ORDINANCE

The Common Council of the City of Sun Prairie, Dane County, Wisconsin, hereby ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. That Sections of 8.20.130 and 8.20.310 are hereby repealed and recreated as follows: (Additions are noted by underline, deletions are noted by ~~overstrike~~.)

8.20.130 – Time and Frequency of Collection

- A. Residential. Residential refuse placed out for collection in automated collection carts shall be collected once per week. All recycling materials placed out in automated collection carts ~~will be collected biweekly~~ shall be collected once per week. All collections shall be made between the hours of seven a.m. and seven p.m. Collection carts for city collection shall be set out for collection not earlier than noon of the day before the collection day and shall be removed not later than twelve (12) hours after collection is made.
- B. Nonresidential. All nonresidential garbage and refuse collection shall be collected at sufficient intervals to protect the environment as set forth in rules and regulation authorized herein. Nonresidential units shall be provided collection services by a private firm at a minimum of once per week collection with provisions to maintain weekly collection when a holiday falls on the normal collection day. Private collection firms shall adjust their collection schedules so as not to interfere with rush hour traffic. Private collections shall be made between the hours of seven a.m. and seven p.m. Collections shall occur between the hours of seven a.m. and seven p.m. Monday through Friday and eight a.m. to twelve noon on Saturday. The occupants and/or owners of all residential units shall utilize the city-provided collection carts of sixty-five-gallon or ninety-five-gallon size.

8.20.310 – Public Drop-off Center

- A. The City shall provide a public recycling center at a location designated by the director of public works. The center shall provide containers and areas for the collection of designated recyclables. The recycle center shall be open to accept the following recyclable materials: ~~yard wastes (including brush), appliances without freon, metal, waste oil, or other recyclable materials~~ mixed recycling, brush and yard waste, appliances without Freon, oil absorbents, oil filters, waste motor oil, antifreeze, scrap metal, cardboard, or other materials as authorized by the city council.
- B. The following wastes shall be prohibited from disposal at the recycling center:
 - 1. Materials meeting the definition of Section 8.20.290, Prohibited wastes, for which locations have not been designated at the recycling center;
 - 2. Refuse, waste, porcelain, refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, waste tires, vehicle batteries, fluorescent and CPF light bulbs, drums, cans, tanks, bottles or other

containers which contain, or did contain flammables, toxics, pesticides, solvents, or other hazardous materials prohibited from regular refuse collection by this chapter or other rules and laws pertaining to solid waste.

- C. No person may deposit or cause to be deposited any recyclable material, solid, or bulk waste at any authorized collection point when the site is closed or not operating.

1. The recycling center shall be open for permitted city residents' use during the following hours:

Summer Hours (following the last Saturday in March and continuing to the third Saturday in October)	
Monday, Wednesday, and Friday	9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
Saturday	8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Holidays	Closed
Fall Hours (following the third Saturday in October and continuing to the first Saturday in December)	
Monday, Wednesday, and Friday	9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.
Saturday	8:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Holidays	Closed
Winter Hours (following the first Saturday in December and continuing to the last Saturday in March):	
Saturday	9:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon
Monday	3:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m.

2. The director of public works may order the recycle center temporarily closed when necessary due to mechanical or other problems.
3. The public works director may amend the hours of the recycle center to be open as necessary, based on his or her discretion.

- D. In order to gain access to the recycling center, visitors will need to acquire a Recycle Center Permit. The following fees will be charged to obtain a Recycle Center Permit:

<u>Residents (1-4 units):</u> <u>Residents who live in single-family or two through four dwelling units in Sun Prairie city limits.</u>	<u>\$0</u>
<u>Residents (5+ units):</u> <u>Residents who live in multiple-family dwellings in Sun Prairie city limits.</u>	<u>\$30 per year</u>
<u>Non-Residents:</u> <u>Individuals who live outside of Sun Prairie city limits.</u>	<u>\$100 per year</u>

SECTION 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication as provided by law.
