

**AN ORDINANCE
CITY OF MILLBROOK ALABAMA
FIREWORKS**

SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILLBROOK, ALABAMA, that in Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Millbrook, Article III, Division 1; Section 18-65 and 18-66 are inserted as follows:

ARTICLE III. Fireworks

DIVISION 1. Generally

Sec 18-65. Fireworks Defined.

Fireworks means any explosives, composition or any substance or combination of substances, or article prepared for the purpose of producing an audible or visible effect by explosion, deflagration or detonation, and includes, but is not limited to blank cartridges (except when used for bona fide sporting, industrial, or commercial purposes), toy cannons in which explosives are used, flare balloons which require fire underneath to propel the balloon, firecrackers, sparklers, torpedoes, sky rockets, bottle rockets, Roman candles, bombs or other fireworks containing any explosive substance. The term "fireworks" does not include: emergency flares, any warning lights commonly known as red flares, marine distress signals of a type approved by the United States Coast Guard, toy paper pistol caps which contain 0.25 grains or less of explosive compound, model rockets, matches, trick matches, sparklers and dipped sticks, cigarette loads and other types of pop-off novelties.


Sec 18-66. Fireworks for Sale. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell fireworks within the corporate limits of the City of Millbrook.

SECTION 2. All other sections or provisions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Millbrook, Alabama, not specifically mentioned herein remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Should any section or provision of this Ordinance be held invalid, such holding shall not affect any section or provision hereof which is not of itself invalid.


SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption and publication as required by law.




