**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING WOODHAVEN CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 94, STREETS, SIDEWALKS, AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES, ARTICLE III, SNOW REMOVAL AND SNOW EMERGENCIES, SECTION SEC. 94-74, DECLARATION OF SNOW EMERGENCY**

**THE CITY OF WOODHAVEN ORDAINS:**

**THE CITY OF WOODHAVEN, BY ACTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL, ADOPTS THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENT TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 94, STREETS, SIDEWALKS, AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES, ARTICLE III, SNOW REMOVAL AND SNOW EMERGENCIES, SECTION SEC. 94-74, DECLARATION OF SNOW EMERGENCY**

**SECTION 94-74 IS DELETED IN ITS ENTIRETY AND REPLACED WITH THE FOLLOWING:**

**Sec. 94-74. Declaration of Snow Emergency.**

The Mayor, City Administrator, Director of Public Services, Chief of Police and/or Chief of Fire shall have the authority to declare a snow emergency for the City of Woodhaven. Such declaration shall be made on the basis of a national weather service forecast, when there is a snow accumulation of three (3) inches or more, and/or the weather conditions constitute a danger to the public, or interfere with the free flow of traffic, or interfere with the operations of the Department of Public Services and public safety units to carry out the purposes of this Article.

Notice of the declaration of the snow emergency shall be publically announced by providing such information through one or more of the following methods: radio and/or television stations with a normal operating range covering the City, newspapers of general circulation, social media, City website, automated message or calling systems, and outdoor early warning siren system. When feasible, each announcement shall describe the action and the time it will become effective, which shall be no less than three (3) hours after the decree has been ordered.

The snow emergency shall remain in effect until terminated by announcement in a similar manner as described above.
