The Town hereby approves the Petition and annexes into the Town the 5.82 acres of real property described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference in accordance with the provisions of Section 171.044, Florida Statutes.

6 **Section 4.** The Town Council hereby directs Town Staff to: (1) file a copy of 7 this Ordinance with the Clerk of the Circuit Court, the Chief Administrative Officer of 8 Palm Beach County, and the Secretary of State; (2) amend the legal description set 9 forth in the Town Charter and all official Town maps to include the Property; and (3) 10 take all other actions necessary to effectuate the annexation of the Property into the 11 Town.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Town of Juno Beach, Florida, which are in conflict with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

17 **Section 6.** If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this 18 Ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be 19 unconstitutional, inoperative or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of the 20 Ordinance. 21

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
