ORDINANCE NO. 1281

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF LITTLE ELM, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN, BY AMENDING CHAPTER 46 (ENVIRONMENT), BY AMENDING ARTICLE III (JUNKED & ABANDONED VEHICLES) IN PART TO MODIFY THE DEFINITION OF AND REGULATIONS FOR JUNKED VEHICLES; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A PENALTY; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A REPEALER CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Town of Little Elm ("Town") is a home rule municipal corporation organized and existing by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and by its Charter adopted on May 1, 2001; and

WHEREAS, the Town possesses all the rights, powers, and authorities possessed by all home rule municipalities, including the authority to regulate junked vehicles under the Texas Transportation Code; and

WHEREAS, the State of Texas recently revised its inspection and registration requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to protect property values, reduce potential hazards, increase public safety, and maintain visual calm in its neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, after due deliberations and consideration of any other information and materials received at the open meeting, the Town Council has determined that the amendments set forth herein should be adopted, and that such amendments are in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the Town.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF LITTLE ELM, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. <u>INCORPORATION OF PREMISES.</u> The above and foregoing premises are true and correct and are incorporated herein and made a part hereof for all purposes.

SECTION 2. <u>AMENDMENT AND ADOPTION.</u> That Chapter 46 (Environment) of the Town of Little Elm Code of Ordinances, is hereby amended, in part, by amending Article III (Junked & Abandoned Vehicles), in part, by amending 46-60 (Definitions), in part, so that the definition of *Junked Vehicle* is replaced, in its entirety, to read as below:

Junked Vehicle: A vehicle that is self propelled and:

- 1. Displays a motor vehicle registration certificate that is at least 30 days expired/invalid, or does not display a motor vehicle registration; or
- 2. ls:

- (a) wrecked, dismantled, or partially dismantled, or discarded; or
- (b) inoperable and has remained inoperable for more than:
 - i. 72 consecutive hours, if the vehicle is on public property; or
 - ii. 30 consecutive days, if the vehicle is on private property.

SECTION 3. <u>SAVINGS</u>. This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all other ordinances of the Town, and shall not repeal any of the provisions of those ordinances except in those instances where the provisions of those ordinances are in direct conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance; provided, however, that any complaint, notice, action, cause of action, or claim which prior to the effective date of this Ordinance has been initiated or has arisen under or pursuant to such other ordinance(s) shall continue to be governed by the provisions of that ordinance or those ordinances, and for that purpose that ordinance or those ordinances shall be deemed to remain and shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. <u>**PENALTY.</u>** Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provision of this ordinance shall be punished by a penalty of a fine not to exceed the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) for each offense and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.</u>

SECTION 5. <u>SEVERABILITY.</u> The sections, paragraphs, sentences, phrases, and words of this Ordinance are severable, and if any section or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section or provision to any person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance is for any reason judged invalid or unconstitutional, the adjudication shall not affect any other section or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section or provision to any person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance, nor shall adjudication affect any other section or provision of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Little Elm, Texas, and the Town Council hereby declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the valid parts and to this end the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. <u>**REPEALER.**</u> That all ordinances of the Town of Little Elm in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict.

SECTION 7. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and publication in accordance with and as provided by law and the Town Charter.
