

**RESOLUTION NO. R2020-2207**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NASSAU BAY, TEXAS, CANVASSING THE RETURNS OF A GENERAL AND SPECIAL CITY ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2020.**

WHEREAS, on the 10th day of August 2020, the City Council of the City of Nassau Bay ordered a General and Special Election to be held in the City of Nassau Bay, Texas, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and three Councilmembers for Positions 2, 4, & 6 and for the purpose of submitting to the resident qualified voters the twenty-two propositions amending the City Charter, more fully described in Ordinance O2020-801, which is incorporated herein as Exhibit "A;" and

WHEREAS, balloting was conducted through an Agreement with Harris County for the conduct of a joint Election; and

WHEREAS, the official ballot read as follows:

**Proposition A: (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

"Complete inclusion of gender-neutral wording throughout the Charter."

**Proposition B (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

"Shall Article III. – City Council, Section 3.10 entitled "Rules of Procedure" be amended to read as follows: The council shall, by ordinance, determine its own rules and order of business and the rules shall provide that citizens of the city shall have a reasonable opportunity to be heard at any meeting with regard to any matter

under consideration. The council shall provide for minutes being taken and recorded for all meetings, and such minutes shall be a public record. Voting, except on procedural motions, shall be by raised hands, or as required by law, and shall be recorded in the minutes.”

**Proposition C (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article III. – City Council, Section 3.15 entitled “Audits and examination of city books and accounts” be amended to read as follows: The city council shall cause an independent annual audit to be made of the books and accounts of each and every department of the city. At the close of each fiscal year a complete audit shall be made by a certified public accounting firm, who shall be selected by the city council, and such audit shall include a recapitulation of all audits made during the course of each fiscal year. A report of fiscal issues and/or other significant problems found during the course of the audit shall be reported immediately to the city manager and a duplicate of the report sent to the mayor and members of city council within seventy-two (72) hours. A final report shall be filed with the city council for review and acceptance, and subsequently shall be available for public inspection and shall be made a part of the archives of the city.”

**Proposition D (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article IV. – Administrative Services, Section 4.01 (A) entitled “City manager” be amended to read as follows: (A) Appointment and qualifications: The council shall, by an affirmative vote of four (4) or more of the members of the council present, appoint a city manager who shall be the chief administrative officer of the city and who shall be responsible to the council for administration of all affairs of the city. The city manager shall be appointed solely upon the basis of his executive and administrative qualifications and need not, when appointed, be a resident of the city; however, he shall become a resident of the city within six (6) months after appointment and shall remain a resident during his tenure as city manager unless otherwise specifically excused by the council.”

**Proposition E (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article IV. – Administrative Services, Section 4.01 (C) entitled “City manager” be amended to read as follows: (C) Term and removal: The city manager shall not be appointed for a definite term but shall serve at the pleasure of the council. The council may remove the city manager from office by an affirmative vote of four (4) or more of the members of the council present.”

**Proposition F (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article IV. – Administrative Services, Section 4.02 entitled “Municipal court” be amended to read as follows: (E) Clerk of the court: The city manager shall appoint a clerk of the municipal court, and such deputy clerks as the council may deem necessary. The clerks shall be bonded at city expense.”

**Proposition G (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article V. – Elections, Section 5.02 entitled “Filing for office” be amended to read as follows: (C) Councilman mayoral candidate: Any councilman who becomes a candidate for Mayor in a regular election shall vacate his position as councilman, if elected, upon the canvassing of the results of the election.”

**Proposition H (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article V. – Elections, Section 5.04 entitled “Determination of election results” be amended to read as follows: (A) Canvassing: The returns of every municipal election shall be delivered by the election judges to the city secretary not later than twenty-four (24) hours after the closing of the polls. The canvassing authority shall certify the returns of the elections, general and special and certify the results in a schedule in accordance with State Law. The certified results shall then be presented to the council at its next meeting following the election, and shall be recorded in the minutes of this meeting.”

**Proposition I (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article VI. – Initiative, Referendum and Recall, Section 6.01 entitled “General authority” be amended to read as follows: (C) Recall: The qualified voters shall have the power to recall any member of city council of the city on grounds of incompetency, noncompliance with this charter, misconduct or malfeasance in office. Such power shall be exercised by filing with the city secretary a petition, signed by currently qualified voters of the city equal in number to at least fifteen (15) per cent of the total number of qualified voters registered to vote at the last regular city election, demanding the removal of such member of city council. The recall petition must specifically state each ground or grounds upon which such petition for removal is predicated as to give the member of city council sought to be removed notice of the matters and things with which he is charged.”

**Proposition J (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article VI. – Initiative, Referendum and Recall, Section 6.08 entitled “Results of recall election” be amended to read as follows: If a majority of the votes cast at a recall election shall be against removal of the member of city council named on the ballot, he shall continue in office. If the majority of the votes cast at the election be for the removal of the elected official named on the ballot, the city council shall immediately declare his office vacant and such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of this charter for the filling of vacancies.”

**Proposition K (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article VI. – Initiative, Referendum and Recall, Section 6.09 entitled “Limitations on recall” be amended to read as follows: No recall petition shall be filed against an elected official within six (6) months after he takes office, and no member of city council shall be subjected to more than one recall election during a term of office.”

**Proposition L (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article VI. – Initiative, Referendum and Recall, Section 6.10 entitled “Public hearing” be amended to read as follows: The member of city council whose removal is sought may, within five (5) days after such recall petition has been presented to the city council, request that a public hearing be held to permit him to present facts pertinent to the charges specified in the recall petition. In this event, the city council shall order such public hearing to be held, not less than five (5) days nor more than fifteen (15) days after receiving such request for a public hearing.”

**Proposition M (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article VII. – Municipal Finance, Section 7.02 entitled “Submission of budget” be amended to read as follows: On or before the first day of September of each year, the city manager shall submit to the council a proposed budget for the ensuing fiscal year and the budget message. The council shall review the proposed budget and make any appropriate changes prior to publishing the final budget.”

“Shall Article VII. – Municipal Finance, Section 7.03 entitled “Budget” be amended to read as follows: (C) Content, (12) The City is required to maintain 90 days of reserves, except in emergency situations and as approved by council.”

“Shall Article VII. – Municipal Finance, Section 7.03 entitled “Budget” be amended to read as follows: (C) Budget book.”

“Shall Article VII. – Municipal Finance, Section 7.04 entitled “Amendments after adoption” be amended to read as follows: (A) Supplemental appropriations: If during the fiscal year the manager certifies that there are available for appropriation revenues in excess of those estimated in the budget, the council may carry the excess into the next fiscal year or by ordinance may make supplemental appropriations, retire indebtedness, or fund emergency appropriations as described in section 7.04(B).”

**Proposition Q (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article VIII. – Tax Administration, Section 8.02 entitled “Tax collector” be amended to read as follows: At least one (1) registered Texas collector shall be employed or contracted by the city to collect taxes and maintain the tax records according to the state property tax laws and codes.”

**Proposition R (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article X. – Planning, Section 10.01 entitled “Planning commission” be amended to read as follows: There shall be a planning commission whose responsibilities are to accomplish the city planning and zoning functions to effect the orderly and desired growth, development and beautification of the city. The commission shall formulate and recommend to the city manager a comprehensive master plan and shall consult with other city departments regarding planning. The commission shall recommend any proposed zoning changes to council and shall act in an advisory capacity to the council on matters affecting the development of

the city. Such advisory activities include, but are not limited to, the assessment of specific use requests and architectural review of development plans for Planned Unit Developments (PUD's) and Specific Use Permits (SUP's), where architecture is a critical element."

**Proposition S (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

"Shall Article X. – Planning, Section 10.03 entitled "Comprehensive master plan" be amended to read as follows: The planning commission shall formulate a comprehensive master plan for the development of the city, containing the commission's recommendations for growth, development and beautification of the city. This plan shall be reviewed in detail at least every five (5) years; shall contain the planning considerations for the period of ten (10) years; and updated when the Planning Commission and City Staff determine there are sufficient changes to warrant an update. This plan shall be forwarded to the city manager who shall submit it to the council with his recommendations thereon. The council shall hold a public hearing on the proposed comprehensive plan, or modification thereof, and shall thereafter adopt it by resolution with or without amendment."

**Proposition T (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

"Shall Article X. – Planning, Section 10.04 entitled "Plats and building codes" be amended to read as follows: The planning commission shall approve or disapprove plats of proposed subdivisions submitted in accordance with city ordinances as adopted or hereafter amended. The commission shall review amendments, extensions or revisions of the building code, which are proposed by the City Building Official and City Fire Marshall and which shall include the minimum standards of construction for building, plumbing, wiring, and safety."

**Proposition U (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

"Shall Article XI. – General Provisions, Section 11.07 entitled "Assignment, execution and garnishment" be amended to read as follows: The property, real and personal, belonging to the city shall not be liable to be sold or appropriated under any writ or execution or cost bill. The funds belonging to the city, in the hands of any person, firm or corporation shall not be liable to garnishment, attachment, or sequestration; nor shall the city be liable in garnishment on account of any debt it may owe or funds or property it may have on hand or owing to any person. Neither the city nor any of its elected officers, appointed officers, employees, or agents shall be required to answer any such writ of garnishment on any account whatever. The city shall not be obligated to recognize any assignment of wages or funds by its employees, agents or contractors."

**Proposition V (Proposed Amendment to the City Charter)**

“Shall Article XI. – General Provisions, Section 11.11 entitled “Gender of wording” be removed and reserved for future use. Proposition 1 replaces the need for Section 11.11 Gender of wording.”

WHEREAS, the Election officers who conducted all balloting have duly made the returns of the results of said Election and said returns are hereby presented to City Council, and are incorporated herein as Exhibit “B.”

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NASSAU BAY, STATE OF TEXAS:**

1. That this Council, sitting as a Canvassing Board, officially finds and determines that the Special City Election described hereinabove was duly ordered, that proper notice of said Election was duly given, that the proper officers conducted the balloting in said Election; that due returns of all balloting in said Election have been made and delivered; and that this City Council, sitting as a Canvassing Board, has duly canvassed said returns of said Election, all in accordance with law.

2. That the City Council, sitting as a Canvassing Board officially finds and determines that only qualified electors were allowed to vote at said Election; that only properly cast ballots were counted; that the following combined total of votes, for both early voted ballots and Election day ballots, based on the returns and statement of canvass of said Election, made to the City Council, were as follows:

3. As a result of said election, the Canvassing Board finds that no candidate for the position of Mayor received a majority vote of over 50.1%, therefore no candidate has been declared to be the duly elected Mayor of the City of Nassau Bay, Texas, resulting in a runoff election to be ordered December 12th, of which candidates Bob Wartens and Ashley Graves are designated for the runoff election as having received the two highest number of votes.

4. The Canvassing Board further finds that the position of Councilmember Position 2 was unopposed and therefore Phil Johnson is hereby declared to be the duly elected Councilmember Position 2 of the City of Nassau Bay, Texas.

5. The Canvassing Board further finds that the position of Councilmember Position 4 was unopposed and therefore Bryce Klug is hereby declared to be the duly elected Councilmember Position 4 of the City of Nassau Bay, Texas.

6. The Canvassing Board further finds that the position of Councilmember Position 6 was unopposed and therefore Matthew R. Prior is hereby declared to be the duly elected Councilmember Position 6 of the City of Nassau Bay, Texas.

THAT, as a result of said Election, the Canvassing Board officials find that Proposition A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U, and V are approved.

# EXHIBIT A

## ORDINANCE NO. O2020-801

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NASSAU BAY, TEXAS, ORDERING A REGULAR GENERAL AND SPECIAL (CHARTER AMENDMENT) CITY ELECTION TO BE HELD IN SAID CITY ON THE 3RD DAY OF NOVEMBER 2020, FOR THE PURPOSE OF 1) ELECTING A MAYOR AND THREE MEMBERS OF COUNCIL; DESIGNATING THE DAY(S) OF THE ELECTION(S) AND THE POLLING PLACE; PROVIDING THAT ALL DULY QUALIFIED RESIDENT ELECTORS SHALL BE QUALIFIED TO VOTE; PRESCRIBING A FORM OF THE BALLOT; PROVIDING A NOTICE OF ELECTION; AND 2) PRESENTING TO VOTERS VARIOUS CHARTER AMENDMENTS AS NOTED IN FULL IN THE EXHIBIT OF THIS DOCUMENT; CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO SAID ELECTION; AUTHORIZING THAT THE ELECTION SHOULD BE HELD JOINTLY WITH HARRIS COUNTY; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NASSAU BAY, STATE OF TEXAS, THAT:

WHEREAS, the City of Nassau Bay was incorporated under the laws of the State of Texas and is now governed by a Home Rule Charter duly and properly adopted by its citizens on April 7, 1973, thereby making it a Home Rule City under the Constitution and the laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the general laws and Constitution of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of Nassau Bay, Texas, and pursuant to Ordinance No. O2020-792, a Municipal Officers' election was ordered to held on May 2, 2020, for the purpose of electing the Mayor and Council Position 2, 4 and 6; and for the purpose of presenting twenty-two propositions amending the City Charter to the voters as presented in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 418.016 of the Texas Government Code, on March 18, 2020, the Governor of the State of Texas signed a proclamation suspending certain provisions of the Texas Election Code and the Texas Water Code to allow all local political subdivisions that are utilizing the May 2, 2020 uniform election date to postpone their elections to the November 3, 2020, uniform election date; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Governor's proclamation authorizing the City of Nassau Bay to postpone the May 2, 2020 election date, the City Council excercised its authority to postpone the General and Special Election ordered for May 2, 2020 to November 3, 2020;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NASSAU BAY, STATE OF TEXAS:

**Section 1:** That a regular annual election shall be held in and throughout the City of Nassau Bay on the 3rd day of November 2020, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., at which election there shall be elected by the voters the Mayor and three councilmembers (Positions 2, 4, and 6), the respective positions currently held by the following persons:

Mayor	Mark Denman
Councilman, Position 2	Ashley Graves
Councilman, Position 4	Bryce Klug
Councilman, Position 6	Matt Prior

**Section 2:** That said election shall be held in accordance with a Joint Election Agreement between the City of Nassau Bay and Harris County, said Agreement to be approved by City Council at a future meeting before the election. Harris County owns an electronic voting system, eSlate, that has been approved by the Secretary of State pursuant to the Texas Election Code and the City of Nassau Bay will use the County's Voting System in its election and compensate the County for such use and share in certain other expenses connected with elections in accordance with applicable provisions of Chapters 31 and 271 of the Texas Election Code, as amended.

**Section 3:** The form of the ballot shall be provided by Harris County under the terms of the Joint Election Agreement. The ballots shall be prepared in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Election Code so voters may cast their ballots for the offices of Mayor and councilmember positions 2, 4, and 6 and for twenty-two propositions amending the City Charter. Said election shall be in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and all duly qualified resident electors of the City of Nassau Bay shall be qualified to vote.

**Section 4:** That the election shall be held and the returns thereof shall be made and canvassed in accordance with the general laws pertaining to municipal elections and in accordance with the requirements of the Election Code of the State of Texas, as amended, and the persons receiving the majority of the votes for the offices of Mayor and councilmember positions 2, 4, and 6, shall be declared elected, and the ballots of said election shall conform to the requirements of the general laws pertaining to municipal elections and to the requirements of the Election Code of the State of Texas, as amended.

**Section 5:** Early Voting by personal appearance shall be conducted by Harris County at designated early branch polling locations throughout the County October 13, 2020 and ending Friday, October 30, 2020. During the period of early voting, Nassau Bay residents may vote at any Harris County branch polling place.

**Section 8:** The notice of the election hereby ordered and called shall be given:

- a. By posting notice thereof at the City Offices, 1800 Space Park Drive, Suite 200, Nassau Bay, Texas 77058, not later than the 22nd day before Election Day.
- b. By publication, which notice shall state the nature and date of the election, the hours during which the polls will be open, and the location of the polling place in the City. Said publication notice shall be published at least once in the official newspaper of the City, The Bay Area Citizen, not earlier than the 30th day nor later than the 10th day before Election Day.
- c. In order to comply with the additional notice requirements of the City Charter, sample ballots shall also be posted and published as prescribed above.

**Section 9:** That the candidate filings for the Municipal election for May 2, 2020, for the City of Nassau Bay, Texas, for the purpose of electing members of the City Council for Mayor and Council Positions 2, 4 and 6 shall remain valid for the election to be held on November 3, 2020, and that the filing period for candidates will not be re-opened for the election to be held on November 3, 2020.

**Section 10:** That the City Manager is authorized to negotiate and execute an election contract with Harris County for the purposes of conducting the postponed election on November 3, 2020.

**Section 11:** That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and approval.

**Section 12:** If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, or invalid or for any reason unenforceable, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the governing body of this City in adopting this

Ordinance that no portion hereof or provision contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality or invalidity of any other portion, provision, or regulation; and to this end all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.
