8	SERVICES ADMINISTRATIVE FEE; PROVIDING FOR
9	SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION;
10	PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR AN
11	EFFECTIVE DATE.
12	WHEREAS, HB 133 was signed into law by Governor DeSantis effective as or
13	October 1, 2020; and
14	WHEREAS, HB 133 prohibits a County or Municipality from enacting ar
15	ordinance that imposes a fee, charge, cost, expense, fine or penalty on an authorized
16	wrecker operator or towing business; and
17	WHEREAS, the City Commission finds it to be in the best interest of the residents
18	of the City of Oakland Park to impose a Towing Services Administrative Fee.
19	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF
20	THE CITY OF OAKLAND PARK, FLORIDA THAT:
21	SECTION 1. The few aring "Whanger" clauses are hereby notified and confirmed
21 22	<b>SECTION 1</b> . The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a part of this Ordinance upon adoption
23	thereof.
24	SECTION 2. Chapter 2 Entitled "Administration", Article I, Section 2-13 entitled
25	"Fees and Charges" is hereby amended as follows:
26	Sec. 2-13 Fees and charges.
27	(a) City liens, assessments, fees, and permit history reports.
28	(1) Whenever the city receives a request for an accounting of the amounts of any
20 29	outstanding city lien, assessments, fees, and permit history reports, a minimum
30	service fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per request shall be charged to the
31	person making the request. Additional charges at the rate of fifteen dollars
32	(\$15.00) per hour shall be charged if the request requires more than one (1) hour
33	of clerical time.
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1 2	(2) The following charges are imposed in connection with liens and lien satisfactions:
3	Lien preparation and recording\$55.00
4	Lien satisfaction preparation:
5	Recording by the city45.00
6	Recording by party other than city10.00
7	(b) Police, accident and other reports.

16 17	1. <b>Definitions</b> . As used in this section, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly otherwise requires:
18 19 20 21	<b>Administrative Charge</b> : a financial charge imposed on the registered owner or other legally authorized person or entity of a motor vehicle or vessel to cover the cost of enforcement, including parking enforcement, by the municipality when the
20	vehicle or vessel is towed from public property.

	vehicle or vessel is towed from public property.  *Towing Business:* a business entity that provides towing and/or wrecker services*
23 24 25 26	<ul> <li>vehicle or vessel is towed from public property.</li> <li>Towing Business: a business entity that provides towing and/or wrecker services for monetary gain within the City.</li> <li>Towing Services Agreement: an agreement between the City of Oakland Park and a Towing Business that authorizes the Towing Business to provide services for private vehicles or vessels ordered towed by the City within the limits of the City</li> </ul>

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1 other legally authorized person or entity in control of a vehicle or vessel when a 2 vehicle or vessel is towed from public property. The administrative charge shall be twenty-five (25%) percent of the 3 4 maximum towing rate. As directed by the City Manager, or his/her designee, a Towing 5 6 Business with a Towing Services. Agreement may impose and collect the 7 administrative charge on behalf of the City of Oakland Park and shall remit such fee or charge to the City upon collection but in no event later than five 8 9 (5) days from the date of collection. 10 c) The administrative charge does not constitute a fee or charge upon an authorized Towing Business. 11 12 (e) (d) The finance director shall institute the necessary rules to effectively control this process. The finance director or department may refuse any request for the cost to be 13 14 billed versus payment in full at the time of service based upon the customer's past payment record with the city. All monies collected under this article shall be deposited 15 and credited as a revenue to the fund providing the service or copies. 16 (f) (e) It shall be the policy of the city, with regard to requests of other cities or other 17 governmental agencies for public records from the city, that said records shall be 18 19 provided at no cost by the city. 20 **SECTION 3.** If any clause, section or other part of this Ordinance shall be held by 21 22 any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutional or invalid part shall be considered as eliminated and in no way affecting the validity of the 23 24 other provisions of this Ordinance. 25 **SECTION 4.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby 26 repealed to the extent of such conflicts. 27 28 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the City Commission of the City of Oakland 29 Park, that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of 30 Ordinances of the City of Oakland Park, Florida, and the Sections of this ordinance may be 31 renumbered, re-lettered and the word "Ordinance" may be changed to "Section," "Article," 32 or such other word or phrase in order to accomplish such intention. 33 34 35 **SECTION 6.** This Ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and adoption by

the City Commission of the City of Oakland Park.
