AND AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF FIRE AND POLICE COMMISSIONERS TO

An Ordinance Authorizing the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners
to Provide an Opportunity for Community Service Officers to Claim Preference
Points During the Application Process to the Village Police Department

WHEREAS, the Village of Norridge ("Village"), as a home rule municipality in accordance with Article VII Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970, is enacting this Ordinance providing for the protection of the health, safety, and general welfare of the Village of Norridge; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Fire and Police Commissioners ("BFPC") act to establish a Primary Eligibility List to hire Village Police Officers; and

WHEREAS, under the exercise of its home rule authority the Village Board of Trustees ("Village Board") has previously determined in Ordinance 1872-16 that Village Auxiliary Police Officers who are candidates for appointment to the Village Police Department may claim preference points during the application process for Village Police Officer if:

1. The candidate seeking employment as a Village Police Officer has met all previous requirements to become a Village Police Officer; and
2. The candidate must currently be serving as an Auxiliary Police Officer, in good standing, with the Village Police Department; and
3. The candidate must have at least a minimum of twelve (12) months of continuous service as an Auxiliary Police Officer in order to claim preferential points during the application process with the Village BFPC; and

WHEREAS, in addition, Ordinance 1872-16 also provided that:

Once in every three (3) years, a candidate may claim one (1) preferential point for twelve (12) to twenty four (24) months of continuous service as an Auxiliary Police Officer with the Norridge Police Department. A Candidate, with a minimum of twenty four (24) to thirty six (36) months of continuous service as an Auxiliary Police Officer with the Norridge Police Department may claim two (2) preferential points. A Candidate with more than thirty six (36) months of continuous service may claim a maximum of three (3) preferential points; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 1872-16 was incorporated into the BFPC Rules and Regulations ("BFPC Rules"); and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has also established the position of Community Service Officer ("CSO") and has determined that CSOs who are candidates for positions in the Village Police Department shall be able to claim preference points in the same manner as those persons holding the position of Auxiliary Police Officer during the application process; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that it is in the best interests of the health, safety and general welfare of the Village to permit CSOs who are candidates for positions in the Village Police Department to be able to claim preference points in the same manner as those persons holding the position of Auxiliary Police Officer during the application process and that the BFPC shall amend the BFPC Rules in accordance with this Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Norridge, Cook County, Illinois:

Section 1.

The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2.

That Village Board be and hereby amends Ordinance 1872-16 and approves an addition to the BFPC Rules providing that Village Community Service Officers who are candidates for appointment to the Village Police Department may claim preference points during the application process for Village Police Officer if:

1. The candidate seeking employment as a Village Police Officer has met all previous requirements to become a Village Police Officer; and
2. The candidate must currently be serving as a Community Service Officer, in good standing, with the Village Police Department; and
3. The candidate must have at least a minimum of twelve (12) months of continuous service as a Community Service Officer in order to claim preferential points during the application process with the Village BFPC; and

Once in every three (3) years, a candidate may claim one (1) preferential point for twelve (12) to twenty four (24) months of continuous service as a Community Service Officer with the Norridge Police Department. A Candidate, with a minimum of twenty four (24) to thirty six (36) months of continuous service as a Community Service Officer with the Norridge Police Department may claim two (2) preferential points. A Candidate with more than thirty six (36) months of continuous service may claim a maximum of three (3) preferential points.

Section 3.

If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 4.


That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.


