

ORDINANCE NO. 4246

1 **AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RIVIERA BEACH,**
2 **PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 10, "LICENSES,"**
3 **ARTICLE VIII, "MOBILE VENDORS," SECTIONS 10-262 THROUGH 10-268**
4 **OF THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR REGULATIONS**
5 **REGARDING MOBILE VENDORS DISPENSING FOOD AND OTHER ITEMS;**
6 **PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING**
7 **FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN CODE; AND**
8 **PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

10 **WHEREAS,** the City of Riviera Beach, Florida is a duly constituted municipality
11 having such power and authority conferred upon it by the Florida Constitution and
12 Chapter 166, Florida Statutes; and

13 **WHEREAS,** Article VIII of the State Constitution and Chapter 166, Florida
14 Statutes, provide that municipalities shall have the governmental, corporate, and
15 proprietary powers to enable them to conduct municipal government, perform municipal
16 functions, and render municipal services, and may exercise any power for municipal
17 purposes, except when expressly prohibited by law; and

18 **WHEREAS,** on June 30, 2020, the Florida Legislature adopted, and, the
19 Governor signed into law, CS/HB 1193; Deregulation of Professions and Occupations.
20 The Bill created Section 509.102, Florida Statutes, which defined mobile food
21 dispensing vehicle and preempted regulation of licenses, registrations, permits, and
22 fees for mobile food dispensing vehicles to the State of Florida; and

23 **WHEREAS,** the creation of Section 509.102, Florida Statutes, necessitates the
24 City amend the City Code in order to ensure the City's regulations governing mobile
25 food dispensing vehicles are consistent with the new regulations; and

26 **WHEREAS,** the City of Riviera Beach ("the City") desires to modify and update
27 its regulation of mobile vendors; and

28 **WHEREAS,** the City Council finds that, in the absence of reasonable regulations
29 as to location, process, and limitations, mobile vendors could cause visual clutter, trash,
30 vehicular circulation disruptions, parking shortages, sanitation issues, and distractions
31 that endanger traffic, health, and safety; and

32 **WHEREAS**, the City Council finds and determines that these amendments are
33 not in conflict with the public interest; and

34 **WHEREAS**, the City Council conducted a first and second reading of this
35 Ordinance at duly noticed public hearings, as required by law, and after having received
36 input from and participation by interested members of the public and staff; and

37 **WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that the enactment of this
38 Ordinance is for a proper municipal purpose and protects the health, safety and welfare
39 of the public.

41 **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY**
42 **OF RIVIERA BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:**

44 **Section 1.** The foregoing “WHEREAS” clauses are hereby ratified and
45 confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this
46 Ordinance upon adoption hereof.

47 **Section 2.** Chapter 10, “Licenses and Business Regulations,” Article VIII,
48 “Mobile Vendors,” Section 10-262 through Section 10-268, are hereby amended as
49 follows (additions are underlined; deletions are ~~stricken~~):

50 **Sec. 10-262. Definitions.**

51 The following words, term and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the
52 meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicated
53 a different meaning.

54 *Certificate of occupancy*: means a certificate issued by the City of Riviera Beach Building
55 Official to a builder or renovator, indicating that the building is in proper condition to
56 be occupied.

57 ~~Disposable tableware~~ Single-service food utensils: Eating and drinking utensils made of
58 paper and/or plastic, individually wrapped, that are disposed of after initial use.

59 *Ice cream truck*: A motor vehicle utilized as the point of retail sales of prewrapped or
60 prepackaged ice cream, frozen yogurt, frozen custard, flavored frozen water or
61 similar frozen dessert products.

62 *Mobile detailer*: A person who cleans and details a vehicle or vessel at the customers
63 location.

Mobile vending unit: Any motorized or non-motorized vehicle, trailer, kiosk, pushcart, stand or other device designed to be portable and not permanently attached to the ground from which goods, wares, merchandise ~~or food~~ is peddled, vended, sold, displayed, offered for sale or given away.

Mobile food vendor: A person who prepares, dispenses, or otherwise sells food from a mobile food truck.

Mobile vendor: A person who peddles, vends, sells, displays, offers to sell or gives away merchandise from a mobile vending unit which is parked or located on a parcel of private property.

Mobile Food Truck: A vehicle which is used to vend food and beverage products and is classified as one of the following:

- a. Mobile Food Dispensing Vehicles (MFDV). Any vehicle that is a public food service establishment and that is self-propelled or otherwise movable from place to place and includes self-contained utilities, including, but not limited to, gas, water, electricity, or liquid waste disposal. MFDVs may cook, prepare and assemble food items on or in the unit and serve a full menu. MFDVs are regulated by the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation.
- b. Mobile Food Establishment (MFE). These vehicles vend pre-cooked foods, pre-packaged foods, pre-packaged drinks and incidental sales of pre-packaged frozen dairy or frozen water-based food products, fruits, and vegetables. No preparation or assembly of food or beverages may take place on or in the vehicle; however, the heating of pre-cooked food is permitted. MFEs are regulated by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

~~*Mobile vending operation:* Peddling, vending, selling, displaying, offering for sale or giving away goods, wares, merchandise or food from a mobile vending unit located on private property.~~

Prepackaged food: means any properly labeled and processed food, prepackaged to prevent any direct human contact with the food product upon distribution from the manufacturer, and prepared at an approved source.

~~*Restricted mobile vendor:* A mobile vendor offering only prepackaged food, snow cones, raw produce, or prepackaged ice cream from a mobile vending unit, or a mobile automobile detailer.~~

~~*Street-side vendor or road-side vendor:* A person who peddles, vends, sells, displays, offers to sell or gives away any food products, wares, or merchandise while located in or on a public street, sidewalk, or right-of-way.~~

~~*Temporary mobile vendor:* A person and or group who peddles, vends, sells, displays, offers to sell or gives away merchandise from a mobile vending unit for less than 15 days per calendar year.~~

Sec. 10-263. Location Restriction and Prohibitions. Permitted locations.

- (a) Mobile food vendors shall not operate in residential zoning districts, except for ice cream trucks pursuant to Section 10-267. ~~and mobile automobile detailers, are not permitted in the following districts: RS 5, RS 6, RS 8, RML 12, RD 15, RM 15, RMH 15, RMH 20, or RM 20.~~
- (b) Mobile food vendors are not permitted to conduct business in any area that is a public right-of-way.
- (c) Mobile food vendors shall not operate in driveways, drive aisles, landscape medians, easements, or fire lanes.
- (d) Mobile food vendors shall not operate on vacant, unimproved lots.
- (e) Mobile food vendors shall ~~be located~~ operate only on private property where an existing, permanent business operates in a building with a certificate of occupancy and an active Business Tax Receipt and Certificate of Use.
- (1) Mobile vendors shall provide the city with a notarized copy of the "Mobile Vendor Access Agreement Form" on an annual basis.
- (f) During the operation-location review ~~application~~-process, mobile food vendors, shall submit a sketch depicting the location of the mobile ~~vendors,~~ food truck on the property, including the required designated parking spaces.
- (g) Mobile ~~vendors,~~ food trucks shall be located within 100 feet of an entrance of a primary building that holds the certificate of occupancy and an active Business Tax Receipt and Certificate of Use.
- (h) Mobile ~~vendors,~~ food trucks shall be setback a minimum of 35 feet from all intersections.
- (i) Mobile ~~vendors,~~ food trucks shall be setback a minimum of 20 feet from all roads.
- (j) Mobile ~~vendors,~~ food trucks are not allowed within 300 feet of a school, playground, or childcare facility.
- (k) Mobile ~~vendors,~~ food trucks are not allowed to operate within 100 feet of another licensed mobile vendor.
- (l) Mobile ~~vendors,~~ food trucks are prohibited in a temporary building, tent, or structure.
- (m) Mobile ~~vending~~ food truck activities located within the Marina District Upland Area are exempt from the abovementioned regulations as long as the following conditions are met:

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- (1) Mobile ~~vending~~ food truck activities occur within approved areas specifically designated for mobile ~~vending~~ food truck activities.
- a. The city and CRA are authorized to designate specific areas within the Marina District Upland Area for mobile vending activities.
- (2) The mobile vendor ~~possesses any required state, county, and food safety licensure~~ complies with subsections (n) through (r) of this section.
- (n) Mobile food vendors shall possess a valid state agency approval and a current City of Riviera Beach Fire Inspection report.
- (o) Mobile food trucks shall not be located within fifteen (15) feet of any fire hydrant or storm drainage structure.
- (p) Mobile food vendors are prohibited from selling or distributing alcoholic beverages.
- (q) Mobile food vendors are prohibited from providing a dining area, including, but not limited to, tables, chairs, booths, bar stools, benches, and standup counters unless explicit permission is provided by the City.
- (r) Mobile food vendors are prohibited from selling or dispensing food to customers in a moving vehicle or otherwise engage in drive-up sales.

Sec. 10-264. Hours of operation Operating Requirements.

- (a) Mobile vendors may operate only during the business hours of the primary business on the property.
- (1) Mobile food vendors are restricted to the following hours of operation:
- a. Monday to Thursday: 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- b. Friday and Saturday: 7:00 a.m. to 11:30 p.m.
- c. Sunday: 12:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- (b) The mobile vending unit shall be removed from the site during the hours of nonoperation. Any semi-permanent structure used and/or associated with the mobile vending operation shall also be removed from the site during hours of nonoperation.
- (c) Mobile food trucks shall not exceed ten (10) feet in width, including any side extensions of awnings, twenty-four (24) feet in length, including the length of any trailer hitch, the trailer or other extensions.
- (d) Mobile food trucks must be self-contained when operating, except for the required trash and/or recycling receptacles, which must be attached to the mobile food truck, and shall not impede free movement of automobiles or pedestrians. The mobile food

vendor shall keep all areas within five (5) feet of the mobile food truck clean of grease, trash, paper, cups or cans associated with the vending operation.

- (e) Mobile food trucks shall be operated only by the mobile food vendor or by an authorized employee of the mobile food vendor.

Sec. 10-265. Signage.

- (a) All signs advertising for the mobile vending unit must meet the following requirements;

- (1) Signs must be placed flat against the mobile vending unit.

a. Sandwich board signs are prohibited.

b. Any type of design or artwork that advertises the use of the mobile vending unit is considered to be a sign.

- (2) Signs may not be larger than nine (9) square feet.

- (3) No more than three (3) signs may be placed on the mobile vending unit.

- (b) Mobile vendors are prohibited from using right-of-way signs, temporary signs and off-premises signs.

Sec. 10-266. ~~Exemptions and restrictions~~ General Regulations.

- (a) A drive through is not permitted in conjunction with the mobile vendor.

- (b) The mobile vendor shall install signage in a visible location on the mobile vending unit in a visible location indicating that loitering is not permitted.

- (c) The mobile vendor must keep the immediate area surrounding the mobile vending unit clean and free from litter, garbage, and debris.

- (d) Mobile vendors providing food or beverage intended for immediate consumption must provide a trash receptacle within ten feet of the mobile vending unit.

- (e) The use of amplified music must adhere to existing city noise regulations.

- (f) The use of temporary or portable lighting is prohibited except that which is required to illuminate the serving area of the mobile vending unit. Lighting must be shielded from adjacent properties to protect against light trespass.

- (g) ~~The current business tax receipt must be posted in a visible location on the mobile vending unit, in addition to any required state, county, and food safety licensure.~~ All mobile food trucks must display any State licenses, permits, and registrations, City of

Riviera Beach Fire Inspection report and any permits issued by the City, if required, in a prominent and visible manner.

(h) Under no circumstances shall grease be released into the City's sanitary sewer system. No liquid waste or grease is to be disposed in tree pits or onto the sidewalks, streets or other public spaces.

(i) Mobile food vendors must not engage in food preparation if the vehicle does not provide water and waste systems as required by the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation or otherwise fails to meet sanitation and safety requirements.

(k) All food service equipment utilized by the mobile food vendor shall be maintained in good repair and a clean condition.

Sec. 10-267. Mobile Food Establishments and Restricted Mobile Vendors.

(a) *Ice cream trucks.*

(1) *Permitted sales locations.*

a. Sales from ice cream trucks shall occur only on public roadways with a speed limit of 25 miles per hour or less located within residential districts or on private ways with the consent of the owner or owners of the private roadway.

1. Ice cream trucks shall pull as far as practicable to the side of the right-of-way when stopping for the purpose of making sales and shall operate four-way flashers when so stopped. In no event shall an ice cream truck stopped for the purpose of making sales prevent the passage of other motor vehicles on the right-of-way.

2. Ice cream trucks may stop for the purpose of making sales only between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., however no sales are permitted after dusk.

3. Sales from the ice cream truck shall occur only when the ice cream truck is lawfully stopped.

4. Sales shall occur only from the side of the truck away from moving traffic and as near as possible to the curb or side of the street.

5. Sales shall not occur to a person standing in the roadway.

(2) *Prohibited locations.*

a. No ice cream truck shall make any sales within 500 feet of a restaurant or retail store selling prepackaged food items.

b. No ice cream truck shall make any sales within 500 feet of any public school.

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- c. No ice cream truck shall stop at any time for the purpose of making sales in any area where parking is prohibited.

(3) *Safety requirements.*

- a. Signs stating "WATCH FOR CHILDREN" must be provided on the front, back and both sides of the vehicle in at least four inches letters of contrasting colors.
- b. A serving window capable of being closed when not in use must be provided and located on the curbside only.
- c. The vehicle must be equipped with left and right outside rearview mirrors as well as two additional outside wide-angle mirrors on the front and back of the vehicle to enable the driver to see around the entire vehicle.
- d. All vehicles must have operable four-way, yellow flashing hazard lights to warn approaching drivers of children.
- e. A rear bumper cover must be installed.

(b) *Raw produce vendors.*

(1) *Permitted locations.*

- a. Raw produce vendors shall be setback a minimum of 35 feet from all intersections.
- b. Raw produce vendors shall be setback a minimum of 20 feet from all roads.

(2) *Prohibited locations.*

- a. Raw produce vendors shall not operate in parking spaces, driveways, sidewalks, fire lanes, rights-of-way, or public roads.
- b. Raw produce vendors are prohibited in a temporary building, tent or structure.

(3) *Safety requirements.*

- a. All products must be the original produce or work of the vendor.
- b. No items offered for sale will be commercially grown, created or produced without value added by the vendor.
- c. Produce offered for sale must be free from harmful pesticide residues and any applications must have been made according to manufacturer's directions.
- d. All food items must be free from insects and spoilage.
- e. All produce must be washed.

(c) *Mobile automobile detailers.*

(1) *Permitted locations.*

- a. In all residential areas, mobile automobile detailers must operate in the driveway or parking lot.

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- 268 b. Mobile automobile detailers shall not operate on sidewalks, fire lanes, rights-of-way,
269 or public roads.
- 270 c. Mobile automobile detailers shall not block or impede traffic on any public or private
271 road, easement, or right-of-way.
- 272 d. All water or other substances used by the mobile automobile detailer must be fully
273 contained on the site where the vendor is operating.
- 274 e. Mobile automobile detailers shall not play music while operating in residential areas.
- 275 f. Mobile automobile detailers may not operate as a home occupation. Vendors are
276 prohibited from servicing vehicles from their primary residence.
- 277 (2) *Hours of operation.*
- 278 a. Mobile automobile detailers are restricted to the following hours of operation in
279 residential areas:
- 280 1. Monday to Thursday: 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- 281 2. Friday and Saturday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- 282 3. Sunday: 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- 283 b. Mobile automobile detailers are restricted to the following hours of operation in
284 nonresidential areas:
- 285 1. Monday to Thursday: 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- 286 2. Friday and Saturday: 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.
- 287 3. Sunday: 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

289 **Sec. 10-268. Licensing requirements.**

290 ~~(a) Prior to the issuance of a business tax receipt,~~ Mobile food vendors must comply with
291 the following State of Florida and local requirements as applicable:

292 (1) Mobile food vendors engaged in the selling of cooked or prepared food defined as a
293 Mobile Food Dispensing Vehicle (MFDV), must be licensed by the Florida Department
294 of Business and Professional Regulation's (DBPR) Florida Division of Hotels and
295 Restaurants.

296 a. Obtaining licensing from the Florida DBPR's Division of Hotels and Restaurants does
297 not guarantee approval by the City of Riviera Beach Planning and Zoning Division.

298 b. ~~Mobile food vendors~~ dispensing vehicles must pass all inspections conducted by the
299 Florida DBPR's Division of Hotels and Restaurants to maintain ~~the business tax receipt~~
300 ~~for their establishment to maintain operation~~

301 c. Current inspection results must be conspicuously posted on the mobile ~~vending unit~~
302 food truck.

303 d. In accordance with the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation
304 guidelines, all necessary control measures shall be used to effectively minimize, or
305 eliminate when possible, the presence of rodents, roaches, and other vermin and
306 insects on the premises of all mobile food trucks. Each mobile food vendor shall
307 maintain a log containing a written record of the control measures performed by
308 exterminators or other pest control businesses on the mobile food truck. This log
309 shall be open to inspection by the city.

310 (2) Mobile food vendors engaged in the selling of prepackaged ice cream, popcorn, raw
311 produce, or smoothies defined as a Mobile Food Establishment (MFE), must be
312 licensed by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

313 a. Obtaining licensing from the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer
314 Services does not guarantee approval by the City of Riviera Beach Planning and
315 Zoning Division.

316 b. Mobile food vendors must pass all inspections conducted by Florida Department of
317 Agriculture and Consumer Services to maintain ~~the business tax receipt for their~~
318 establishment operations.

319 c. Current inspection results must be conspicuously posted on the mobile ~~vending unit~~
320 food truck.

321 ~~(3) Mobile food vendors must pass an inspection by the City of Riviera Beach Fire~~
322 ~~Department.~~ Mobile food vendors shall make the mobile food truck available for
323 inspection by the City of Riviera Beach Fire Rescue Department at a location
324 determined by the fire department. The fire department shall ensure compliance
325 with all applicable federal, state, and local fire safety statutes, regulations,

ordinances, and codes. MFDVs shall undergo an annual fire safety inspection by the City of Riviera Beach Fire Rescue Department.

- a. Obtaining a passing inspection does not guarantee operation-location approval by the City of Riviera Beach Planning and Zoning Division.
- b. Mobile food vendors must pass all inspections conducted by the City of Riviera Beach Fire Department to maintain ~~the business tax receipt for their establishment~~ operations.

(b) Mobile automobile detailers.

(1) Mobile automobile detailers engaged in professional cleaning services of automobiles are required to maintain a City of Riviera Beach Business Tax Receipt and Certificate of Use.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, word or portion of this Ordinance, or the particular application thereof, is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases and words under application shall not be affected thereby and shall continue in full force and effect.

Section 5. Repeal of Laws in Conflict. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. Codification. Specific authority is hereby granted to codify this Ordinance. The sections of the Ordinance may be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Riviera Beach and may be re-numbered or re-lettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "division," or any other appropriate word.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final approval and adoption.




