ORDINANCE NO. O-22-06

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TOWN OF SPRINGDALE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 18, SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

WHEREAS, Town Council wishes to amend the Town Code of Ordinances, Chapter 18, Solid Waste Management

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Springdale, SC that:

Chapter 18, Solid Waste Management, of the Springdale Code of Ordinances, be amended as follows:

Sec. 18-1: Definitions

Refuse means all putrescible and non-putrescible solid waste (except bodily waste), including garbage, rubbish, and street cleaning, dead animals, yard clippings, and market and industrial solid waste.

- (1) Commercial refuse. Trash and garbage generated by apartments, stores, offices, restaurants, and other commercial establishments and industries (excluding industrial waste and hazardous waste.)
- (2) Residential refuse. Garbage, yard and garden trash generated by residential property as defined herein.
- (3) Yard and Garden Trash means any an all accumulation of grass, leaves, small trees and branches (not exceeding five feet in length and five inches in diameter), shrubs, vines, and other similar items generated by the maintenance of lawns, shrubs, gardens, and trees from residential property. Any amount in excess of the equivalent of three 55-gallon drums shall be deemed an excessive amount.

Sec. 18-2: Garbage and refuse accumulation; containers.

- (a) No owner, occupant, tenant or lessee of any public or private premises shall permit the accumulation upon his premises of any garbage, or any rubbish that has been in contact with, or soiled by animal or vegetable wastes, except in containers of a type approved by the appropriate health authority as being sanitary. Plastic bags or metal cans are examples of approved containers. Metal containers shall have handles, tight-fitting lids, must have a bar and wheels, and be of a maximum 32-gallon capacity, unless an approved closed metal commercial container with mechanical unloading is used.

Sec. 18-42: Specifications for residential container, commercial bulk containers.

- (a) Each resident shall be provided a container for the accumulation of garbage between collection days. Acceptable containers are:
 1. Residents will receive one roll cart for each household garbage, recycling, and yard trash. Additional cart may be purchased through the Town of Springdale.
- (A) Proprietors of commercial establishments must contract with a private company to collect their commercial waste. The Town of Springdale does not collect commercial waste.

Sec. 18-61: Residential collection; frequency, hours, container location.

- (a) Garbage service for residences will normally be once per week and waste matter once per week and recyclables once per week; except that no service will be rendered on holidays and accumulation will be picked up at the next regularly scheduled time.
- (b) All residential collection will be made between 7:00 am to 7:00 pm with exception to the months of June through September where collection will begin at 6:00 am.
- (c) Garbage container must be placed at the curb unless a valid medical waiver is on file. No containers should be placed at or near the curb and left there overnight before collection.
- (d) Exceptions to the normal routes made be made for emergency situations at the discretion of the Town Administrator.

Sec. 18-62: Bulky waste matter, abnormal quantities.

- (a) Waste matter in residential areas shall be placed on the resident's property at curbside for collection. Limbs, branches, etc. shall be cut to sizes not greater than five inches in diameter and five feet in length. Proper disposal of items exceeding those dimensions is the responsibility of the resident.
- (b) Abnormal quantities of waste matter resulting for moving, house cleaning, attic or garage cleaning, lot clearing or excessive amounts of yard debris shall be taken to the sanitary landfill by the resident or property owner, unless arrangements are made with the town administrator in advance of pickup for payment of an additional fee, as established by council.
