ORDINANCE NO. 16-199

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ARTICLE 11 OF THE CITY CHARTER TO PROVIDE FOR THE BUSINESS LICENSE OF MEAT PACKERS AND WHOLESALE MEAT DEALERS, AS A RESULT OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM BUSINESS LICENSE CODE ARTICLE 188.

WHEREAS, City of Birmingham Business License Code Article Schedule 188 requires each person, firm or corporation operating a retail meat market or a packing house or, selling or delivering to the City of Birmingham packing house products include meat, meat products, poultry, poultry products, cured meat and canned meat shall purchase a business license and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to increase the amount of license fee for Schedule 188 be given as January 1, 2017.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

Schedule 188 License Code of Birmingham Business License Code as adopted by Ordinance 18, as amended should be corrected as follows:

SCHEDULE 188 - PACKING HOUSE COMPANIES, WHOLESALE MEAT DEALERS, RETAIL MEAT MARKETS, AND/OR PACKING HOUSE PRODUCTS -

Each person, firm or corporation operating a retail meat market and/or a packing house, or selling or delivering into the City of Birmingham packing house products to include meat, meat products, poultry, poultry products, cured meats or canned meats shall pay a license of ~~2/10~~ 1/10 of 1% of the gross receipts from said business from the previous year with a minimum license of\$200.00

NO LICENSE WILL BE ISSUED until applicant has obtained a permit of the Revenue Division at the time of application a curfew shall apply.

The correction of the license shall be effective for Schedule 188 licenses purchased for the 2017 business year forward.

SECTION 2.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any provision, section, paragraph, sentence or thereof, or the part application thereof to any person shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction such declaration shall not affect or impair the remainder of the ordinance being the legislative intent to ordain and enact each provision, section, paragraph, sentence and part thereof, separately and independently of each other.

SECTION 3.

This ordinance shall be effective when published as required by state law.
