ORDINANCE NO. 2024-0,1

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CLEAR LAKE SHORES, TEXAS TO ADOPT GENERAL CHANGES TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 2 – ARTICLE III – DIVISION 2 – SECTION 2-68: SPENDING AUTHORITY OF MAYOR AND CITY ADMINISTRATOR.

Section 1. <u>Municipal Code</u>: That the Clear Lake Shores Municipal Code be and same is hereby amended by adopting the modification of Chapter 2:

Section 2. <u>Current Structure:</u> The current structure of Chapter 2: Administration – Article III: City Officers – Division 2 – Responsibilities and Duties of City Administrator and Mayor: Section 2-68: Spending authority of Mayor and City Administrator:

The mayor and city administrator may enter into contractual commitments for amounts up to <u>\$5,000.00</u>, provided adequate funds have been approved in the budget of the city. Any contractual commitment in excess of this amount must be approved by the city council prior to incurring the obligation. The mayor may approved a change order adding to a previously approved contract in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00, so long as the sum of all change orders to said contract does not exceed the maximum amount permitted in state law, currently 25 percent if the original contract price. The mayor may approved contract in an amount perception of a previously approved contract in an amount perception.

Section 3. <u>Modification Structure</u>: The modification structure of Chapter 2: Administration – Article III: City Officers – Division 2 – Responsibilities and Duties of City Administrator and Mayor: Section 2-68: Spending authority of Mayor and City Administrator:

The mayor and city administrator may enter into contractual commitments for amounts up to <u>\$10,000.00</u>, provided adequate funds have been approved in the budget of the city. Any contractual commitment in excess of this amount must be approved by the city council prior to incurring the obligation. The mayor may approved a change order adding to a previously approved contract in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00, so long as the sum of all change orders to said contract does not exceed the maximum amount permitted in state law, currently 25 percent if the original contract price. The mayor may approve change orders decreasing the price of a previously approved contract in amount amount up to \$50,000.00.
