ORDINANCE NO. 686

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND RECREATE SECTIONS 9.14(2)(A), 9.14(4)(A) AND CREATE SECTION 9.14(4)(B) OF THE CITY OF DELAFIELD MUNICIPAL CODE, WAUKESHA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, RELATED TO OUTDOOR BURNING REGULATIONS

THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DELAFIELD, WAUKESHA COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Section 9.14(2)(a) is repealed and recreated to read as follows:

- (2) Open burning regulations. Open burning not otherwise prohibited by this ordinance, shall be subject to the following regulations, restrictions and limitations:
 - (a) Size of pile. The size of the pile of material to be burned shall not exceed 4' by 4' by 3' high. For lots that are two acres or larger, the property owner may request a permit from the Fire Chief to allow a larger pile size.

SECTION 2: Section 9.14(4)(a) is repealed and recreated to read as follows:

- (4) Recreational fires. A recreational fire is any small fires such as a campfire, built in a fire pit or portable manufactured fire container, for the purpose of recreational and personal enjoyment, and not intended for the disposal of waste wood or yard waste.
 - (a) Recreational fires are allowed between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and Midnight, subject to the following restrictions and limitations: (note to MuniCode: subsections 1-4 are not changing):

SECTION 3: Section 9.14(4)(b) is created to read as follows:

(5) Exceptions: The recreational fire restrictions contained in this ordinance shall not apply to campfires at established camp sites in Naga-Waukee Park. Campfires in Naga-Waukee Park shall be regulated by Waukesha County.

SECTION 4: All ordinances or parts of this ordinance conflicting or contravening the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication as required by law.
