

**ORDINANCE 2021-11**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 6-2 OF ARTICLE 1 OF CHAPTER 6 ANIMALS FOR CONSISTENCY WITH FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, it has been many years since the City of Treasure Island (“City”) revised its Code of Ordinances regulating animal cruelty and control, and there have been developments in the law related to animal regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, one development in the law pertains to Chapter 828, Florida Statutes, that allows local governments to regulate animal control and cruelty only when such regulations are not in conflict with Chapter 828, Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, Pinellas County, Florida, which is a charter county, in Section 2-04 of Pinellas County Charter has expressly reserved the powers to implement animal control regulations and programs to the County; and

**WHEREAS**, Pinellas County, Florida, has adopted an ordinance on animal control and cruelty in compliance with Chapter 828, Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, while the City of Treasure Island may have regulations on animal control and cruelty, such regulations cannot conflict with the State or County regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, section 6-2(b) of the City of Treasure Island Code of Ordinances is in conflict with the Pinellas County regulations that pertain to animal control and cruelty as well as Chapter 828, Florida Statutes; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Commission finds that it is necessary to amend section 6-2 of Article 1 of Chapter 6 of the City’s Code of Ordinances to comply and be consistent with the State and Pinellas County regulations of animals.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF TREASURE ISLAND DOES ORDAIN:**



**SECTION 1.** The recitals set forth in the "Whereas" clauses above are ratified and confirmed as true and correct, and are hereby adopted as legislative findings by the City Commission of the City of Treasure Island, Florida for the adoption of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 2.** Section 6-2 titled "Destruction of fowl or animals prohibited without permit," of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Treasure Island, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 6-2. - Destruction of fowl or animals prohibited without permit.**

(a) It shall be unlawful to trap, shoot or in any manner to kill any birds or animals, or to attempt to do so, or to disturb the nests, eggs or young of birds.

~~(b) Any person upon a showing that any birds or animals constitute a nuisance or are destructive to property shall be granted a permit by the city commission to destroy the birds or animals, or the mayor commissioner shall instruct the police of the city to correct such nuisance.~~

**SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.** It is declared to be the intent of the City Commission, that if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

**SECTION 4. CONFLICT.** This action supersedes all ordinances and resolutions of the City or portions thereof, in conflict with or inconsistent with this ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

**SECTION 5. CODIFICATION.** Section 2 of this Ordinance shall be codified in the Code of Ordinances for the City of Treasure Island, Florida. The codifier is authorized to renumber or reclassify such other provision of the Code of Ordinance to accomplish such intention. The codifier is also authorized to make editorial changes not affecting the substance of this Ordinance in the substitution of article, ordinance, section, paragraph, or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intention.

1. The first part of the document is a letter from the author to the editor of the journal. The letter discusses the author's interest in the topic and the reasons for writing the paper.

2. The second part of the document is the abstract of the paper. It provides a brief summary of the main findings and conclusions of the study.

5. The fifth part of the document is the methodology. It describes the research design, data collection methods, and the statistical analysis used in the study.

6. The sixth part of the document is the results and discussion. It presents the findings of the study and discusses their implications for the field.

7. The seventh part of the document is the conclusion. It summarizes the main findings and provides recommendations for future research.

8. The final part of the document is the references. It lists the sources of information used in the study.

**SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage.

**SECOND READING and PUBLIC HEARING on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2021.**







SECTION 1001.01

SECTION 1001.01(1) - The Department of Banking and Finance shall have the honor of presenting to the Governor and the Senate the report of the Department of Banking and Finance for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1952.

SECTION 1001.01(2) - The Department of Banking and Finance shall also have the honor of presenting to the Governor and the Senate the report of the Department of Banking and Finance for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1953.

SECTION 1001.01(3) - The Department of Banking and Finance shall also have the honor of presenting to the Governor and the Senate the report of the Department of Banking and Finance for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 1954.
