

## ORDINANCE

(Motion was made by JOE SHOCKLEY, seconded by TIMOTHY MCWASHINGTON, that the following ordinance be passed.)

### ORDINANCE NO. 2006-06

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, TEXAS, CHANGING THE NAME OF THE CITY STREET KNOWN AS TOWN VILLAGE DRIVE TO BUSINESS PARK DRIVE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Montgomery, Texas, has received a request from an interested person to change the name of the public street known as “Town Village Drive” to “Business Park Drive”; and

**WHEREAS**, the person or entity requesting the change of name owns all of the real property located on or adjacent to the existing Street; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council, pursuant to notice posted as required by law, has considered the proposed change in the street name; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council is of the opinion that the proposed name change would not impair or impede road identification or location for police, fire and emergency services and that the name change, therefore, would not be contrary to the best interests of the City and its inhabitants;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONTGOMERY, TEXAS, THAT:**

**SECTION 1.** The name of the City street known as “Town Village Drive” be and it is hereby changed to and shall hereafter be known as “Business Park Drive.”

**SECTION 2.** All provisions of the ordinances of the City of Montgomery in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed, and all other provisions of the Ordinances of the City of Montgomery, not in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 3.** If any provision, section, exception, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances shall for any reason be held unconstitutional, void, invalid or otherwise unenforceable, the invalidity or

unenforceability shall not affect other provisions of this Ordinance or their application to other sets of circumstances, and to this end all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

**SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.
