

ORDINANCE NO. 11575

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1, "GENERAL PROVISIONS" AND
CHAPTER 3, "ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES"
OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF LIBERTY,
CLAY COUNTY, MISSOURI

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Liberty, Clay County,
Missouri as follows:

SECTION I

Chapter 1, "General Provisions", Section 1-2. "Definitions and rules of construction", of the Code of the City of Liberty, Clay County, Missouri is hereby amended as follows:

Add the following definition:

State Law reference— See RSMo 351.1222 (3)

"Electronic signature", an electronic symbol or process attached to or logically associated with a record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record:

- (1) For parties that agree to conduct a transaction by electronic means:
 - a. A record or signature shall not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely because it is in electronic form;
 - b. A contract shall not be denied legal effect or enforceability solely because an electronic record was used in its formation;
 - c. If a provision requires a record to be in writing, an electronic record satisfies the requirement; and
 - d. If a provision requires a signature, an electronic signature satisfies the requirement.

SECTION II

Chapter 3, "Alcoholic Beverages", Section 3-15, "Same – Fees" of the Code of the City of Liberty, Clay County, Missouri is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 3-15, "Same – Fees"

Replace:

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- (e) For sale of intoxicating liquor, by the drink at retail, for consumption on the premises of any restaurant bar described in the application, between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and midnight on Sunday, by applicant meeting the requirements of and in compliance with the "Sunday sale" or "restaurant bar" statute of the State of Missouri, RSMo 311.097, and additional fee of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per year.

With the following:

- e) For sale of intoxicating liquor, by the drink at retail, for consumption on the premises of any restaurant bar described in the application on Sunday, by applicant meeting the requirements of and in compliance with the "Eating places, drinking of intoxicating liquor on premises, license required when, hours – regulations – penalties - exceptions" statute of the State of Missouri, RSMo 311.480, and additional fee of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per year.

SECTION II

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION III

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the City Council and approval of the Mayor according to law.
