30	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
31	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
32	Section 1. Portions of Appendix A of the Code of Ordinances, relating to fees, rates or charges

- 1 Fire alarm system contractors and Fire inspections; Home Occupation Permits; Land
- 2 Development Code petitions, applications, development services and zoning permits; Annual
- 3 Spring Arts Festival permits; Burglar alarm operators, monitoring companies, systems, and
- 4 systems contractors; Roam towing; Registered Domestic Partners; Secondhand Goods Dealers;
- 5 Permits for use of and work in streets, sidewalks and other public places; Business tax receipt
- 6 transfers; Traffic and Motor Vehicle parking violations and delinquency; Stormwater

- 8 hereby amended to read as set forth below. The remaining portions of Appendix A remain

- 12 **Section 2.** It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Section 1 shall
- become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida, and
- that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered in order to
- 15 accomplish such intentions.
- 16 **Section 3**. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this ordinance or the
- application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding
- shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect
- without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of
- 20 this ordinance are declared severable.
- Section 4. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of such
- 22 conflict hereby repealed.

- 1 Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption; provided however,
- 2 the fees, rates and charges as provided for herein shall be applicable to fees, rates and charges
- 3 which are due and payable after 12:01 A.M. on October 1, 2009.
