ORDINANCE – 519

Councilperson **Gavin** seconded by Councilperson **Bush** moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 865 – MOBILE FOOD VENDING UNITS OF THE CITY OF COOPERSVILLE ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES AND STANDARDS FOR THE OVERSIGHT AND REGULATION OF FOOD TRUCKS AND MOBILE FOOD STANDS

CITY OF COOPERSVILLE, COUNTY OF OTTAWA, STATE OF MICHIGAN HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: Chapter 865 (Mobile Food Vending Unit Ordinance), Section 865.10: “Locations” shall read as follows:

(a) Appropriate locations for mobile food vending units shall be limited to the areas as stated in a Resolution of Council or private property with a written agreement signed by the property owner. The use of other public areas, including on-street parking, is prohibited without written permission from the City without exception.

(b) Mobile food vending units are not permitted within 1,000 feet (measured to property boundary) of any fair, festival, special event, or civic event, or other event with City approved community event status unless written permission from the event coordinator is obtained.

(c) The issuance of a mobile food vending unit permit does not grant or entitle the vendor to the exclusive use of any service route or space.

(d) Mobile vending units must be setback a minimum of 20 feet off the property line of any public road and must be a minimum of 50 feet away from the property line of any residential property, except for residential uses in the C-2 Central Business District. Mobile vending units may not operate on a single-family residential property unless as noted in Section 865.10 (e).

(e) Events, parties, or other activities on any private property that require catering or a food truck on site are exempted from this ordinance, as, long as, food is not served to the general-public and is limited to the event, parties, or other activities on private property.

SECTION 2. In the event any previously adopted ordinance conflicts with this ordinance, this ordinance will control.

SECTION 3. This ordinance will be effective ten days after publication in one newspaper of general circulation in the City.
