DRUGS AS DEFINED IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR REQUIRED WARNINGS AND LABELING ON PACKAGING; PROVIDING FOR RELATIONSHIP TO CONTROLLING FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS PROVISION; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTING ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Daytona Beach Shores has encountered products being sold at commercial businesses within or near to its corporate/municipal boundaries containing compounds originally designed as synthetic alternatives (i.e., synthetic cannabinoids/marijuana, synthetic stimulants and/or synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogens) to prohibited controlled substances such as tetrachydrocannabinol (THC), cathinone, methcathinone, MDMA/Ecstasy (3,4-methylenedioxymethamphetamine)) and MDEA (an analog of MDMA); and

WHEREAS, synthetic cannabinoids (also known as "K2" or "Spice") are chemically engineered substances, similar to THC - the active ingredient in marijuana—that, when smoked or ingested, can produce a high similar to marijuana and synthetic cannabinoids have been developed over the last 30 years for research purposes to investigate the cannabinoid system, but no legitimate non-research uses have been identified for synthetic cannabinoids and they have not been approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for human consumption; and

WHEREAS, synthetic cannabinoids, commonly known as synthetic marijuana, are chemically engineered substances that can produce an effect similar to marijuana when smoked and ingested; and

WHEREAS, substituted cathinones, commonly called "bath salts", and other synthetic drugs are being manufactured, sold and used for their psychoactive properties which may cause serious injury with "bath salts" being synthetic substitutes that mimic the pharmacological effects of amphetamines, cocaine, ecstasy and other illegal drugs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Daytona Beach Shores finds that products containing these synthetic alternatives may be purchased for recreational use currently as an alternative to otherwise regulated controlled substances banned at the local, State and Federal levels; and

WHEREAS, the City of Daytona Beach Shores finds that products containing these synthetic alternatives are particularly enticing to children and young adults due to their availability in small packages, sometimes appearing as a candy, at neighborhood stores at minimal costs, as well as due to names being given to these substances which are intended to

appeal to children and young adults said products being partially listed as set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and as otherwise defined herein; and

WHEREAS, under the guise of herbal incense and like devices, products are being sold at commercial businesses that contain chemical compounds designed as synthetic alternatives to controlled substances which are prohibited under controlling Florida law; and

WHEREAS, there is evidence of a growing public safety and health concern regarding the sale of incense products which contain chemical compounds designed as synthetic alternatives to certain illegal controlled substances; and

WHEREAS, these products are being offered for sale in gas stations, convenience stores and "head shops" and are designed to mimic the effects of illegal drugs such as cannabis, cocaine and amphetamines; and

WHEREAS, these products are usually labeled as "not for human consumption", and therefore are not regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), they are being crushed and/or ground up and ingested by individuals; and

WHEREAS, national studies have documented that a great number of the individuals ingesting these incense products are minors and young adults; and

WHEREAS, the ingestion of these products has been documented to cause symptoms such as paranoia, severe anxiety, hallucinations, suicidal thoughts, combative behavior, nausea, increased heart rate, seizures and, on occasions, death; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has determined that the consumption of synthetic alternatives can cause adverse health effects as agitation, anxiety, nausea, vomiting, tachycardia, elevated blood pressure, tremors, seizures, hallucinations, paranoid behavior and non-responsiveness and, indeed, fatal overdoses have occurred that have resulted from the consumption of synthetic cannabinoids; and

WHEREAS, the American Association of Poison Control Centers has reported increasing calls in recent years to poison control centers across the United States related to exposure to synthetic cannabinoids, with 2,906 calls reported in 2010, 6,959 calls in 2011, and 3,372 call during the first six months of 2012; and

WHEREAS, Marilyn Huestis, Chief of Chemistry and Drug Metabolism at the National Institute on Drug Abuse, stated during an interview conducted by *The Washington Post*, that "these different, synthetic compounds are up to 100 times more potent than THC and have not been tested on humans. When people take it, they don't know how much they're taking or what it is they're taking"; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature, in Section 893.0356, *Florida Statutes*, has identified these substances as "controlled substance analogs", which is defined as a substance which is "substantially similar to that of a controlled substance listed in Schedule I or Schedule II

of Section 893.03, *Florida Statutes*, and has a stimulant, depressant, or hallucinogenic effect on the central nervous system substantially similar to or greater than that of a controlled substance listed in Section 893.03, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, some of these substances evade classification as a "controlled substance analog" by being packaged in a loose, leafy or granular form and marked as "not for human consumption"; and

WHEREAS, during the 2011 Legislative Session, the Florida Legislature enacted House Bill 39 which was assigned Chapter 2011-73, *Laws of Florida*, which added five synthetic cannabinoids or synthetic cannabinoid-mimicking compounds of Schedule I of Florida's controlled substance schedule, allowing law enforcement officials and prosecutors to arrest and prosecute violators for the possession and sale of those substances; and

WHEREAS, after the enactment of House Bill 39, rogue chemist reconfigured the particular synthetic cannabinoids and synthetic cannabinoid-mimicking compounds made illegal by House Bill 39 and marketed new products that were not covered by Florida law and, thus, not illegal with the marketing often flaunting the intent of the Florida Legislature to regulate chemical compounds; and

WHEREAS, also during the 2011 Legislative Session, the Florida Legislature enacted House Bill 1039 which was assigned Chapter 2011-90, *Laws of Florida*, which added six synthetic stimulants to Schedule I of Florida's controlled substance schedule, allowing law enforcement officials and prosecutors to arrest and prosecute violators for the possession and sale of those substances; and

WHEREAS, again, after the enactment of House Bill 1039, rogue chemist reconfigured the particular synthetic stimulants made illegal by House Bill 1039 and marketed new products that were not covered by Florida law and, thus, not illegal with the marketing often flaunting the intent of the Florida Legislature to regulate synthetic stimulants; and

WHEREAS, to evade identification as a Schedule I or Schedule II drug, the manufacturers of these incense products have been altering the chemical compounds to prevent the drug from being identified as a Schedule I and/or Schedule II drug; and

WHEREAS, in an additional attempt to combat the sale, distribution, purchase and/or possession of these substances, during the 2012 Legislative Session, the Florida Legislature amended Section 893.03, *Florida Statutes*, by enacting House Bill 1175, which was assigned Chapter 2012-23, *Laws of Florida*, which legislation included 142 new chemical compounds which trigger hallucinogenic symptoms as Schedule I drugs; and

WHEREAS, these products are usually not labeled with the contained packaged ingredients and it is difficult for law enforcement to determine whether the ingredients contained in the packaging are illegal substances under Chapter 893, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the risks associated with the sale, delivery and possession of these incense products are increased because they can be created more rapidly than they can be identified and controlled by state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, Sections 893.03 and 893.03, *Florida Statutes*, provide for criminal violations for the possession, delivery, sale and possession with intent to deliver any these aforementioned illegal substances; and

WHEREAS, the labeling of the ingredients on the packaging of these products should assist in the effective enforcement of the aforementioned provisions of the *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the sale, delivery and use of these incense products has a substantial and detrimental impact on the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Daytona Beach Shores; and

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 2, *Constitution of the State of Florida*, authorizes the City of Daytona Beach Shores to exercise any power for municipal purposes except as otherwise provided by law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its home rule power, the City of Daytona Beach Shores may exercise any power and perform any function relating to its government and affairs including the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Daytona Beach Shores hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare to prohibit the sale, delivery, possession and use of synthetic alternatives in the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DAYTONA BEACH SHORES, FLORIDA, as follows:

SECTION ONE: LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT.

(a). The City Council of the City of Daytona Beach Shores hereby adopts and incorporates into this Ordinance the City staff report and City Council agenda memorandum relating to the application relating to the proposed rezoning of the subject property as well as the recitals (whereas clauses) to this Ordinance.

(b). The City Council of the City of Daytona Beach Shores hereby adopts and incorporates into this Ordinance, as legislative findings, the legislative staff reports pertaining to the legislation referenced in the recitals to this Ordinance.

(c). The City of Daytona Beach Shores has complied with all requirements and procedures of Florida law in processing and advertising this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION TWO: SHORT TITLE.</u> This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "City of Daytona Beach Shores Synthetic Drug Prohibition Ordinance."

SECTION THREE: REQUIREMENTS AND PROHIBITIONS RELATING TO SYNTHETIC ALTERNATIVE DRUGS. A new section of the *Code of Ordinances of the City of Daytona Beach Shores, Florida* is added to read as follows:

(a). **Definitions.** For the purposes of this Ordinance the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning:

Bath Salts/synthetic cathinones/synthetic stimulants means any product distributed in a loose, leafy, powder, crystal or granular form or in a compressed block(s) that can be crushed to result in a powder or granular form, that can be ingested by placing in a pipe, cigarette paper, syringe or any other paraphernalia used for the purpose of ingesting by smoking, inhaling or other method of ingestion, that contains any synthetic derivative of cathinone including, but not limited to, Methlenedioxypyrovalerone (MDPV), and/or or any derivative of MDPV and/or any other compound defined in Section 893.03, Florida Statutes, or any derivative of said compound, which mimics the physiological effects of said compounds. The term includes, but is not limited to, any crystalline or powder product in crystalline, loose-powder, block, tablet, or capsule form, or any stimulant-type product, when the label is in any way false or misleading, or which does not contain a label specifying (1) the identity of the commodity, and (2) the name and place of business of the manufacturer, packer, or distributor. Street names for these products include, but are not limited to, the following: Bliss, Blue Silk, Cloud Nine, Drone, Energy-1, Ivory Wave, Lunar Wave, Meow Meow, Ocean Burst, Pure Ivory, Purple Wave, Red Dove, Snow Leopard, Stardust, Vanilla Sky, White Dove, White Knight, White Lightening, Blizzard, Bonzai Grow, Charge Plus, Charlie, Euphoria, Hurricane, Lunar Wave, ocean, Pixie Dust, Posh, Scarface, Lovey Dovey, Aura, MDPV, MDPK, MTV, Maddie, Hurricane Charlie, Black Rob, Super Coke, PV, Peeve, Meph, Drone, MCAT.

Drug means any form of a compound or material that is intended to affect the function of the body of humans.

Drug paraphernalia means any object used, intended for use or designed for use in ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing marijuana, cocaine, or other illicit drugs or controlled substances into the human body including, but not limited to, the following: metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic or ceramic pipes (with or without screen, permanent screens, hashish heads or punctured metal bowls); water pipes; carburetion tubes and devices, smoking in carburetion masks; roach clips, miniature cocaine spoons and cocaine vials; chamber pipes; carburetor pipes; electric pipes; air driven pipes; chillums; bongs; ice pipes or chillers; provided, however, that the term shall not include devices that are necessary to ingest or inject prescription drugs. In determining whether an object is drug paraphernalia, a court may consider any of the factors enumerated in Section 893.146, *Florida Statutes*. The definition set forth in Section 893.145, *Florida Statutes*, is hereby adopted.

Herbal incense means any aromatic or non-aromatic plant material that is distributed in a loose, leafy, powder or granular form, or in compressed block(s) that can easily be crushed or ground into a powder or granular form, and can be placed into a pipe, cigarette papers or any other

paraphernalia used for the purpose of ingesting by smoking, inhaling or other method of ingestion.

Illicit synthetic drugs means and includes spice, synthetic cannabinoids, synthetic marijuana, bath salts, synthetic cathinones, synthetic stimulants and misbranded drugs.

Misbranded drug means a drug that violates Section 499.007, *Florida Statutes*, including, but not limited to, drugs for which (1) the label is in any way false or misleading; (2) the label does not bear the name and place of business of the manufacturer, repackager, or distributor of the finished form of the drug; (3) the label does not bear adequate directions for use; or (4) the label does not bear adequate warnings against use.

Product containing a synthetic alternative drug means any product containing a synthetic cannabinoid, stimulant or psychedelic/hallucinogen, as those terms are defined in the definitions set forth in this Ordinance, and, such as, but not limited to, the examples of brand names or identifiers listed in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein; provided, however, that the listed names are examples only.

Spice/synthetic marijuana means any aromatic or non-aromatic plant material containing any compound defined in Section 893.03, Florida Statutes, any aromatic plant material in granular, loose leaf or powder form, or in liquid or as a food additive, whether said compound has been sprayed, applied or otherwise added, and/or any other derivative of said compound that mimics the physiological effects of said compound, that is distributed in a loose, leafy, powder, crystal or granular form or in a compressed block(s) that can be crushed to result in a powder or granular form, that can be ingested by placing in a pipe, cigarette paper or any other paraphernalia used for the purpose of ingesting by smoking, inhaling or other method of ingestion or any laboratorycreated compound that functions similar to the active ingredient in marijuana, tetrahyrdocannabinol (THC) including, but not limited to, any quantity of a natural or synthetic material, compound, mixture, preparation, substance and their analog (including isomers, esters, ethers, salts, and salts of isomers) containing a cannabinoid receptor agonist, such as, but not limited to, the examples of brand names or identifiers listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein. Street names for these products include, but are not limited to: Bliss, Black Mamba, Bombay Blue, Fake Weed, Genie, Spice, Zohai, K2, K3, Smoke, Pot-Pourri, Buzz, Spice 99, Voodoo, Pulse, Hush, Mystery, Earthquake, Stinger, Ocean Blue, Serenity, Chronic Spice, Spice Gold, Spice Silver, Skunk, Mr. Nice Guy, Mr. Happy, K3 Legal, Sence, Smoke, Chill X, Earth Impact, Galaxy Gold, Space Truckin, Solar Flare, Moon Rocks, Aroma, Scope, Sky High, Atomic, G-20, Guerrilla Warfare, Makes Scents, g-13, Tiger Shark, California Dreams, Dank, Bullet, Mind Trip, Voodoo Child, Jazz Nightlights, Matrix, Hypnotig, AK47, Maui Wowie, Cloud 9, Daylights, Joker, Dead Man Walking, Brain Storm, Soul Sence, Kush, Kush Mania, Dragons Fire, Lucid, Mad Hatter, Scooby Snax, D-ZL, OMG, Demon, Barely In, Pineapple Express, Hayze. The term includes any herbal-incense type stimulant or hallucinogen product, when the label is in any way false or misleading, or which does not contain a label specifying (1) the identity of the commodity and (2) the name and place of business of the manufacturer, packer, or distributor.

Synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogen means any compound that mimics the effects of any federally controlled Schedule I substance, including but not limited to, and quantity of a natural or synthetic material, compound, mixture, preparation, substance and their analog, (including salts, isomers, esters, ethers and salts of isomers) containing substances which have a psychedelic/hallucinogenic effect on the central nervous system and/or brain, such as, but not limited to, the examples of brand names or identifiers listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Synthetic stimulant means any compound that mimics the effects of any federally controlled Schedule I substance such as cathinone, methacathinone, MDMA and MDEA, including, but not limited to, any quantity of a natural or synthetic material, compound, mixture, preparation, substance and their analog (including salts, isomers, and salts of isomers) containing substances which have a stimulant effect on the central nervous system, such as, but not limited to, the examples of brand names or identifiers listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

(b). Warnings/Prohibitions.

(1). Any bath salt, herbal incense, product containing a synthetic alternative drug, spice/synthetic marijuana, synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogen or synthetic stimulant product shall contain on its packaging a label containing the following information: A complete list of all ingredients and chemical compounds contained therein, regardless of whether said ingredients and/or compounds are natural, manmade or are contained therein as a result of the combining of one or more natural ingredients or compounds. Additionally, the packaging of such products shall contain the following warning: "This product is not for human consumption. The ingestion of this product may cause paranoia, severe anxiety, hallucinations, suicidal thoughts, combative behavior, nausea, increased heart rate, seizures and possibly death".

(2). The packaging of drug paraphernalia shall contain the following warning: "The ingestion of illegal drugs or synthetic drug products may cause paranoia, severe anxiety, hallucinations, suicidal thoughts, combative behavior, nausea, increased heart rate, seizures and possibly death".

(3). The requirements in Subsections (1) and (2) must be in all capital letters and the size of all other letters on the packaging shall be the same as the size of such letters. Additionally, the labeled ingredients and warning in Subsection (1) shall be in a conspicuous and legible type in contrast by the typography, layout, or color with all other printed material on the package. It is prohibited and unlawful to fail to provide labeling as set forth in Subsections (1), (2) and (3).

(4). It is prohibited and unlawful to sell, offer to sell, display or deliver any bath salt, herbal incense product containing a synthetic alternative drug, spice/synthetic marijuana, synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogen or synthetic stimulant product without compliance with the label requirements herein.

(5). It is prohibited and unlawful to sell, offer to sell, display, deliver or possess any bath salt, herbal incense product which contain any substances and/or compounds defined in Section 893.03, *Florida Statutes*, or Section 893.0356, *Florida Statutes*, or any product containing a

synthetic alternative drug, synthetic marijuana, synthetic psychedelic/hallucinogen or synthetic stimulant.

(6). Each violation of any of the provisions of this Section shall constitute a separate violation and subject to a separate penalty herein.

SECTION FOUR: RELATIONSHIP TO FEDERAL AND STATE LAWS.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall not be construed or interpreted to conflict with the controlling provisions of Federal or State law which preempt the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES.

(a). It is prohibited and unlawful for any person to fail to comply with the requirements of this Ordinance.

(b). The City may enforce the provisions of this Ordinance by any lawful means available to the City under the controlling provisions of State law; provided, however, that enforcement shall not be accomplished in a proceeding before the City's Code Enforcement Board.

(c). The penalties for violation of this Ordinance shall be as set forth in the code enforcement method asserted by the City under the *Code of Ordinances of the City of Daytona Beach Shores, Florida* or as may be available under the controlling provisions of State law.

(d). Any person found guilty, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld, of any violation under this section shall be liable for payment of the costs of prosecution and all investigative costs incurred, including but not limited to any cost for laboratory testing.

<u>SECTION SIX: SAVINGS.</u> The prior actions of the City of Daytona Beach Shores relating to the regulation of illegal drugs and related matters are hereby ratified and affirmed.

SECTION SEVEN: IMPLEMENTING ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIONS. The City Manager, or designee, is authorized to take any and all required administrative actions to implement the provisions of this Ordinance.

<u>SECTION EIGHT: CONFLICTS.</u> All ordinances or part of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION NINE: SEVERABILITY. If any section, sentence, phrase, word, or portion of this Ordinance is determined to be invalid, unlawful or unconstitutional, said determination shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force or effect of any other section, sentence, phrase, word, or portion of this Ordinance not otherwise determined to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional.

SECTION TEN: CODIFICATION. The provisions of this Ordinance, including its recitals, shall become and be made a part of the *Code of Ordinances of the City of Daytona Beach*

Ordinance 2012<mark>-____</mark> Page No.8 *Shores, Florida* and the Sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention and the word "Ordinance", or similar words, may be changed to "Section," "Article", or other appropriate word; provided, however, that Sections Four, Five, Six, Seven, Eight, Nine, Ten and Eleven shall not be codified. The Code codifier is granted liberal authority to codify the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION ELEVEN: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon enactment.
