

Ordinance No. 2303

ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 2-14-3 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES  
OF THE CITY OF BILOXI, MISSISSIPPI OF 1992 REGARDING MUNICIPAL FACILITIES  
AVAILABLE FOR RENTAL

WHEREAS, due to destruction resulting from Hurricane Katrina and subsequent reconstruction efforts, the municipal facilities available for rental, as specified in Section 2-14-3, have changed; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens that the Code of Ordinances of the City of Biloxi, Mississippi of 1992 be updated to reflect which municipal facilities are currently available for rental.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BILOXI, MISSISSIPPI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Section 2-14-3 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Biloxi, Mississippi, of 1992, is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 2-14-3. – Municipal facilities available for rental.

The following city facilities may be utilized pursuant to the provisions of this article: ~~the West Biloxi Community Center~~, the Visitor's Center/Gazebo, ~~Tullis Toledano Manor~~, the Saenger Theatre, ~~Hiller Park Tennis Courts~~, Hiller Park Pavilion, Hiller Park Softball Fields, Point Cadet Plaza, ~~the O'Hanlon Community Center~~, ~~the East Division Community Center~~, the Magnolia Hotel/Mardi Gras Museum, the Old Brick House, ~~the Biloxi Community Center~~, MGM Park, Biloxi Civic Center, Maritime and Seafood Industry Museum, Dr. Frank Gruich Community Center, Donal Snyder Community Center, Biloxi Town Green, Biloxi Natatorium, AJ Holloway Sports Complex, Popp's Ferry Recreational Area, Lighthouse Park Pavilion, O'Keefe Museum of Art.

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SECTION 2: The purpose of this Ordinance is to enable the City of Biloxi to provide for the orderly conduct of government as it specifically relates to the rental of municipal facilities. Due to this purpose, the City Council hereby finds that this Ordinance is essential to the efficient operation of government; therefore, this Ordinance shall become effective as soon thereafter as is legal, provided this ordinance is certified, signed, and published as provided by law.

The foregoing Ordinance having first been reduced to writing, was read by the Clerk and moved by Councilmember Lawrence, seconded by Councilmember Gines, and was adopted by the following vote:
